Anniversary Luncheon Provided Rotary Anecdotes

The anniversary meeting Dec. 30 turned out to be a memorable gathering that comfortably filled the Kentucky Room at the Holiday Inn.

Organized by Club Service Director Polly Jo Green, the program consisted of reminiscences by various members who responded to Program Chair Frank Sower's introductions.

Frank began by taking us back to his own introduction to Rotary prior to World War II. Many comments were directed toward changes that took place during the time when several of the past presidents held office.

Dean Sorg recalled his initial meeting when the District Governor broke the news that Frankfort was to host the annual district conference -- a complete surprise to Dean.

Barry Holder told of presenting a trophy made of tin cans that was the white elephant from the annual Rotary rummage sale. Barry Jr. remembered the time he induced a visiting student to the edge of the swimming pool to look at the interesting leaves floating on top of the water -- shoving the visitor into the water.

Ed Dance recalled the time Rotarians reported to the meeting place only to discover the restaurant had been closed, unknown to anyone in the club.

Chuck Willis recounted the time while he was serving that he had Glasgow Rotarian Walter Baker introduce a Senate Resolution naming Hub Perdew as the official "Kentucky State Varmint."

Several members including Lee Troutwine recalled the opposition and gradual acceptance of including women in Rotary. Some obvious comments were made about the "ladies," a politically

incorrect reference. Chuck Willis said he heard the perfect retort while he was attending a meeting in San Francisco. "The proper term for them is 'Rotarian,' the appropriate way to refer to our [female members]," he said.



THIS WEEK IN ROTARY

Our Rotary program this week will be composed of two parts. The Frankfort Community Teen Council will speak followed by LaShana Harris from the Sunshine Center.

The Frankfort Community Teen Council was founded in 1994 by graduates of Youth Leadership Frankfort. It is composed of 15 Franklin County teenagers (13-19) selected from the local high schools. The purpose is to provide teenagers a legitimate voice in community issues, provide information to teens on issues affecting them and to serve as a "teen link" for government decision makers.

LaShana M. Harris became Director of the Frankfort Area Children's Council, better known as the Sunshine Center in October of 1997. LaShana is a native of Danville. She is a graduate of Spelman College, an all women's institution in Atlanta. She earned her Juris Doctorate from the University of Kentucky in May 1996. LaShana has dedicated her life to making this world a better

place through community service.

The sunshine center, about which LaShana will speak, is dedicated to promoting the welfare and advocacy of children. They work to educate parents improving their parenting skills and to provide a nurturing, enriching environment for children and their families.

More than 200 million children up to the age of five years have been given polio drops in a nationwide campaign to eradicate the disease in India by the turn of the century. Health officials say at least 1 million camps were set up by authorities and volunteer agencies to immunize the children. Mobile clinics visited rural and isolated areas. Special camps were set up at railway and bus stations. At least half a million people suffer from polio in India.



COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION PROPOSES ATTENDANCE CREDIT FOR CLUB SERVICE PROJECTS

The RI Council on Legislation met Jan 12-16 in New Delhi, India. Among proposals adopted subject to club review include allowing attendance credit for club service projects approved by the club's board. The RI board has also been asked to consider Hindu as a recognized language of RI. In addition, the annual budget of RI will be brought to the attention of all clubs no later than September 30.

All Rotary clubs will receive a comprehensive report concerning the proposals adopted by the Council and have the chance to cast votes of objection to any action of the Council in adopting proposed legislation. If votes of objection exceed 10 percent on any particular action, the council's action will be nullified.


