(3) Coordinate with Membership Development, Retention, and Involvement committees.

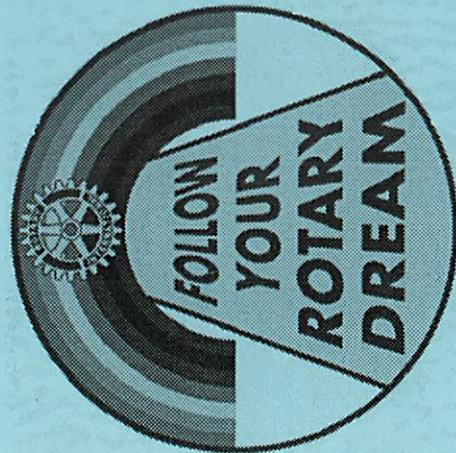

NEXT WEEK IN ROTARY...

Our speaker will be Ernest Fletcher, a candidate for the United States Congress, a native Kentuckian and a long time resident of Lexington, who was born in Mt. Sterling, Kentucky. He married his high school sweetheart, Glenna Foster, and has a daughter, Rachael Kellye, and a son, Benjamin Allen.

He is a 1974 graduate of the University of Kentucky College of Engineering in Mechanical Engineering, and recipient of the Most Outstanding Graduate Award. A 1984 graduate of the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, he completed his internship in 1985, receiving the Outstanding Teaching Award, and established a successful private practice with Dr. Jamie George, South Lexington Family Physicians, and is the Current President, CEO of Saint Joseph Medical Foundation

Dr. Fletcher served in United States Air Force as an F-4E Aircraft Commander and NORAD Alert Force Commander, leading flights that intercepted Soviet military aircraft during the cold war.

He also served as State Representative for the 78th District serving on the Judiciary Committee, Licensing and Occupations Committee, and Health and Welfare Committee, 1995-1996; on Kentucky's Commission on Poverty and the Task Force on Higher Education, 1995, and on the Governor's Health Care Advisory Committee, a bipartisan committee developed to rewrite Kentucky's Health Care Reform. 1996.

DID YOU KNOW??

THE OFFICIAL ROTARY FLAG

An official flag was formally adopted by Rotary International at the 1929 Convention in Dallas, Texas. The Rotary flag consists of a white field with the official wheel emblem emblazoned in gold in the center of the field. The four depressed spaces on the rim of the Rotary wheel are colored royal blue. The words "Rotary" and "International" printed at the top and bottom depressions on the wheel rim are also gold. The shaft in the hub and the keyway of the wheel are white.

The first official Rotary flag reportedly was flown in Kansas City, Missouri, in January 1915. In 1922 a small Rotary flag was carried over the South Pole by Admiral Richard Byrd, a member of the Winchester, Virginia, Rotary Club. Four years later, the admiral carried a Rotary flag in his expedition to the North Pole.

Some Rotary clubs use the official Rotary flag as a banner at club meetings. In these instances it is appropriate to print the words "Rotary Club" above the wheel symbol, and the name of the city, state or nation below the emblem.

The Rotary flag is always prominently displayed

at the World Headquarters as well as at all conventions and official events of Rotary International.

ROTARY'S WHEEL EMBLEM

A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. Finally, in 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association." A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.



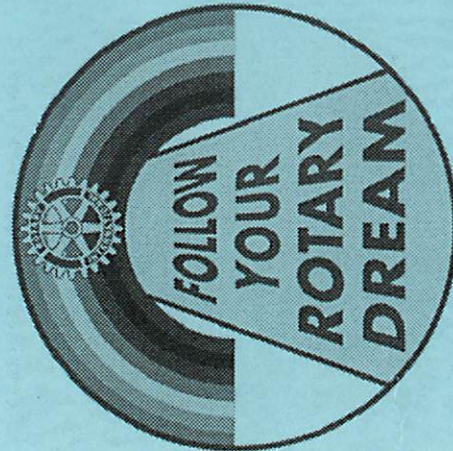

NEXT WEEK IN ROTARY...

Ron DeGregorio has been involved with ice hockey for more than 40 years as a player, coach and administrator. In 1970-71 he was the goaltender for the U.S. National Team. DeGregorio then moved to the USA Hockey front offices in 1973 as the New England district registrar. Ron has served USA Hockey, the recognized National Governing Body (NGB) for hockey, for over 21 years. He is currently the Vice President and International Council Chairman of USA Hockey, and Kentucky Thoroughblades President / CEO.

Back in April 1995, DeGregorio headed up a group of investors looking to secure an expansion franchise in the American Hockey League. After presenting Lexington as the market of choice for their team, the AHL's Board of Governors voted to accept the Kentucky Hockey Associates bid for a franchise. DeGregorio cited the local support for University of Kentucky athletics as a great deal of potential for a professional ice hockey franchise to succeed.

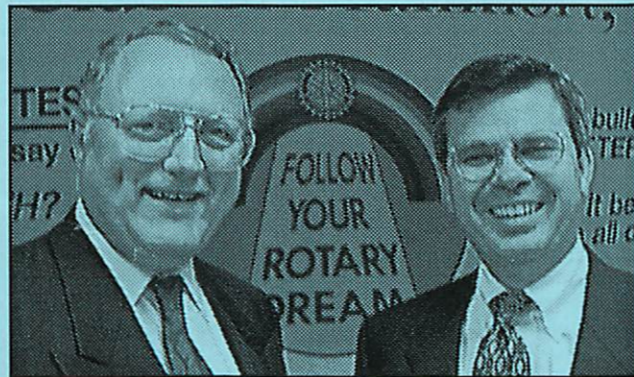
