NEXT WEEK'S MEETING

The meeting for Wednesday, May 14th has been changed to Friday, May 16th at 7:00 p.m., Holiday Inn for the District Conference. There will be no sign-in sheet at the hotel on Wednesday, May 14th. If you need a registration form, call Paula or Len. Please support our club at the District by attending. The registration fee of \$30 is exempt for those attending the Friday evening dinner. Meals are \$20 per person.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Mayor Bill May who spoke on the State of the City. He talked of the need for a vision for Frankfort and has appointed a long range planning committee including Dave Weller, Gus Ridgel and Mark Hopper. He spoke about the fulfilment of his goals while running for mayor. Crime reduction and prevention was a priority and the city now has two narcotic officers. He also got an ordinance passed to prevent the clear cutting of land. He has acquired an urban forestry grant to protect trees on scenic right-of-ways. Frankfort now is on the information highway with a computer for the mayor's office. Neighborhood centers are important with \$100,000 being budgeted for a youth center. There is now a monitoring program for at risk youths. The Mayor credited the city commission with voting in these various programs. He stated that more people call the mayor than any of the city commissioners. There are now bike patrols for city police officers. Other achievements include completion of the flood wall and Fort Hill development. The Fort Hill project will be completed in late summer or early fall. Other accomplishments are the Girls Sweet Sixteen tournament and the Kentucky - Indiana All Star Game. The city budget for this year is \$13.8 million and for next year is \$15.4 million. State law requires a balanced budget and the city has \$7.5 million in a reserve account which is one of the highest in the state. The Cracker Barrel restaurant is coming to the east side of town. \$1.2 million has been spent on Holmes St. pump upgrade.

The three main problems facing the city are water drainage, drug and alcohol abuse and the lack of long-range planning.

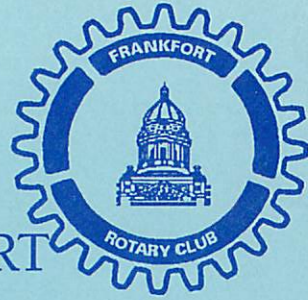

HOW ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FUNCTIONS

CONVENTION: Annual meeting of R.I. held in major cities worldwide. Program of Rotary is discussed. Reports are made by association's leadership. Delegates from clubs worldwide elect R.I. president, directors, district governors and other officers.

COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION: Rotary's "Parliament"...comprises representatives of clubs in Rotary's more than 518 Districts. Meets triannually. Considers all proposed enactments and resolutions and is the mechanism by which Constitution and By-laws of R.I. are changed.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS: Comprises 15 directors, each elected for two years, plus president and president-elect. It is the administrative body of R.I., supervising work of district governors and General Secretary and his staff. Board is assisted by committees and Secretariat staff. Represents all regions of Rotary world.

SECRETARIAT: The General Secretary is the managing officer of R.I. and The Rotary Foundation. He and his staff provide support services to governors and clubs, manage finances, maintain records of Rotary worldwide.

DISTRICT GOVERNORS: The officers of R.I. in the field; they supervise and assist the clubs in their districts.

CLUBS: Heart of Rotary. More than 28,000 clubs form the association known as Rotary International. Membership is 1,193,681 in 155 countries.

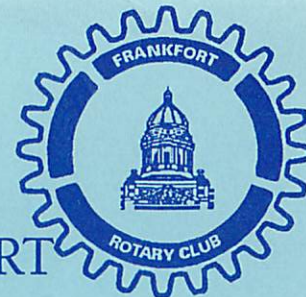

VOCATIONAL SCHOOL FOR STREET CHILDREN IN INDIA

Perry Ryan is collecting donations to send to the Rotary International Foundation as part of a project to build a vocational school for the street children of Southern India. If the Frankfort Rotary Club raises only \$200, this amount will be matched by Rotary International, for a total of \$400. At the current exchange rate, a \$400 contribution equals about 12,000 Indian Rupees, which would be sufficient to hire a carpenter for an entire year.

In India, the Frankfort Rotary Club might be long-remembered for its generosity to this worthy cause. During the most recent meeting of the Rotary Board, each board member donated \$10 to the cause.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Robin Litteral who was a Miss Monticello and is competing to be Miss Kentucky. She is pursuing a degree in allied health and is studying to be a physical therapist. She stated that she is at risk for Huntington's Disease. The disease is hereditary with 75,000 Americans being at risk. There is no drug to stop the progression of the disease and it affects all members of the family in the same way. Typically, HD begins after age 30. Early symptoms - depression, mood swings, forgetfulness, clumsiness, and coordination problems - may be mild and go unnoticed. As the disease progresses, concentration and short term memory are diminished, and involuntary movements become more pronounced. Walking and everyday activities become more difficult and speech and swallowing abilities deteriorate. In the early 1990's the Huntington's Disease Society of America launched a new phase in our mission to conquer HD. This early momentum gave birth to Vision 2000, a fundraising and growth program designed to support into the millennium, the HD Information Service, educational initiatives and other vital programs for the families served. HD is frightening, but by knowing what we are up against, we are a step closer to defeating it.

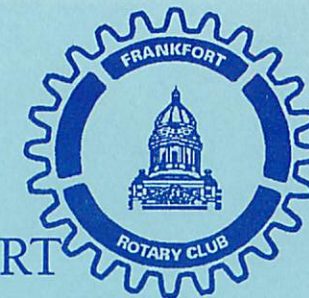

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Franklin County Judge-Executive David Hughes who spoke on the State of the County. He promised change as a candidate and he summarized some of those changes: (1) As to hiring practices, the county needs to get the most qualified people. Two new firefighters have been hired who had the top scores in written and physical test (2) As to the bidding process, money has been saved on linen service and bonding for employees. Money also was saved on gasoline purchases and liability and Workers Compensation insurance. (3) County government is made more available. (4) There will be a balance budget without using surplus. (5) More information has been made available to magistrates to keep them advised of the issues. (6) There is a citizens participation session on Saturday as well as judge's night in. (7) Fiscal Court now meets twice a month. Judge Hughes then proceeded to talk about projects and current issues. These include: (1) Response was excellent to the 500 year creek flood. (2) Remodeling of the courthouse has been completed. (3) The Bald Knob water project will be completed in a year and a half. (4) The Evergreen Road straightening project will be completed. (5) Lake View Park is under excellent management and more golfers are encouraged to use the golf course there. (6) Welfare reform is a priority. (7) Environmental clean-up is proceeding. (8) Drainage issues are being addressed. (9) Progress is being made on the Frankfort-Franklin County crime commission. (10) Concerning the lawsuits over the jail situation, he feels the insurance companies should foot this tab for the law suit settlements. He does not believe public funds should be used to settle these lawsuits.

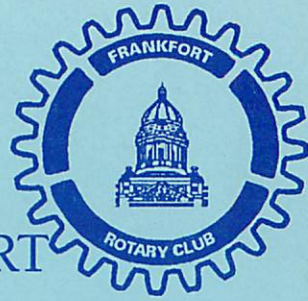
