THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Hal Leatherby who spoke about his recent visit to the Czech Republic. He went to Prague on a project sponsored by the Institute of Public Administration. The Czechs are looking to the West to administer new responsibilites. The project included economic relations. Because of 40 years of communism. they had limited knowledge of the market economy. They are gladly accepting help from the West. Hal conducted 12 seminars throughout the Czech Republic. He conducted a workshop from which the persons were chosen to conduct seminars. The purpose is to train them in the market economy. Hal also wrote a Conflict of Interest manuel. The first Rotary Club there was formed in 1924 but was disbanded twice due to Hitler and the Russians. A club was reopened in 1991. Little English is spoken there and it was difficult to find translators. Blue collar workers make more money than white collar workers and educated people. In 1989, they had the Velvet Revolution in which dictatorship was thrown off with very little bloodshed. The Czechs are once again opening their churches. Much of the credit for their progress belongs to President Havel.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker was Mike Flack, Executive Director of Blue Grass Airport, and a Colonel in the U. S. Army Reserve. Blue Grass Field is positioned as the regional airport for the central Kentucky blue grass area, and is doing quite well for the size community it serves. They were the first airport to have Delta Air Lines "Companion Fares" (now in over 40 airports) and continue to serve as a "test" airport for Delta. June was the 13th month in a row with load factors going up, being 12% higher than June 1995. Family travel is up. Most fares are less than \$100.00 different than Louisville. Most of the B-737 equipment will be gone in the next several months, as Delta is upgrading to MD-88's. As load factors go up, equipment size and frequency go up. Have had a parking problem for 5 years, but are currently trying to redesign the spaces. May simply HAVE to build another level. Still cheaper than Louisville. Last year they added 4 acres of concrete to park planes. Now full. They hope to have a parallel runway in place in ten years. After 20 years, as July 1st, there is a new restaurant and gift shop contract. Construction on new facilities already underway. Have had U.S. Customs for 6 years to handle the international flights coming in to see the races at Keeneland. Looking forward to the future for new and better services for the flying public.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Tim

Culver of the United Way of Franklin County. He showed a videotape entitled Lend a Hand where people with very different needs spoke about how they were helped by various local agencies and organizations. Some organizations are almost totally dependent on the United Way such as the American Red Cross whose budget comes 90% from United Way. 99% of what is given stays in Franklin County. 81 cents of every dollar raised goes to some agency. 23 agencies are funded by United Way and this is the most efficient way to raise money. Due to cuts in federal funding, a greater burden will fall on local communities. One fifth of all money raised comes from state employees and Governor Patton has shown leadership by donating 1% of his salary. Concerning the 1992 national scandal. The United Way of America is not involved in local decision making. Membership in the national organization is optional but Franklin County is involved with the national organization because they do many things the local group cannot do such as advertising and training of volunteers and staff. The local theft also merits comment. First, in response to the theft, controls have been changed. Second, no money was lost thanks to bonding and court ordered restitutuion. Third, no local agencies were affected. Lend a Hand is the theme for this year. On August 20, there will be a kick-off breakfast at the hotel. Tim wants to take the "d" out of fund-raising and make it "fun". The goal of United Way is based on the needs of the community.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Major Mark Shepherd from Fort Knox who spoke on Bosnia. A 1300 year history of the region explains what is causing the problems today. Servians settled Bosnia which became separated in the 10th Century. In 1459, the Ottoman Turks defeated the Serbians and this explains the Moslem influence. In 1878, the Russians defeated the Turks and Serbia became a country again. At the end of World War I, the League of Nations formed Yugoslavia which had a royal family and a king. The king was assassinated by terrorists in 1934. The Nazis set up the regime of Croatia. The country of Yugoslavia was united under the despotic rule of Marshall Tito but when he died the countries started to splinter. The goal of the American forces there is to separate these people and give them a chance to go forward in peace. The american mission began on December 14, 1995. In responding to questions from the floor he stated that the plan is to replace the American troops with United Nations and/or NATO military police. When asked how the children are faring there, he stated that many of the schools were destroyed but the schools are among the first things to get going again. The goal is to return life to a norm. Finally, he stated that the forces in Macedonia are under U.N. command and wear the U.N. bule berets. However, the forces in Bosnia are under NATO command, and the soldiers there operate under their own flags and are not under U.N. command.
