THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Robert Laughlin who is the grandson of former Frankfort Rotary Club president, Dr. Laughlin. His subject was covered bridges of Kentucky and is Executive Director of the Kentucky Covered Bridge Association. Contrary to myth, bridges were not covered to look like barns so that horses would not get spooked and would more willingly cross the stream. Instead, bridges were covered to protect the bridges' trusses. Robert presented a very interesting slide show in which he showed many of the bridges which are no longer standing usually due to arson. There are currently 13 covered bridges still standing in Kentucky and 22 states still have covered bridges. Counties which still have these bridges are Bourbon (1), Bracken (1), Fleming (3), Franklin (1), Greenup (2), Lewis (1), Mason (2), Robertson (1) and Washington (1). The oldest bridge in Kentucky which is still being used was built in 1812. The club wishes to thank Robert Laughlin for this most interesting program.

Next week's speaker will be Thomas Dorman, Executive Director of the Kentucky River Authority.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker was Donald R. Stewart, Plant Manager for the Lexington U.S.P.S. facility, and is responsible for all mail processing for the eastern half of Kentucky. He is a Rotarian. Speaking about the new Frankfort facility, it will have about 4 times the parking currently available, plus 61 employee spots, 47 postal delivery spots, and 2 overnight trailer spots. There will be a traffic light on Wilkinson Blvd. Inside will be state-of-the-art electronic vending machines. The building will be 2-1/2 times larger, with 36,000 square feet, on 8 acres. Currently, all mail in and out of Frankfort is processed in Lexington (or Louisville). The new facility will sort the incoming mail. He would like the state to consider using the old building for a centralized mail facility for the state office. Frankfort shows a profit almost every year, with current income around \$20 million, and as part of the Lexington area, is usually in the top 10% nationwide in customer satisfaction. The U.S.P.S., nationally, handles more mail by noon than FEDEX does in a year, and equals UPS every 3 days.

**NEW RI RULES CHANGE
MAKE-UP & PAST SERVICE**

Two changes approved at RI Council on Legislation in Venezuela in June included a major change in make-ups and past service members.

Rotarians may now make-up 14 days prior to or after a missed meeting.

A Rotarian may now propose someone who is currently retired, even if they do not have prior Rotary membership. The classification will be "past service."

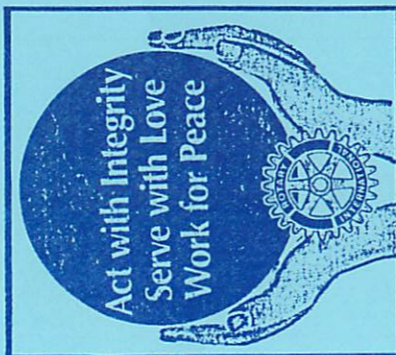

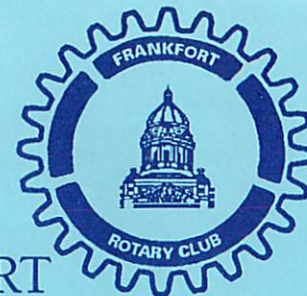

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Tom Dorman, Acting Executive Director of the Kentucky River Authority. In 1978, the Army Corps of Engineers announced it would no longer operate Locks 5 - 14 and it would transfer ownership to the state. The state did not want to take over the locks and dams but lost two lawsuits. In 1986, the General Assembly created the Kentucky River Authority and was intended to take over operation of these locks and dams if efforts to get the Corps to keep them up failed. In 1990, the General Assembly amended the statute to give the Authority watershed management rights. This gave the Authority broad power to do (1) capital construction (2) issue revenue bonds (3) assess fees (about 25 cents a month on your water bill) (4) own property (5) assess long range water supplies (6) develop parks and recreation. A consulting firm recommended rebuilding the lock and dam system at a cost of \$200 million. Two high rise dams were recommended for an additional \$65 million. In the present system, we lack 7 billion gallons in case of a once in a 100 year drought situation. The system needs release valves when water does not come over the dams. Flash boards to collect water was also considered. The state has agreed to take over locks and dams if the Corps will repair them. \$10 Million has been appropriated to repair dams (not locks) 5 - 10 but an additional \$6 and one half million will be needed for 11 - 14. \$3 million of this amount has been cleared in Congress. Because of navigational problems with flash boards, the Authority is looking to raising the dams by four feet. A Study at UK is reassessing the water supply system before we commit to the high rise dams.

In the meantime, the proposed pipeline between Louisville, and Lexington is on hold. The authority is looking to water conservation. Much water is lost to high leakage in water distribution systems. Water quality is of concern to the Authority with problems created by agriculture, forestry methods, coal mining and raw sewage. Park projects are a priority. Parks include river front development in Frankfort, turning the lock master's home at Boonesborough into a Kentucky River museum, and a Kentucky River nature preserve at Camp Nelson. When the state takes over Locks 5 - 14 all Lock Master homes will be turned into parks. A problem has developed as to the Zebra mussel which can affect water intakes and is spread by boaters. The Authority is looking to a Zebra mussel eradication program. More emphasis will be given to water quality over the next two years. An environmental monitoring system will be developed. Recreation on the river will also be promoted.

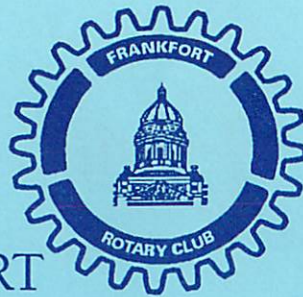

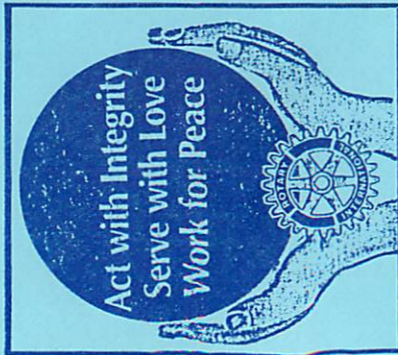

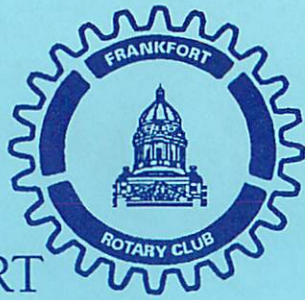
