## THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Glen Karsner who is the Franklin County Director for the Council on Aging. In 1990 there were 75,000 people over 65 in Kentucky but in the year 2020 there will be 656,000 over 65. The over 80 population is the fastest growing age group. Social Security is many times the only source of income to many senior citizens which only covers basic needs. In Franklin County, 25% are over 60 and 32% over 55. Because younger people generally do not vote, the older citizens have tremendous influence in electing government officials. If not fixed, Medicare will run out of money in seven years. The Senior Citizen Center was 17.000 dollars in the red last year. The Board will not say no to anyone who needs home care and other services. The Mills-Yount Center was named after Ralph Mills and Robert Yount who make the present facility possible.

If it were not for jail inmates who work in the Center, the Center could not afford to prepare the meals. Including the Meals on Wheels, 240 meals are served a day out of the Center. 25 trips are run each day by the van which provides various types of services. There are at present 115 home care patients with only 6 home care providers. The patients are seen 2-3 times a week. When the meals are served, the condition of the recepients is also ascertained. The goal is to provide a social life to all who wish to participate. Medical equipment is also provided at no charge. In responding to questions from the floor, he stated that in order to provide services under the Older Americans Act, one must be at least 60 years of age. However, the

Center can also and does provide services to those in their fifties.

There is no fee to join the Senior Citizens Center which relies only on donations. The cost for Home Care is on a sliding scale but many low income people pay nothing. The Center is not allowed to charge for the Meals on Wheels although this is the most costly item of all.



### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Frank-

lin County Judge-Executive Bob Arnold who stated that the county budget for 1995-96 will be over \$97 Million. When he took office the county had a \$1.9 million surplus and next year will have a \$3.2 million surplus. 200 households in the Peaks Mill area will have city water. Sewer lines will be extended in the Willowcrest area. The Health Deptment will receive extra money and will maintain the Home Health Care component as part of the Health Department. The Health Department provided 57,000 services last year. Franklin County is one of 7 counties in the state with no health tax. Instead, this comes from general funds. Many activities are planned for Lake View Park. The birthday of Franklin County is today - May 10. We are celebrating the county's 200th Birthday. Saturday will feature stump speaking at the Park. Before Fancy Farm, stump speakers came to Frankfort. Most of the state-wide candidates will participate. There will be old time baseball, food booths, and golf scrambles. In June, we will have Capital Expo at the Park which this year will feature the Herb Festival. In July, the VFW will have fireworks. The Franklin County Fair will be there the last of July. August will see the Pops at the Park. All proceeds will go to a Spouse Abuse Center. The Eli Golf Scramble will be in September. At least one time, the golfers must tee-off blindfolded and putt blindfolded Judge Arnold state that Franklin in more than a county. It is a community. 200 years as they are now. We can take great pride in a good school system the best in the state. Judge Arnold concluded his talk by saying that "do not spend so much time living that you do not make a life." In responding to questions from the floor, regarding the jail situation, the state need to play a more active role. The state should ultimately take over the running of the jails. The Judge made the point that 98% of the prisoners are in jail because they violated a state law - not a city or county ordinance. The state is already heavily involved in the running of jails.

# THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was George Perkins with the Alcohol and Drug Prevention Center. He hopes to use Rotary Clubs for intervention purposes to help people with alcohol and, or drug dependencies. He exploded several myth. (1) The biggest problem is with illegal drugs. Wrong: Alcohol is 20 times the problem of all illegal drugs. 50%. of all the alcohol is consumed by 10% of drinkers. Alcohol is the most expensive problem in our country today. For example, alcohol problems add \$1000 to the cost of each car. George then showed a videotape with testimonials from 6 relatives of alcoholics. Silence about the problem can be dangerous. Make the alcoholic aware of their problem. Alcoholics are waiting for someone to help them. An employer can be a key to a successful intervention by assuring the employee his job will still be there. Alcohol is a progressive disease but. its harmful effects can be arrested if alcohol abuse is stopped. Avoidance and denial are common reactions. George concluded his talk by stating that if you are close enough to feel the pain, be brave enough to be a friend.

In responding to questions from the floor, he state that 70% of the population drinks. 10% of that number are alcoholics. If intervention is done properly, it can be 90-95% successful. Hosever, we wait too long to educate people because there are alocoholics as young as 12. While it is impossible to stop kids from experimenting, interventions can work at all ages.



# THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker was Dr. Joseph P. Bark, a medical doctor who may have looked familiar, because he has appeared on a number of television shows, including "PM Magazine", and "Ask the Doctor". According to Dave Weller, he has also written at least 3 books. One of Dr. Barks interests is "Reef Ecology", and that was the topic of his slide presentation to us. ## THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Rotary Guest Speakers for May 31, 1995 were Jenny and Bill May. Jenny gave a short, but very enlightening and moving presentaiton on the mission and programs of the Sunshine Center in Frankfort. Mrs. May told us that the problem the Sunshine Center tries to address is the one of child abuse and neglect. Statistics show that 2.000 children die each vear from abuse and neglect and 140,000 are injured. Of all the violent crimes committed by juveniles, over 90% of the offenders were victims of abuse. The goal of the center is to prevent abuse through education and programs operated at the center. Among those programs are respite child care, parenting classes, and conflict resolution. Mrs. May asked for our help in preventing child abuse and providing assistance to the Sunshine Center. Three avenues of assistance are open to Rotarians: monetary support of the Center, encouragement of legislation that protects children, and asking our legislators to keep existing program funding.

Bill May, City Commissioner and Rotarian, outlined what he feels are the key issues facing Frankfort:

Children's issues: on-site child care that is safe, affordable and accessible; child abuse and neglect; and appropriate recreation.

Domestic Violence: spouse abuse and

elder abuse

Aging Population

Need for more open government Crime, particularly juvenile crime

Drug and Alcohol Abuse Homelessness

Need for low-income housing Poverty

Water and drainage problems


