THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker was Dr. Robert Pringle, the CIA representative at the U of K School of Diplomacy. Having a Ph.D in Russian history, during his career he spent a lot of time in Russia, and told us of some of his interesting experiences living there. He also spent a number of years in South Africa. Being in Russia in 1989 when their economy wint into free-fall, he was able to talk with a number of military officers about their reactions to the changing economy. Typical of Russia was the story of watching two workers, one digging holes, and one filling them up. Upon investigation, he discovered that the man who planted the trees in the holes was out sick that day. A major problem in privatizing their economy is that 25% of the work force is engaged in making products that no one wants, often with 19th century methods. Alcoholism is rampant, from the president down, and alomost 100% of the population smokes. Truly, Russia faces challenges in the years ahead.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

Our speaker was Mary Cordy, who recently returned from the Netherlands where she opened a trade office. She is a member of the Development of International Trade Division of the Kentucky Cabinet for Economic Development, and spoke to us on the subject of International Trade with Kentucky. We have two overseas offices, one in Tokyo, Japan, and one in Brussels, Belgium. They are working with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture to open a joint trade office in Mexico. They also work with the Department of Commerce, with offices in Louisville and a remote office in Somerset. Fact: \$50,000 in exports equals one job -- including small firms, one of which just sold \$1,000 in fishing lures to Italy. (They are looking to expand their world trade market.) One of our speakers successes was a trade mission to India. Kentucky export trade growth has exceeded the national average. We are in the top ten states in growth of high-tech exports. We have been successful in attracting "already exporting" companies to Kentucky, and currently rank in the top ten states that businesses would to do business in. The governor will be making a trip to Japan and Korea this spring.
