This Week's Speaker

Dr. William H. Crouch Jr. president of Georgetown College spoke about his efforts to bring the Cincinnati Bengals to Georgetown. In 1991, many things were not going right at Georgetown College except winning the national championship. However, he hoped to use that same spirit to benefit the college. Today. Georgetown College has a record enrollment and is in the top 160 liberal arts colleges. Georgetown College put together academics, the Christian faith and leadership training. There is a \$96 million capital campaign going on with \$32 million in building projects. He hired a full time research person whose job was to pick 15 alumni to raise money. Dr. Crouch then went on to relate in detail his efforts to get the Bengals to come to Georgetown for summer training. This included getting a new stadium built entirely with private money.

Dramatic Portrayal of Clay Featured Georgetown's McGee

Portraying Henry Clay, one of Kentucky's greatest statesmen, was the subject of the Oct. 29 program by George McGee, director for theater at Georgetown College. In costume and in character for the Rotary meeting, McGee was introduced by Rotarian Frank W. Sower, program chair for October.

McGee lives in Georgetown and the presentation is part of the 1997-98 Kentucky History Confederation speakers bureau Kentucky Chautauqua series.

A native of Virginia, Clay came early to Kentucky and made an indelible mark on American history as a U.S. senator, speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives and secretary of state.

Married to Lucretia Hart in 1799 the Clays had eleven children and resided at the historic residence, Ashland, in Lexington. He died in Washington, D.C., in 1852 and is buried beneath a magnificent, towering monument in the Lexington Cemetery.

Clay moved to Kentucky and set up his law practice in Lexington in 1797. He was elected to the Kentucky General Assembly in 1803, winning a seat in the U.S. House in 1811. The next 40 years he was a major force in national politics, dueling with the issue of slavery from the position as a slaveholder himself. He did succeed in halting the westward expansion of slavery into newer states.

He was called the Great Compromiser for his role in trying to avoid armed conflict over the slavery question. His popularity never did carry him into the highest office as he squared off against politicians such as Andrew Jackson of Tennessee.
