THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Gippy Graham, State Representative from Franklin County who spoke about the freshman view of the legislative process. He favors term limits and promised to serve no more years than Hank Hancock — 21 years. He spoke of 6 areas of focus:

- 1. Understand the leadership team in the House and the role they play in committee assignments.
- 2. Become acquainted with other House members. There were 21 new members and he attended committee meetings and orientation sessions in addition to two special sessions.
- 3. Understand the committee structure. In the House, there are 12 standing committees and 16 subcommittes. He lobbied for and was assigned Education, Agriculture and Tourism.
- 4. Become knowledgable about the budget process.
- 5. Understand the departments of state government and where they are physically located. The statutory committees oversee the running of state government between career and political employees.
- 6. Know LRC itself. They will even write speeches for your.

All Representatives are of equal importance. Rep. Graham to work vigorously for us, his constituents. In order to stay in touch he has planned a series of citizen access meetings to get necessary feedback. He encourges us all to visit "your office" in room 432 - G of the Capitol Annex.

In responding to questions from the floor, he made the following observations:

- It is a trade-off question between state merit system constraints and free political activity.
- 2. Although a legislator takes an oath to serve the Commonwealth, one needs to balance the needs of the state with the needs of the legislative district.
 - 3. He believes in having open meetings. Ed Janeway
- 4. As to a replacement for Dr. Boysen, it must be someone who is committed to education reform. Also he must be a good communicator and get out into the local communities. Do not rule out a Kentuckian!
- 5. Decisions should be make at the local level whenever possible.

Guest speaker of Frankfort Rotary on March 8, 1995 was Jody Richards, Speaker of the House of Representatives. Speaker Richards has been a member of the legislature for nearly two decades and has served in many influential positions, including Chairman of the Education Committee and Majority Caucus Chair. Richards, a fellow Rotarian, focused on three areas during his speech; a Kentucky report card, a legislative report card and the potential agenda for the 1996 legislative session.

Kentucky's Report Card:

- * unemployment has been below the national average for the past three
- * manufacturing jobs are up, with 99 new firms
- * industrial recruitment has been successful
- * per capita income is rising; higher than the national average
- * tourism is booming--now a \$6 billion industry
- * bond indebtedness is down
- * high school dropout rate is down
- * welfare program receipt is down by
- * leading the southeast in college entries

Legislative Report Card:

- strong crime legislation, particularly anti-drug and DUI
- * new laws regarding violence in schools, handguns on school property

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Representative Danny Ford, minority leader for the Kentucky House of Representatives. He was first elected to the House in 1982 and Minority Leader of the House in 1985. Although the Republicans have always been thought of as a minority part, all that changed in the 1994 election. He thinks even the Republicans may soon be in the majority in Kentucky. The role of the minority party is always important because it offers alternative ideas to the public which we all need in a true two-party system. The Kentucky Republican Party first proposed eliminating the income tax on pensions in 1990. In this year's Special Session, the minority caucus added IRA accounts to savings to be exempt from taxation. One important function of the minority floor leader is Bill Averell to assign various members to committees. Proteciton of minority rights is important in order to preserve our democratic form of government. It is equally important to have proportionate representation in committees. Today, members of the minority party serve on all committees which would not have been possible without the cooperation of the Democratic Party and cooperation of the majority. The Republicans presently have 37 seats in the House of Representatives or 37% of the total. The minority also leds efforts which reduced the amount that can be contributed to a candidate form \$4000 down to \$500. Tax reform and education reform are also on the agenda.

Since the legislators are part-time, the LRC was created to help them do a better job. The 18 member board hires the director, who hires the staff. Then our legislators ask the LRC for help in drafting bills, and in the research for new bills. If to be a long research project, then a resolution must be passed authorizing the research. The LRC is non-partison, is organized by Legislative Committee, and is especially helpful to the Oversight Committee. The office of Education Responsibility operated under the LRC, as well as the Office of Federal and International Relations. What happens in the rest of the world DOES affect Kentucky. The LRC also has a full-service print shop and a secretarial assistance plan for our legislators Over 200 full-time and 70 part-time employees comprise the LRC staff. Peggy emphasized that since our legislators are NOW studing the bills that they will propose next January, it is a good time to get with them and let them know our views. BE INVOLVED IN THE PROCESS!!

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dan Yates who is Vice President for Governmental Relations of the Association of Electric Co-ops. He stated that unfortunately lobbyists are painted with a wide negative brush which is not fair. He is concerned about a public mindset which would not let lobbvists or interest groups near legislators. However, government cannot operate in a vacuum in a democracy. Today, government is BIG BUSINESS. Congress is in continuous session. Legislators are considering a myriad of issues and are busy with "your business". We have regulators. We have a gradual and silent expansion of government. A phenomenal growth in regulations affects your daily life. A noted economist-Thomas Hoskins stated that regulations cost business and industry \$500 Billion annually. As individuals, most people cannot stay in touch with legislative processes because they lack geographical presence and necessary information about proposed legislation. Regulations cannot be written in a vacuum. A presence is needed by the individual citizen and this is provided by the lobbvist. There are about 700 registed lobbyists in KY. The media is in constant touch with legislators. They write candidates and make endorsements. Unfortunately, some people want to cut access to legistlators. Social lobbying is now out the door with the new Ethics law. It is important for a lobbyist to just listen in the halls of the Bill Evans Capital and Capital Annex. Much is learned this way. The lobbyist is not always against your point of view. We must protect the freedom of association

between elected officials and their constituents.

Term limitations is an open admission of the failure of the democratic system. The November 1994 election shows that term limitations are not necissary. Term limits say that our system does not work. He concluded by stating that you must know your elected officials Ron Durham, Jr. and make sure they know you.


