Chuck Willis Takes Early Retirement, Leaves Frankfort for Elizabethtown

Chuck Willis, who is a past president of Frankfort Rotary, has accepted a position in Elizabethtown and expects to move there soon. RB Brown, who was president in 1988-89 just before Willis, led a deserved tribute to the valued member at the Nov. 5 meeting.

"This is a significant loss for our club," said President Don Armstrong. "Chuck has been a consistent leader in any project that we have undertaken, and he will be greatly missed." Willis is taking early retirement from AT&T and will start his new job in Elizabethtown right away, he said. Armstrong said one of the more significant roles Willis has provided is that of forming and presiding over the Frankfort Rotary Youth Foundation, Inc. "The board of the Foundation will have to decide what action to take in filling this vacancy," Armstrong noted.

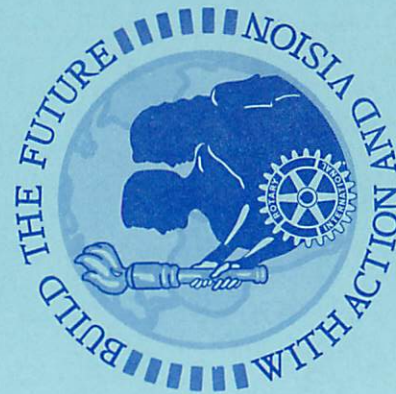

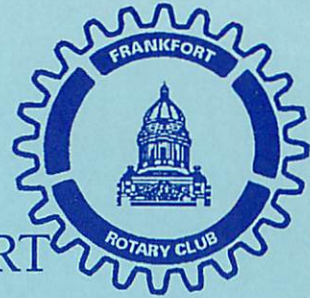

Applicants Are Sought for Ambassadorial Scholarships

Applications for Ambassadorial Scholarships are now being solicited by The Rotary Foundation, according to PDG Bill Robertson of the Fulton Club. The period involved is the Rotary year 1999-2000. The district will fill three scholarships worth up to \$23,000 each.

But now is the time for each club to begin seeking qualified candidates for these highly prestigious awards. You should contact our chairman, Dean Sorg and submit applications by not later than March 4 next year. Assisting him will be Ron Christopher and both have copies of the application forms. Interviews will be at Elizabethtown Community College Saturday, May 16.

Sorg reminds all members the district scholarship committee are sticklers for details and deadlines, so we must move ahead with any candidates for the honor.

The Ambassadorial scholarship is for one regular academic year (usually nine months) at an institution suggested by the applicant but picked by the Foundation. Rotarians or their relatives are ineligible. Recipients may not be able to earn degrees or diplomas during the allotted academic period.

Fireside Chats Held During Week, Ideas Are Advanced for Consideration by Board

The first of four Fireside Chats took place Monday night at the Cold Harbor Drive home of Leroy Smith attended by 13 Rotarians. Leading the discussion was Vocational Service Director Perry Ryan.

Perry said the meeting went well and that two main suggestions came forward. One, which has been on the table for at least two years, is to conduct exit interviews with any member leaving Rotary. Another major idea was for heavy long-range planning carried out by a special committee commissioned for that purpose.

One proposal was to have a tax-exempt entity to channel charitable projects so donors can be guided by suggested choices that would qualify under tax laws but which would be better coordinated for maximum effect.

Tuesday night was scheduled at the Farmbrook Circle residence of International Service Director Tim Fyffe. Community Service Director Jim Brockman hosted the session Thursday evening at the Frank Lloyd Wright house on Shelby and President Don Armstrong held the Friday noon luncheon on West Todd.

Advisory Director Dave Weller, who has special training in the methodology of gathering diverse comments, will help in giving the discussion outcomes a kind of central focus. He conducted a session Nov. 6 for the moderators, including PR Director Dean Sorg and Secretary-Treasurer Clay Hulette.

Sorg Announces Landfill Program Nov. 19 from BFI

Mike Vossmer and David Loney of Browning-Ferris Industries (BFI) will speak Nov. 19 about the history, the operation and the future of the BFI landfill in Franklin County. Dean R. Sorg is the program chair for November and will introduce the program.

Vossmer will also address the controversy within Frankfort city government over the donation of excavation work towards desperately needed athletic fields for the community in general, and at the Capital View Park and other sites as well.

Vossmer has been the landfill manager at BFI's Benson Valley area landfill since he moved here from Kansas City, Mo., in 1984. Having worked with BFI since 1980 he is a certified landfill operator/manager with the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Vossmer has been an instructor the past three years for the state Environmental Protection Cabinet's division of waste management in their manager's certification school.

David Loney is the district vice president for BFI Hauling Co. A central Kentucky resident of 25 years, he has been with BFI 10 years of that time. He holds a B.S. degree in accounting from UK and an MBA from Xavier University.

