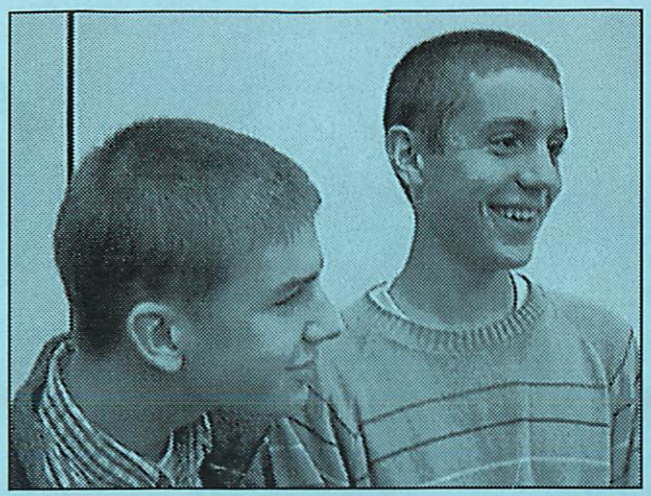

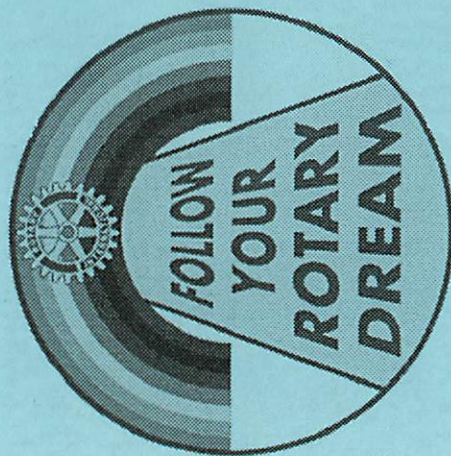

ROTARY FOUNDATION Ambassadorial Scholarship District 6710

The Frankfort Rotary Club will submit up to three applicants who may be awarded scholarships worth up to \$23,000 each including travel expenses for 9 months of study during the 2000-2001 academic year outside the United States.

Scholars are, in addition to their academic studies, expected to perform as capable, efficient, and special "ambassadors of goodwill" through appearances before Rotary Clubs and Districts, schools, civic organizations, and other forums in both their home country and their hosting study country. Leadership skills and the potential to be an effective leader are essential qualities for Ambassadorial Scholars. Scholars may not be assigned to areas of a country where they may have already lived or studied except in unusual circumstances. A Rotary scholarship promotes international understanding.

The Frankfort Rotary Club or any participating Rotary Club will receive applications through April 3, 1999, with the top three being submitted in duplicate to the Rotary District Subcommittee. The Subcommittee

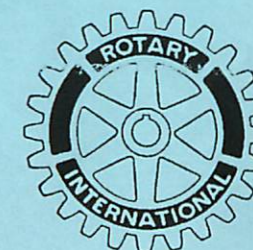
will conduct personal interviews on Saturday, May 23, 1999 in Elizabethtown, Kentucky with applicants who have successfully completed all paperwork precisely and appropriately. More specific directions for serious applicants are available. Dates are somewhat early in the timeframes listed by The Rotary Foundation, but meet their guidelines, and do benefit our district. Other Districts may have later deadlines.

Application forms are now available that describe several scholarship choices. Our District Rotary Foundation Committee has elected to offer only the more popular "Academic-Year Ambassadorial Scholarships".

Outstanding applicants need make contact as soon as possible with Dean Sorg or Ron Christopher for more specific additional details, requirements, and application forms.

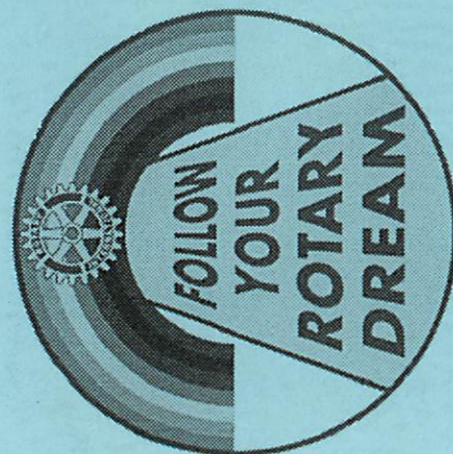

At a recent program, Richard Taylor presented a check from our club to representatives of R.O.A.R. -- "Reach Out And Read".

FUNCTIONAL LITERACY PROGRAM

It has been estimated that a billion people -- one-fourth of the world's population -- are unable to read. Illiteracy of adults and children is a global concern in both highly industrialized nations and in developing countries. The number of adult illiterate in the world is increasing by 25 million each year! In the United States, one quarter of the entire population is considered functionally illiterate.

