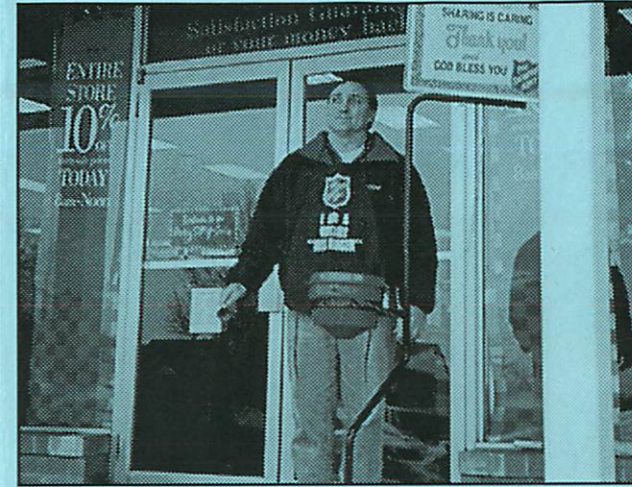

BY-LAWS OF THE FRANKFORT
ROTARY CLUB

Article I -- Election of Officers and Directors

Section 1. A nominating committee is hereby created. It shall consist of the five immediate past presidents and two other members at large, whom the president shall appoint, one of whom shall have been a member five years or less, and the other a member for ten years or more. The President and President-elect shall be ex-officio members of the nominating committee. If an immediate past president is unable to serve, or if a vacancy otherwise occurs, the president shall fill the vacancy.

Section 2. (a) At a regular meeting at least one

month prior to the annual meeting, the presiding officer shall ask for nominations for president, president-elect, secretary, treasurer, director of Club Service, director of Vocational Service, director of International Service, director of Community Service, and Sergeant-at-arms. No member of the nominating committee shall be eligible to serve on the incoming Board.

(b) Nominations shall be presented by the nominating committee and the members shall have the right to make nominations from the floor.

(c) The candidates for office shall be voted for at the annual meeting. The candidate for each office who receives a simple majority of the votes shall be declared elected to the office.

Section 3. The officers and directors, so elected, together with the immediate past president, shall constitute the board of directors. Any vacancy in this board shall be filled by action of the remaining members of the board.

Section 4. A vacancy in the position of any officer-elect or director-elect shall be filled by action of the remaining members of the board of directors-elect.

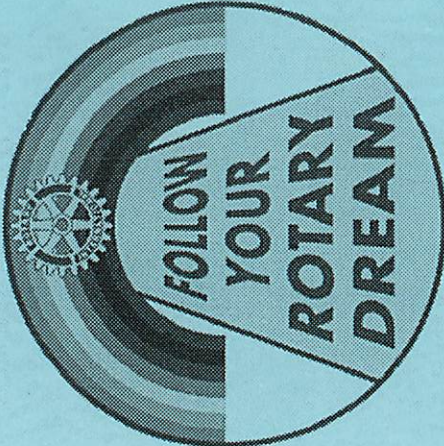

CHILDREN'S OPPORTUNITIES GRANTS

Children,s Opportunities Grants provide up to \$25,000 to a Rotary club/district, Rotaract club, or Interact club (the latter, through its sponsoring Rotary club) for a single project designed to meet the needs of children 0-16, with preferences given to projects which support children in their formative years.

Projects may include, but are not limited to, the care of orphans and street children, provision of basic food and clothing, literacy education, infant and child primary health care and immunizations, child care for working parents, recreation, restorative surgery for birth defects, rehabilita-

tion for crippling injuries, and prevention of child abuse, drug abuse, and the exploitation of children,s labor.

Funding for these grants is available through The Rotary Foundation from a pool of \$20 million created by The Rotary Foundation Trustees and the Rotary International Board of Directors and designated for children,s projects. An exceptional, one-time opportunity, the grants are available until funds are exhausted.

