THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was James M. Wiseman who is Vice President for Public Affairs with Toyota Corporation. He is on a Board known as the Kentucky Advocates for Higher Education. These are volunteers on a Board of 40-50 persons to get support for higher education. Kentucky needs more adequate funding for higher education and more financial aid for needy students. In trying to get more money for higher education, 7% increases are needed for each year of the next two years. However, this must not be at the expense of secondary education. For funding purposes, they are not asking for tax increases but to put higher education higher on a list of priorities. Kentucky has drastically slashed real spending for higher education and is surpassed only by Alaska in doing so. There has been a 40% increase in students over the last decade and community college enrollment has doubled. In terms of economic development, the better educated students get the better jobs, 60% of all new jobs require some degree of college education. However, we are 49th in college graduates. Of the 6200 people employed at Toyota, one half have some college and one fourth have college degrees. There are several perceptions of higher education: (1) KERA is enough and we cannot afford more (2) There is too much duplication (3) There is waste in higher education (4) Extra funding should be based on performance. While there is some validity to these perceptions, we should not use these reasons to do nothing. On a personal level, Jim got involved due to his experiences at Vanderbilt and W.K.U, as a student. These times are valued and were important to him. Teachers made a

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big impression on him as he learned discipline and how to study. Talking with students and teachers affected his way of looking at things and different ways of thinking. But this experience costs money. As to what things to do to help, Jim suggests writing legislators and state officials. Also just talking to opinion leaders is important. In responding to questions from the floor, he made the following observations: (1) We need more Kentucky engineers because Toyota must go out of state to get them (2) We are cutting muscle in reducing our funding of higher education (3) Kentucky tuition is lower for out-of-state students than other states (4) Officials get more feedback from students at community colleges (5) There is a need for vocational education students (6) University presidents are looking to privatization of school facilities such as cafeterias in order to save money.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Susan Henson who is with the Department of Education and spoke about the "School to Work" program. In July, 1994, the School to Work Opportunities law went into effect. One of eight states qualified under the School Implementation Act one of which was Kentucky. The law contains a sunset provision by which at the end of 5 years the full program will be into effect. It is required that many state agencies work together to better prepare students for the work force. For example, the Labor Cabinet has a School to Work liaison who works in the area of child labor laws. There are 22 labor markets in Kentucky which work with a partnership council. 5 of 6 young people between the ages of 18 and 26 are turned down for employment because they are not qualified. School to Work is a common sense approach which gives students experience in the job market. It builds on education reform. The program is for all students and not just those students involved in vocational education. At the primary level the emphasis is on career exploration and at the high school level on career preparation. 30 Hours of work based experience is required at primary and middle school with aptitude test to find where the student's interests lie. There is an advisor/advisee system to work with career plans with which teachers and parents are involved and not just guidance counselors. Employers work with the teachers to create real life job situations in the classrooms. For example, engineers may work with math teachers. Students will participate in pre-apprentice programs and the students may graduate with 1000 of the 2000 hours required of an apprentice. The goal is that by the

year 2002, 90% of students will be involved in work based learning. For example, students working as an apprentice with H and R Block will have a guaranteed job there after graduation. There are already student banks, restaurants and Droger has a manager trainee program and will provide students with an opportunity to obtain an associate business degree. The classroom is now beyond the walls of the school. As to what you can do, she suggested working in a shadowing program or being a mentor. Potential employers should emphasize the importance of high school transcripts and the importance of going to school. She concluded her talk by saying that our most important resource are our students. Help is needed of our community leaders which should include visiting schools.

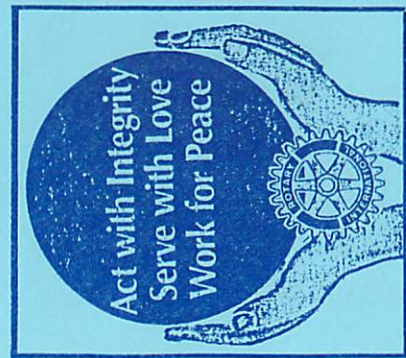
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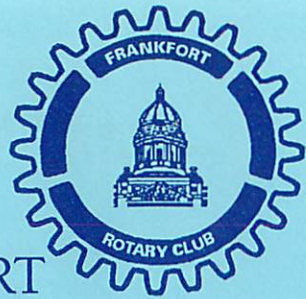

GROUP STUDY EXCHANGE IS GROWING

The Group Study Exchange program has grown from 34 teams in 1965 to 500 teams in 1994-95. In the past three decades, some 5,000 teams - with more than 27,000 participants from over 100 different countries - have learned about life and work in another country.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was District Governor Anne Robertson. She stated that each individual Rotarian make R.I. programs succeed. She quoted Will Rogers who said even if you are on the right track, you will get run over if you stand still. She emphasized the 3-part theme for 1995-96. (1) Act with integrity (2) Serve with love (3) Work for peace. Together we can turn Rotary around. We need to work for membership development and growth. Without continued growth Rotary will be understaffed to carry out Rotary programs. We must grow. However over the last 90 years, only 5% have ever proposed a new member. Civic Organizations are in decline world-wide. 160,000 people left Rotary 1991-95. This District experienced a net gain of 148 in this same time period. It is important to impress upon new members the joys and challenges of Rotary. Rotarians contributed \$243 million to Polio Plus. The District conference will be held May 16-19 at Paducah. This will be an exciting event. The Frankfort Rotary Club is on the right track and is moving forward. Governor Anne Concluded her talk by saying do not let your club get in the maintenance syndrome.

PolioPlus Funds: Past, Present and Future

Here is a look at the money side of PolioPlus from its birth in 1985 projected to the end of June, 2005.

Through careful management of program funds, substantial interest has accrued and will continue to accrue. It is projected at US \$126 million, more than the original PolioPlus campaign goal of US \$120 million. Actual contributions were US \$247 million with actual earned income of US \$82 million. Projected earned income is US \$44 million for a total revenue of US \$373.

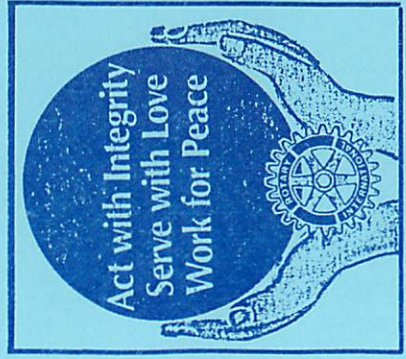

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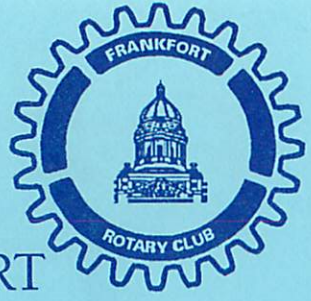
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