The tragedy of illiteracy is that those who cannot read lose personal independence and become victims of unscrupulous manipulation, poverty and the loss of human feelings which give meaning to life. Illiteracy is demeaning. It is a major obstacle for economic, political, social and personal development. Illiteracy is a barrier to international understanding, cooperation and peace in the world. Literacy education was considered a program priority by Rotary's original Health, Hunger and Humanity Committee in 1978. An early 3-H grant led to the preparation of an excellent source book on the issues of literacy in the world. The Rotary-sponsored publication, The Right to Read, was edited by Rotarian Eve Malmquist, a past district governor from Linkoping, Sweden, and a recognized authority on reading and educational research. The book was the forerunner of a major Rotary program emphasis on literacy promotion.

In 1985 the R.I. Planning and Research Committee proposed, and the R.I. board approved, that the Rotary clubs of the world conduct a ten-year emphasis on literacy education. Many Rotary clubs are thoughtfully surveying the needs of their community for literacy training. Some clubs provide basic books for teaching reading. Others establish and support reading and language clinics, provide volunteer tutorial assistance and purchase reading materials. Rotarians can play a vitally important part in their community and in developing countries by promoting

projects to open opportunities which come from the ability to read.

THE SPONSOR OF A NEW MEMBER

The bylaws of Rotary clearly outline the procedure for a prospective member to be proposed for Rotary club membership. The "proposer" is the key person in the growth and advancement of Rotary. Without a sponsor, an individual will never have the opportunity to become a Rotarian.

The task of the proposer should not end merely by submitting a name to the club secretary or membership committee. Rotary has not established formal responsibilities for proposers or sponsors, however, by custom and tradition these procedures are recommended in many clubs. The sponsor should:

- 1: Invite a prospective member to several meetings prior to proposing the individual for membership.
- 2: Accompany the prospective new member to one or more orientation/informational meetings.
- 3: Introduce the new member to other club members each week for the first month.
- 4: Invite the new member to accompany the sponsor to neighboring clubs for the first make-up meeting to learn the process and observe the spirit of fellowship.
- 5: Ask the new member and spouse to accompany the sponsor to the club's social activities, dinners or other special occasions.
- 6: Urge the new member and spouse to attend the district conference with the sponsor.
- 7: Serve as a special friend to assure that the new member becomes an active Rotarian.

When the proposer follows these guidelines, Rotary becomes stronger with each new member.

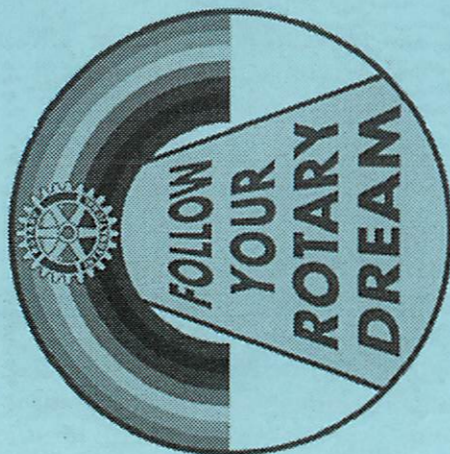

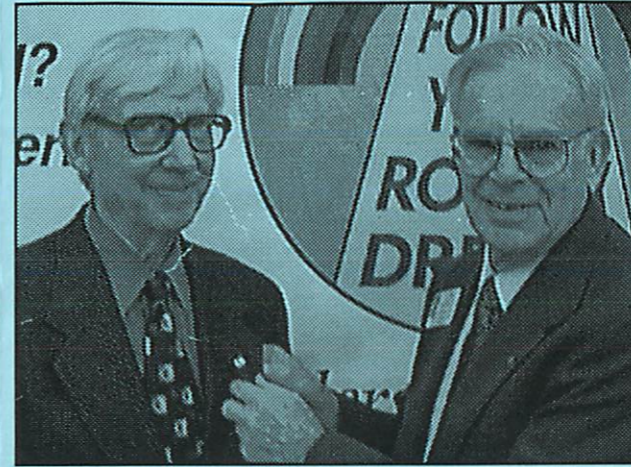

- 13.) Scheduled next board meeting for December 21, 1998 (the 3rd Monday).



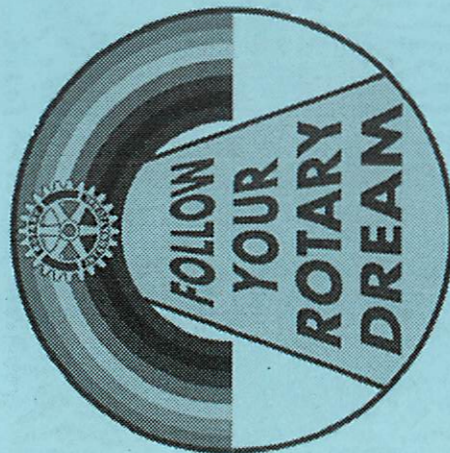