No matching funds are required from the initiating club and no international sponsor is required. Any Rotary club initiating a project benefiting children in a country other than its own must insure significant involvement by Rotarians in the project country.

Each applicant may apply for a maximum of two grants per Rotary year. Before a second application will be considered, the first grant must be successfully completed and a final report submitted to and accepted by The Rotary Foundation.

Projects must be initiated, controlled, and implemented by Rotarians, and have a significant number of Rotarians involved in the hands-on implementation of the project.

Projects must be clearly and publicly identified as sponsored by the Rotary club/district.

A committee of at least three Rotarians (including a primary contact) must be established for the life of the project.

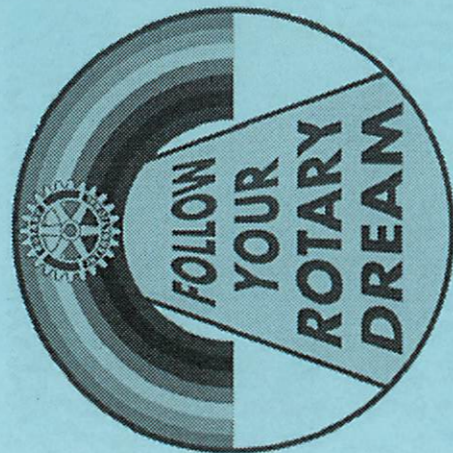

**BY-LAWS OF THE FRANKFORT
ROTARY CLUB**

Article II

Board of Directors

Section 1. The governing body of this club shall be the board of directors, elected in accordance with Article I of these by-laws.

Article III

Duties of Officers

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the president to preside at meetings of the club and board, and to perform such other duties that ordinarily pertain to this office.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the president-elect to preside at meetings of the club and board in the absence of the president, and to perform such other duties that ordinarily pertain to this office. He shall also acquaint himself with the operations of the club and to prepare himself for the duties of the president.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep records of membership, record the attendance at meetings, send out notices of meetings of the club, board and committees, record and preserve the minutes of such meetings, make the required reports to Rotary International, including the semi-annual reports of membership, which shall be made to the General Secretary of Rotary International on January 1st and July 1st of each year, the report of changes of membership, which shall be made to the General Secretary of Rotary International, the monthly report of attendance at the club meetings which shall be made to the District Governor immediately following the last meeting of the month, collect and remit to Rotary International subscriptions to the Rotarian, and perform such other duties as usually pertain to this office.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the treasurer to have custody of all funds, accounting for same to the club annually, and at any other time upon demand by the board, and to perform such other duties as pertain to this office. Upon his/her retirement from office, he/she shall turn over to his/her successor or to the president all funds, books of accounts, or any other club property in his/her possession.

Section 5. The duties of the Sergeant-at-arms shall be such as are usually prescribed for his office and such other duties as may be prescribed by the president or the board. Specifically, he/she shall be in charge of the club raffle, introduce visiting Rotarians and guests of Rotarians, and assure that all visitors and guests are warmly greeted at the door.

Section 6. The offices of secretary and treasurer may be combined into one office. With the advice and consent of the board, the secretary, treasurer, or secretary-treasurer and Sergeant-at-arms may each appoint an assistant, who shall act as the appointing officer directs in the performance of the duties of his/her office.

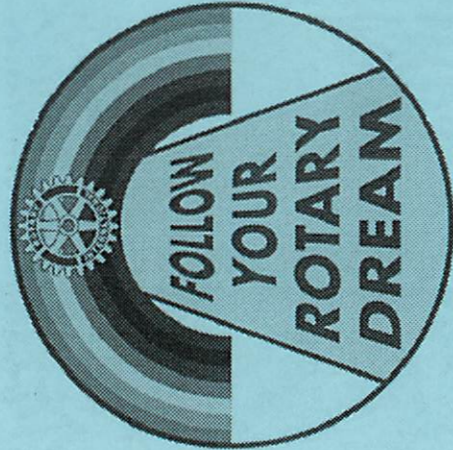
