### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Roger Harden, former ball player and team captain for the U.K. basketball team. He now works for Converse shoes as a sales representative and states that this is the first year Converse got into the wearing apparel business. He walked us through the career of a UK basketball player. First is the recruitment when the recruit is about 16 years of age. To the recruit, UK is the Rome of college basketball or the promised land. Every coach wants to coach at UK and every player wants to play here. The reason is the passion, of the UK fans. The UK coach flying in for the interview makes a big impression. Secondly comes the actual visit to the campus which comes during Midnight Madness. The best players from the best schools are there. Third, is when the actual decision is made to come. There is a pecking order on the team and the great teams have great senior leadership. After graduation, however, comes a big adjustment. The former player has to decide what he will do for the rest of his life. In responding to questions from the floor he stated that his most memorable experience was winning the SEC tournament in 1986 when UK was unranked at the beginning of the year and was ranked number one at the end. Regarding academics, the players are tutored and the students are checked up on to make sure they go to class. Finally, he thinks this team will go all the way to win a national championship. 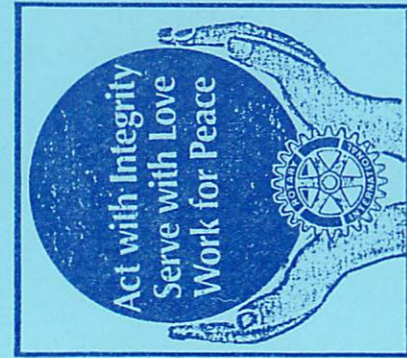

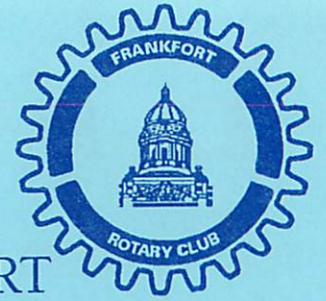

### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The program for today was the World View Conference sponsored by the Lexington Rotary Club in cooperation with the U.K. Patterson School of Diplomacy. The first speaker was Daniel Armstrong of Frankfort High School. He stated that he did not know what to expect at the conference but that the speakers were excellent and that there were diplomats and one admiral. The diplomats insisted on using military strength where appropriate. He discussed the military involvement in Bosnia. The United Nations is moving like a loose confederacy to encompass the globe. He wondered if it was right for the U.S. to force its opinions on others. The next speaker was Stephen Baughman of Franklin County High School. He was impressed by the focus on humanitarian aid. The main examples were Somalia and Bosnia. The admiral said that some of this can be attributed to altruism but this was not completely so. Stephen asks why the U.S. was involved in some areas of the world but not others. He was told that other areas the U.S. was not involved in were matters of internal affairs. The last speaker was Kristel Clayville of Western Hills. This was her second time at the World View Conference and this year was more impressive. She learned that "No man is an island" to quote John Donne. The U.S.S.R. failed because it did not engage in world trade to great extent. The U.S. is the only country that can be self-sufficient. However, the U.S. needs to increase world trade. Thanks go out to Charlie Hinds for his hard work in another successful World View conference. Jack Owens was also of great assistance.

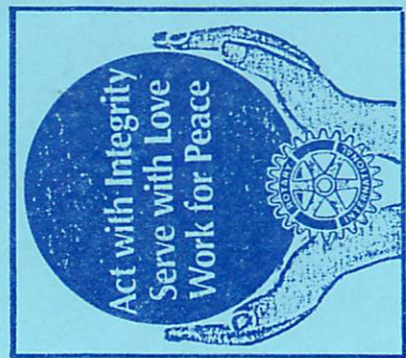

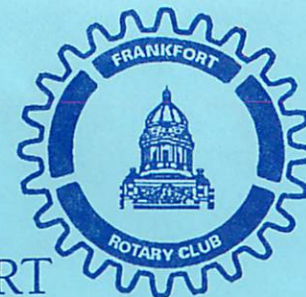

### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Natasha Williams from Russia who started out her talk by stating that this winter weather makes her homesick for home. She stated that it was wonderful to be a foreigner because people do not expect you to "fit." However, being different is a problem when you go into business. Her restaurant business is part of her. It represents what she is connected with and what she is passionate about. She calls herself a communist only in the idealistic sense. The slogan is "From each according to his abilities and to each according to his needs." The idea is to take care of one another. However, this does not work in practice. It only sounds good in the ideal. She was raised to be a communist idealist. But she had to be a capitalist to make a living here. Natasha is patriotic about Kentucky, the U.S., and Russia. However, when money rules the world, the values go down. In 1917, 90% of Russia was illiterate. Today, Russia is the biggest reading public in the world. Arts belong to the people and are a great value now available to the people. Her business is creating a different atmosphere where people can hang out and talk. This is creating a value. Natasha feels comfortable making money off this business, and she is making a market downtown so people will come there. She is creating a business and community service at the same time. Money by itself is of no value but the higher passion is the value. Her customers view this more as a service than as a business. On the subject of capital punishment she says it sends a message that life is not a real value. Murder rates are lower in countries without capital punishment. The death

penalty is carried out more quickly in Russia. In responding to questions from the floor whe stated that the West should not pour money into a system that does not work. This money is wasted. She also observed that social tolerance is low in Russia and high in the U.S. In Russia today, children are confused about which values to follow.

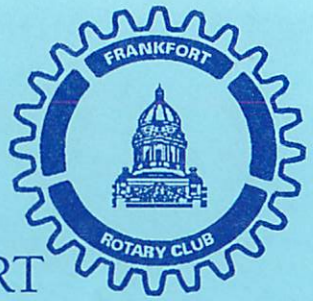

The speaker for next week's program will be Jeffery Alexander, Professor of Art at KSU.

### THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker was Dr. Tom Clark, the great Historian of the state of Kentucky, with some 18 published books. Born in 1903 he has lived through one of the most progressive - and destructive - centuries in the history of mankind. Dr. Clark outlined many of the assets and liabilities of the century, with the assets ahead. Certainly, Kentucky started the century off wrong by assassinating its governor. On the other had, Kentucky started great changes in its education system due to the large illiteracy problem of that time. (We are still making changes.) To open up the state to travel, Kentucky started a public roads program, instead of the toll roads of that era. Prior to the Depression, Kentucky was a very primitive state, and UK was a primitive cow college. TVA, CCC, and other Federal programs were great for Kentucky, as has been the Interstate program. The UK he went to in 1928 is now a world renowned university, building a great new library. In 1939 when publishing his first book, he was told the Kentuckians did not buy books - a statement he found to be true, in spades. Today, we have well attended book fairs. He hopes the legislature will face the challenges of the upcoming 21st century.

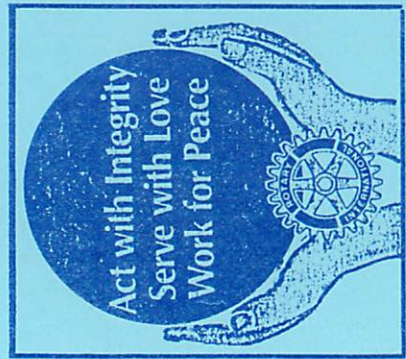

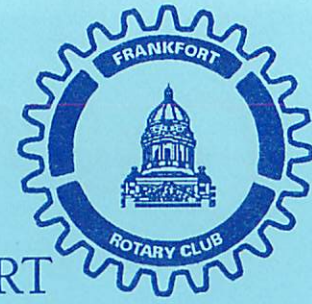
