THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Jeff Alexander who spoke and presented a slide show on the arts and history. The slide show showed works of art which connected ideas to time and place. He showed how art reflected the culture of the time. The slide show consisted of works of art by the ancient Greeks, Michelangelo, Picasso and contemporary work of Andy Warhol. Warhol's work reflected works and ideas of mass culture. These objects also consisted of neon signs, billboards and other scenes of "pop" culture such as a Cadillac crashing through burning television sets. The architecture of Frank Lloyd Wright was also depicted.

NEXT WEEK'S SPEAKER

Patricia Barnes Griffith, Professor of Piano at Kentucky State University, has been in Frankfort since 1977. She is a frequent performer as a soloist and chamber musician, having performed most recently with the Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra in 1993 and the Louisville Orchestra in 1995. Griffith's playing has been described as "rich, well-proportioned, fluent and stylistically attuned."

Griffith was a semi-finalist in the Maryland International Competition and has performed a solo recital at the Phillips Collection in Washington, D.C. She was the recipient of prizes from the North Carolina Federation of Music Clubs and the North Carolina Music Teachers Association as well as honors from Salem College and the Peabody Conservatory. She received the Bachelor of Music degree from Salem College and the Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from Peabody Conservatory.

They report a worldwide net increase of 45,717 Rotarians since July 1, 1995. With this excellent beginning, our goal of 85,000 new members by the end of June is obviously within reach if we all intensigy our efforts.

Rotary International needs to keep growing now and in the years to come to reverse the decline of recent years and to strengthen our capacity for service. Don't think of March 31st - the Calgary Challenge deadline, or even June 30 - as a stopping point. Let's keep the momentum going.