Sorg said the final program of the month will be on the Internet. Drew Curtis of Digital Crescent is scheduled to be one of the speakers on Nov. 26 when Rotary joins for the annual Thanksgiving program with Frankfort Kiwanis Club. Fred Troutman is president of Kiwanis, and has sent his club's congratulations on the occasion of our celebration of the 75th Anniversary of Frankfort Rotary.

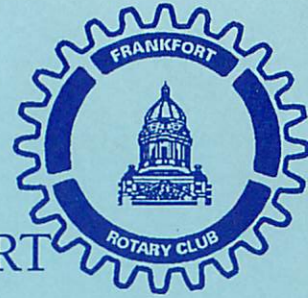

Hold the Phone: Chuck Willis Earns Recognition

Once in a while it's time to hold the phone and pay tribute to a worker and leader in the full bloom of life. Wednesday was *Chuck Willis Day* at Frankfort Rotary Club, something he richly deserved. The regrettable part is that it marks the close of a significant era with few equals in Frankfort Rotary Club history.

Pronouncing the tribute was his long-time comrade, RB Brown, who was club president in 1988-89, the year before Willis was our president. RB had a beautiful plaque made of solid oak, etched with the right words and the Rotary symbol.

Chuck attended his last official meeting with Frankfort Rotary on Wednesday with his wife, Diane. Brown reeled off a list of facts about Chuck Willis that included:

- 11 years of perfect attendance, notwithstanding the heavy travel from Chuck's AT&T job.
- Past president, serving 1989-90.
- Significant sponsorship of new Rotarians, five of whom still are active club members.
- Appointed Youth Fund chairman by John Palmore, and worked tirelessly to raise the corpus of the Pat Ireland Foundation. The fund has awarded over \$18,000 in scholarships.
- Chuck is a Paul Harris Fellow and both he and Diane are Pat Ireland Fellows.
- In 1986 he led the club to renew its relationship with Junior Achievement of the Bluegrass. Since that time he has been a business consultant, teaching class every week.

Notice: Proposed Amendment to Bylaws Would Add Appointed Archivist Position

The Board of Directors has approved submitting a change to the Bylaws of the Rotary Club of Frankfort. The amendment would establish a new position of Club Archivist and open the way for a long term appointment of a qualified person to be Club Archivist.

The addition is recommended by President Don Armstrong to pave the way for a formal Conservation Plan and a system of protecting valuable properties of Frankfort Rotary Club.

Accordingly, the following language is proposed for club vote at the Annual Meeting of the club Dec. 3. The Bylaws are amended as follows:

Article III Duties of Officers

Section 7 – The duties of the Archivist shall be to act as conservator of all documents, artifacts, plaques and banners or other properties of historic value to the club and to secure these items in safe and protective custody as designated by a conservation plan adopted by the Board of Directors for that purpose; and further, to create an Archives Committee composed of club members to assist the club Archivist in performing such other duties related to the archival function as prescribed under the conservation plan or designated by the board. The archivist shall be appointed for a perpetual term, subject to resignation, termination or removal at the discretion of the Board of Directors; service as club Archivist shall not render the appointee ineligible for other offices or duties within the club. The Archivist shall not be a member of the elected Board of Directors, but shall be nominated by the President and approved by the Board of Directors.

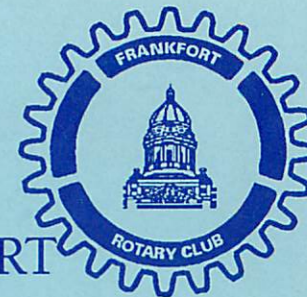

KSU Aquaculture Researcher Will Tell Us about Caviar

As the Club calendar marches on unrelentingly, we are preparing for December and the excitement of new knowledge and information from Rotary programs. Leading the way as December program chair will be Secretary-Treasurer Clay Hulette.

Clay's Dec. 3 speaker will be Dr. Steve Mims, principal investigator for aquaculture and natural resources at the Aquaculture Research Center at Kentucky State University. In 1984 he was hired by KSU to develop paddlefish for consumption as food. His expertise is in reproductive biology.

In the last five years he has concentrated his research on developing a breeding program of all-female paddlefish to meet the demand for caviar in the United States. This has led him to collaborate with scientists in China, France, the Czech Republic and Israel.

Mims has received funding totalling nearly a million dollars in grants from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the state Fish and Wildlife department. The research objective is to study different aspects of paddlefish and their life histories, aquaculture and capture fisheries.

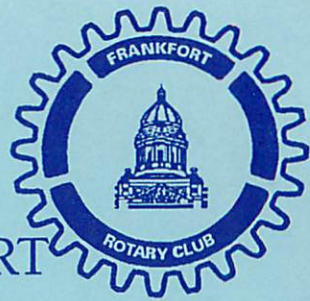
