## THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speakers for the day were fellow Rotarians Bill Miller and Barry Holder, Sr. Barry began his presentation by recognizing the Paul Harris Fellows who were in the room. He stated that during the Depression, the Rotary Foundation went bankrupt and closed down. It was not until 1947 that the Foundation really took off. The Rotary 3-H program was founded in 1985 which stands for Health, Hunger and Humanity. Rotarians went to the World Health Organization of the United Nations for ideas on how to alleviate suffering in the world and the Polio Plus campaign was founded. A goal of \$120 million was set and \$252 million was actually collected. The goal is to eradicate Polio by the year 2005. Bill Miller then spoke about the President's Conference on Good Will and Development in October where the focus was on the 50th Anniversary of the U.S. There is a natural partnership between Rotary Internaitonal and the United Nations. Many of the goals of these two organizations are the same. As one example, President Herb Brown focused on this partnership which is mutually agreeable to both parties. The world is presently 80-85% Polio free and Polio Plus is five years ahead of schedule. The U.N. Secretary-General addressed the group on the importance of working together on a variety of programs. Other speakers spoke on the importance of families and recognized that the U.N. had problems similar to any bureaucracy. About 20% of the U.N. budget is for peace-making. However, the U.N. is involved in may other projects we don't hear about. We need to focus on the U.N. as a whole and not just the peace-keeping function. Bill was particularly impressed by Betty Williams

from Belfast in Northern Ireland. She is an avid advocate of peace and urged all Rotarians to do their part. Bill concluded his talk by saying that those who do not learn from the mistakes of the past are doomed to repeat them.

#### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dr.

William Cody, Commissioner of Education. Kentucky leads the nation in education reform. Kentucky took on the task of equalizing school districts regardless of the local tax base. Education development also depends on what happens at the pre-school level and what happens outside the classroom. Some schools in the state had no computers until recently. This state's communication system is ahead of other states. Children can learn through the use of computers. The capacity to use this technology is made available uniformly to children throughout the state. Other areas have been more difficult to implement such as the primary program. This takes time and hard work. Student assessments are also controversial. However, the concept behind assessments is sound. In the production of student's portfolios, students must work together with other people. This and reading are important. The knowlege of basic systems and the application of them are equally important. The student must first know something before he applies it. There must be more emphasis on knowledge as well as its application. The results of schooling must count for something. Of course modifications will be needed. We need to revisit the accountability system and rewards still need to be a part of the program. Turning to site based decision making, this also needs modificaiton. In spite of this, it is working and has become routine in many school districts. The concept behind site based decision making is also sound. This is an on-going process,

Dr. Cody is looking at high school graduation requirements. For example, should required math go from three to four years? Should required science go from two to three years?

Finally on the issue of student behavior and discipline, this too is a metter of concern. All parts of the whole need to go under the KERA umbrella.

#### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Patricia Thurman who went on the Group Study Exchange trip to Denmark earlier this year. She spoke of breaking down communication barriers and how this was relatively easy in a country like Denmark where 90% of the country speaks English as a second language. Her mission statement consisted of learning, caring, building and sharing. She thanked Rotary for taking the lead in changing the world for the better. The Danes believe in life-long learning. Most speak three languages. Using a candle as a visual aid. She stated that enthusiasm is the match which lights the candle of learning. She asked the Club what they thought of when thinking of Denmark. Things like the Little Mermaid, wooden shoes, Hans Christian Andersen and cheese were mentioned. These are all stereotypes. Patricia showed a video-tape at this point about her trip to battle these stereotypes. Denmark has made much growth in industry, but with a 65 % tax base, private enterprise is hindered. Only 5% of the land is arable and with 5 million people, it is only half the size of Kentucky. Beer and Wine is served with each meal. The Danes have a reverence for nature and arts and they have a high regard for others and are tolerant of other cultures. They have large training centers and all training is intertwined with nature. She was also impressed with the Danes sense of humor. She also spoke about how the Rotary Clubs there differ from Rotary here. There are few women in Rotary but this sexism is more on the part of the women than the men. The women wish to stay in their own clubs. The Rotarians there are older well-established members of the community and only the highest member of the

hierarchy in their profession would be a member of the club. All the old stereotypes changed upon her trip to Denmark. In responding to questions from the floor, she stated that 1.) Many women are in the workplace. 2.) She was impressed by the cemeteries. Landscape artists are hired to landscape grave sites. 3.) While religion is on the rise, there are few modern churches. Although the Danes are spiritual people, this is not necessarily related to religion. 4.) The Danes pay nothing for their health care. 5.) She staved with four different families while she was there and all her hosts spoke English well. 6.) CNN is the only English-speaking station but there is much television from France and Germany since many Danes speak these languages as well.

# FROM A SPEECH BY BILL HUNTLEY AT RI CONVENTION

Today the classification system and the types of membership has reached a stage where we must seriously ask ourselves, do we merely pay lip service to them, and do they hinder our progress? I believe our concept of those archaic membership conditions is inhibiting recruitment. I know rules are necessary, but are our rules relevant today? Let us make sure that they are. Remember, we joined Rotary to serve, not to administer rules.

Examine the concept of the territorial limits for a Club. At the last Council there was a long debate on whether a person could join a particular Club if they lived on the wrong side of the street. Consider the way some make so much of perfect attendance. In many instances this can be a dead hand on the progress of recruitment. The burden of perfect attendance can frighten off a potential member.
