NEXT WEEK'S SPEAKER

Next week's speaker will be Bryan Leigh Armstrong, Frankfort Bureau Chief Kentucky Post. His topic will be the Race for Governor.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Natasha Isakova Williams who is a former resident of Russia. She spoke about the relative differences of Russia from the United States from the perspective of a Russian citizen. Russians have a collective mentality and use the word "us" instead of "I". She does not claim to be a typical Russian any more than one can speak of a typical American. Most Russian immigrants are economic rather than political immigrants. However, she did not leave her country hating the Russian system like many Russian immigrants. She really did not want to leave her country but did so in order to marry her husband, Gene Williams, of Lexington. She had to adjust to a new system here. In Russia, much time is spent waiting in long lines while that would be unacceptable here. Everything is relative and often a small thing in Russia would be a big thing here. There is a high level of security in Russia where you cannot be evicted from your home for not paying the rent and you will never have your utilities cut off, for nonpayment. The price of basic foods is very low in Russia. The American billing system restricts our liberties in the U.S., and often, Americans are not as free as we think we are. The Americans' stereotypes of Russians are factual while the Russians' stereotypes are conceptual. However, Natasha was shocked more by the similarities between our countries. For example, she never thought Americans would tolerate the invasion of privacy seen in the Anita Hill/Clarence Thomas hearings. In the American supermarkets and department stores, she believes all customers are treated like potential thieves which is outrageous. Security cameras

are unknown in Russia. Americans must show their IDs when writing checks which she found unbelievable in America. Also credit histories are big in America which she feels is a very UnAmerican concept. Natasha told a very amusing story about a pesky life insurance salesman she invited in her home for tea. He began asking numerous personal questions about what she would do if her new husband were to be suddenly killed in, for example, a car accident. Although Russians are very hospitable people, she quickly learned how to say "no". She said that while Americans talk about their freedom of speech, in Russia they talk about freedom of ears. While Russia is a verbal country, in the United States, people talk a lot but have now ears to listen. In America, people do things drastic to get heard such as the Unabomber. Natasha gave a very interesting program which was thought provoking and gave us all much food for thought.

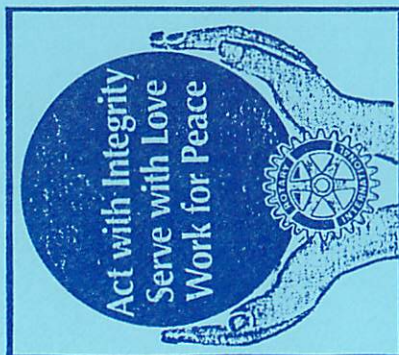

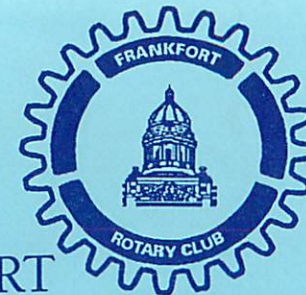

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Bryan Armstrong, a veteran of more than 15 years at daily newspapers, has worked in The Kentucky Post's Frankfort bureau since April 1994. He covers the governor's office, the legislature, courts, politics and state issues. The Post is one of three Kentucky newspapers that have full-time correspondents in Frankfort.

From 1988 to 1994, Armstrong served as news editor, state editor and night city editor for The Post, which is based in Northern Kentucky. He also has worked for The Cincinnati Post, Kansas City Star and Louisville Times in editing and reporting positions.

During his career, Armstrong has won or shared in numerous awards, including a Pulitzer Prize for coverage of the 1981 Hyatt Regency skywalks collapse in Kansas City; a Mott award for education reporting; a Sigma Delta Chi award for a series he edited on youth gangs; a national Scripps Howard award for stories he edited on state contract bidding; and several Kentucky Press Association awards for pages he edited.

Besides writing newspaper stories and columns, he occasionally appears on KET public-affairs programs such as "Comment on Kentucky."

Armstrong is a graduate of Western Kentucky University, where he studied journalism. A resident of Kentucky for virtually all of his life, he lives in Franklin County with his wife, Rhonda, a preschool teacher; daughter Lauren, 12; and son Seth, 8.

As a member of Franklin County community, Armstrong serves as an adult volunteer in the Cub Scouts and as a coach in youth baseball and basketball. His children attend Franklin County public Schools. Bryan discussed Paul Patton and Larry Forgy's various strengths in the various regions of Kentucky.

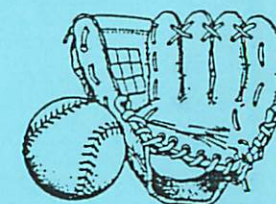

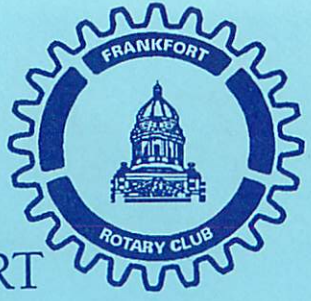

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Dave Weller, fellow Rotarian and Regional Director for South Central Bell, was the guest speaker of the Frankfort Rotary Club for Wednesday, July 19, 1995.

Dave highlighted three major trends in the telecommunications industry:

- * Globalization - global accessibility - 46% of American households own personal computers, 59% of small businesses will use personal computers. Computers are becoming increasingly mainstreamed into society.
- * Wireless Revolution - ability to take/use wireless devices anywhere. The wireless revolution has allowed us to be wherever we want and conduct business. You can use this technology to stay in touch all the time and it allows you a greater amount of freedom in combining work/home/play.
- * Full Service Broad Band Networks - this trend will merge voice data and video. Within a few years, individuals will be able to view, share, research and have immediate access to all kinds of documents/information.

Kentucky has led the way in technology development. All 120 Kentucky counties have telecommunications connections and by the end of September, all 176 local school districts will be online and transmitting information with the Kentucky Department of Education. Thanks to Dave Weller for sharing his thoughts and ideas on future trends in the Telecommunications industry!

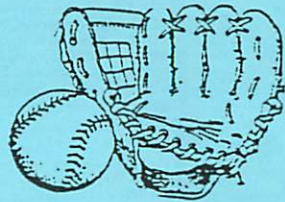

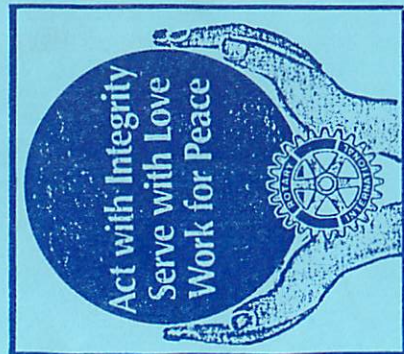

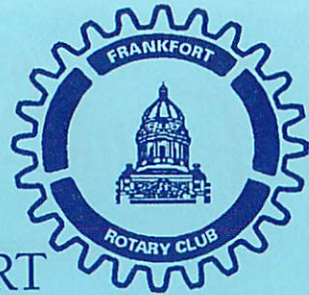
