
NEXT WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Thomas "Fox" Snowden who is the head basketball coach at Kentucky State University. He once listed 107 goals at the suggestion of his wife and told how supportive she has been. He stressed the importance of Harold Leatherby being suportive of each other and not be negative. Citing the example of John Sherrill Smith Kennedy who would not accept the vicepresidential nomination, why settle for second when you can be first? Tom describes himself as a finisher and listed three things people ask of each other: Can I trust you? Are you committed? Do I care about you? He instructs his players that there are three important rules to live by: (1) Do what is right. (2) Give me a 110% all of the time (3) Live by the Golden Rule and treat others as you would want others to treat you. He concluded his talk by saying you are only as good as the people who support you. He asked for our help in bridging the gap between the university and the community of Frankfort. To be successful, one must be fundamentally sound. This is "your" basketball team and he asked support from all of us.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The Speaker for the day was Lois Barnes, a teacher at Western Hills High School who spoke about education in Japan based on her observations from a recent trip there. She presented a slide show about the Japanese schools and said the curriculm there is fast-placed. Many reforms are now underway by the Provisional Council for Education Reform. Activities emphasized in the schools include music, home economics, and art instruction. The emphasis is on how to bring more crestivity into the curriculum. Students go to school for 240 days and 98% stay after school for other activities. All students wear uniforms. The students clean their own schools and there are no custodians. There is fierce competition to pass examinations to get into the high school of choice. This determines the college the student will go to and the college determines the corporation for which the student will work. 50% of the funding comes from the national government. It is mandatory that the students take English. There is also much emphasis on homework.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Jim Higgins who is Director of the Public Corruption Unit at the Attorney General's Office. At first, the FBI was the only agency working on these types of cases here. In capsule form, he summarized the cases he had worked on in the FBI leading up to BOPTROT. (1) The first case involved the Chairman of the Democratic Party. (2) The husband of a former governor was involved in a kickback scheme for which he is now serving time. (3) Using an uncercover technique, local corruption was investigated involving payoffs and kickbacks to law enforcement officers. (4) The Lester Burns case involved an insurance fraud scheme and also involved undercover work. (5) The Henry Vance case involved furnishing a weapon to someone to kill a Florida prosecutor. (6) The Bill Conan drug case involved payoffs to law enforcement officers. (7) Carroll Hubbard and Chris Perkins were convicted of public corruption charges. (8) Corruption involving a former Fayette County Attorney. Finally came the BOPTROT cases. After he retired from the FBI, Ben Chandler asked him to set-up the Public Corruption Unit at the Office of the Attorney General. No politics is involved in the functioning of this unit and Huggins reports only to Attorney General Chandler.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker was the Rev. Michael Duncan, the leader of the GSE to the Philippines last February. He is the pastor of the Eminence Baptist Church in Eminence KY, and a past president of the Eminence Rotary Club. He feels that the impact of the GSE has changed his life, as more and more of the decisions that he makes today are influenced by what he learned. The Philippinos were probably the most hospitable people he has ever been with. His recital of his food experiences ere hilarious, as well as beverage choices. Meals were served 5-6 tiems a day, and could not be refused. BUT, they could say "Maybe Later" and quickly learned to do so. It is a poor country in many ways, and a typical Rotarian is a professional with 3 other jobs. Traffic was horrendous and fast. If the road wasn't wide enough, they made it wider, at a high rate of speed. He found that praying regularyly helped him cope. It is a clean nation. Major industries are fishing, furniture making, and concrete blocks. Sugar cane is a major factor, as is rice. We saw slides of whole villages buried under 30-50 feet of dirt that has slid down denuded mountain sides. all in all, an experience.

The speaker for the day was Dr. Keon Chi. He spoke on lobbying in state legislatures. He researched various issues with respect to state government at the Council on State Governments. Lobbying in state legislatures was one of the issues he researched. State legislatures have a poor public image because of various scandals which in most cases involve lobbyists. There is a need to enhance confidence in state governments and legislatures. He came up with 4 options with regard to improving the public's perception of state legislatures: (1) Start civic education for the public, the media and legislators themselves. It should be noted that 70-75% of citizens are represented by lobbyists. (2) Better disclosure by legislators and lobbyists. (3) Have a better code of ethics for legislators and lobbyists. (4) Have more senseble and meaningful regulation for legislators and lobbyists. At one end of the scale is Wyoming which has the least amount of regulation. Wisconsin has the most regulation with the no cup of coffee rule.
