THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was fellow Rotarian Bill Miller who kicked off February as World Understanding month. He began his presentation with a videotape showing the close cooperation between Rotary and the United Nations. He then presented a slide presentation showing the history and composition of the UN. The three main goals of the UN are to eliminate wars, promote human rights and promote economic and social change. The UN is composed of the following divisions (1) The UN General Assembly (2) The Security Council (3) The International Court of Justice (4) Trusteeship Council which is almost out of business (5) Economic and Social Council (6) Secretariat. The peacekeeping function of the UN gets most of the media attention but comprises only 20% of the UN budget. Various programs of the UN are as follows. (1) World Health Organization which in the sixties and seventies eliminated small pox around the world (2) Food and agricultural association, (3) Anit-drug program (4) Programs for senior citizens (5) Programs to improve the status of women (6) Needs of the disabled (7) Refugee assistance (8) Programs to help in natural disasters (9) UNICEF; Polio-Plus was a program here toward which Rotarians contributed \$242 million (10) Weather information (11) UNESCO which trains teachers and helps with economic development (12) Rules for air traffic control around the world (13) Environmental programs (14) Monitoring of elections (15) Universal postal union. Bill concluded his talk by stating that all of us are affected by the UN whether we are aware of it or not.

Rotary at a glance

A recent global survey of Rotarians determined the average Rotarian is male, in his 50's and has been a club member for five years. Twelve percent are under 40, 28% are 40-49, 27% 50-59 and 33% are 60 or older. Among the world's 27,000 Rotary clubs, 58% have between 26 and 50 members. Some 27% of all clubs have 25 or fewer members. Only 4% have more than 100 members. By the way, 39% of the clubs worldwide have female members, but they are only 5% of the total number of Rotarians.

RI has New Area Code

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our program was a presentation on the "Sister Cities" program by Gary White, President of the Frankfort Sister Cities program and Executive Direct or of the Kentucky Broadcasters Association. With him on the program were Dr. Paul Rice, Franklin County School Superintendent, Lee Troutwine from KSU, and Joe Johnson from the Attorney General's Office, all of whom visited Frankfort's sister city of San Pedro de Macoris in the Dominican Republic last November, along with past mayor Houston Wells. The program consisted of some 35-40 slides, with scenes ranging from slums to the mayor's neighborhood, private versus public schools (the Americans there go to the International School) cattle farms (Lee Troutwine was the agricultural expert), lots of old cars (new to them), meetings, officials, beaches and restaurants, and several stops inbetween. The feeling of the group is that the city they visited WANTS to be a "Sister City" with Frankfort, and will be a good cultural exchange. Paul Rice mentioned that the military will carry for free any goods we ship to them, such as surplus text books. Joe Johnson mentioned that the Dominicans will be here in Frankfort for a return visit in July.



THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Dr. Vince Davis who spoke of the state of the world and gave an update continuing with World Understanding month. Looking ahead in 1996, there are two regions of the world where there is not likely to be dramatic news: Africa and Latin America. There is room for much optimism in South Africa with Nelson Mandella but the rest of Africa looks pretty bleak. Canada will eventually break-up which will be unfortunate for us and them. We now have serious problems on both borders with immigration from Mexico increasingly troublesome. As far as our involvement in the Gulf War, Somalia, Haiti and Bosnia, we have learned we should not get involved until success is insured hopefully. There is room for guarded optimism in the Middle East. He then spoke of five nations which dominate world politics. The U.S., Germany, Russia, Japan and China. Germany does not trust itself in a leadership role and wants the U.S. to maintain a strong presence. Russia is both a European and Asian nation but has a bad track record in economics and politics. Although over 60% of the land is in private hands, many people are destitute and Yeltsin has lost most of his clout. The Russians have a low tolerance for disorder and new leadership may crush democratic reforms. Japan, in attempts to avoid foreign domination, shifts to offensive postures. Japan has a dominating global economy but has a pure race mentality. It needs to grasp muti-cultural diversity. Germany and Japan have both been building up their militaries at the urging of the U.S. China is a more

homogenous country. It has almost five times the population of Russia and the sense of being Chinese permeates all regions and dialects. China will demand more foreign policy attention from the U. S. China will likely have the largest and strongest economy by the year 2010. It will be the world's largest country by any measure. China considers itself, the original super power. The Cold War II opponent to the U. S. will probably be China. While the Chinese are good at economics, they are bad at politics.


