Aug. 17 Is Date for Big Rotary 'Family' Picnic at Troutwine's

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Virginia Flannigan who is the director of the new Kentucky History Center. The Center will be 160,000 square feet when completed and is as large as a city block. There will be a formal history garden on the premises. There was a "dig" on the site in the summer of 1995 and numerous historical artifacts were found. Groundbreaking then followed and the speaker was Dr. Tom Clark. Finally, construction was commenced which includes the Barstow House which dates from the early eighteen hundreds. The facility will be environmentally correct. It is a \$30 million project. History is important to Kentuckians and we are the envy of many states in this area. The Center will include a genealogy library with over 80,000 documents. There will also be a living history program for children who can have a hands on experience. Parking will not be a problem when the project is completed.

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER

The speaker for the day was Robert I. Cates who is director of the Kentucky Folklore Program with the Kentucky Historical Society. The festival will be September 18-21 at the Old Capital, Capital Plaza and the riverfront. Folk art will be demonstrated which is part of everyone's life. Square dancing and gospel music will be featured. Other works of art will feature basketmaking, stone rock fences, tobacco barns, a men's cake baking contest, traditional food like barbecue and occupational fold culture, like barges, towing and what it takes to be a riverboat pilot. Commercial fishermen will be featured and boats. Completely Kentucky will be represented at the festival. The Old Capital section will feature art and everday life as well as food demonstrations. At the Capital Plaza will be a music stage which will have polka dances and concerts of old time music. At the riverfront will be stone fences and boats and a stage show. Volunteers are needed for the festival. Everything is free except for the Ricky Skaggs concert and the food.

He agrees with Governor Patton that our state needs a Top-20 research university, a nationally recognized metropolitan university, and a strong regional university system -separated from the community college and technical schools -- so each system can work from their own strengths. He closed by reminding us that laws will not make a great education system, but the commitment of the people can.
