He is co-author with John Seigenthaler of "A Search for Justice", a legal history of political assassination in the 1960's and editor of two books based on Chicago Tribune reporting: "The American Millstone"; and "Chicago schools: The Worst in America". From 1981 to 1990, Jim was editor and executive-president of the Chicago Tribune, which under his leadership, won seven Pulitzer Prizes.

During the administration of Governor Brereton Jones, he was appointed to two terms on the Kentucky Racing Commission and the governing board of the Kentucky Horse Park.

BY-LAWS OF THE FRANKFORT ROTARY CLUB

(Continued)

Article V: Fees and Dues

Section 1. The admission fee shall be \$38.00, of which \$20.00 is designated for the Rotary Foundation.

Section 2. The membership dues shall be \$186.00 per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of July and of January, with the understanding that \$6.00 of each semi-annual payment shall be applied to each member, subscription to the Rotarian magazine, and \$1.00 of his/her annual payment shall be applied to each member's subscription to the newsletter.

Section 3. Membership dues may be changed from time to time by action of the board. Such change shall constitute an amendment to these by-laws notwithstanding any other provision of amending these by-laws. The board shall notify the members of any increase in dues within two months of the effective date of the increase.

Article VI: Method of Voting

The business of this club shall be transacted by viva voce vote.

Article VII: Committees

Section 1. (a) The president shall, subject to the approval of the board, appoint the following standing committees:

- 1. Club Service committee
- 2. Vocational Service committee
- 3. Community Service committee
- 4. International Service committee
- (b) The president shall, subject to the approval of the board, also appoint such committees on particular phrases of club service, vocational service, community service and international service as deemed necessary.
 - (c) The club service committee, vocational

service committee, community service committee, and international service committee shall each consist of a chairman, who shall be named by the president from the membership of the board, and not less than two (2) other members.


- (d) The president shall be ex officio a member of all committees and, as such, shall have all the privileges of membership thereon.
- (e) Each committee shall transact such business as is delegated to it in the by-laws and such additional business as may be referred to it by the president of the board. Except where special authority is given by the board, such committees shall not take action until a report has been made to the board and approved by the board.
- (f) The president may appoint one or more committees dealing with various aspects of youth activities, which, depending on their respective responsibilities, may be under any, or all, of the vocational service, community service, and international service committees. Where feasible and practicable in the appointment of such committees, there should be provision for continuity of membership, either by appointing one or more members for a second term or by appointing one or more members to a two year term.

Our speaker will be Paul Patton, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. "Never has a governor of Kentucky had the opportunity to make more important changes in the commonwealth." That's how Governor Paul Patton characterizes his current mission, to make

the entire post-secondary education system in Kentucky more efficient and responsive to the needs of its customers, the students and the businesses who provide jobs to university, college, and technical school graduates.

He has just been named Chairman-elect of the Education Commission of the States, Chairman of the Southern Regional Education Board, and the Southern Growth Policies Board. He is one of only eight governors serving on the National Education Goals Board.

Governor Patton continues to pursue his goal to "lay a foundation that will set Kentucky on a path to economic opportunity and a quality of life for all Kentuckians that is second to none".

He graduated from U.K. in 1959 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering. After spending 20 years building a successful coal business, he turned to a career of public service, and you know the rest of the story.

Dead Horse

Dakota tribal wisdom says that when you discover you are riding a dead horse, the best strategy is to dismount. However, we, too often, try other strategies with dead horses, including the following:

- 1. Buy a stronger whip.
- 2. Change riders.
- 3. Say things like, "This is the way we have always ridden this horse."
 - 4. Appoint a committee to study the horse.
- 5. Arrange to visit other sites to see how they ride dead horses.
 - 6. Increase the standards to ride dead horses.
- 7. Appoint a tiger team to revive the dead horse.
- 8. Create a training session to increase our ridng ability.
- 9. Compare the state of dead horses in today's environment.
- 10. Change the requirements declaring that "This horse is not dead."
 - 11. Hire contractors to ride the dead horse.
- 12. Harness several dead horses together for increased speed.
- 13. Declare that "No horse is too dead to beat."
- 14. Provide additional funding to increase the horse's performance.
- 15. Do a Cost Analysis study to see if contractors can ride it cheaper.
- 16. Purchase a product to make dead horses run faster.
- 17. Declare the horse is "better, faster and cheaper" dead.
- 18. Form a quality circle to find uses for dead horses.
 - 19. Revisit the performance requirements for

horses.

- 20. Say this horse was procured with cost as an independent variable.
 - 21. Start an Empower the Horse initiative.
- 22. Promote the dead horse to a supervisory position.





FRANKFORT ROTARY CLUB BYLAWS (cont.)

Section 2. Club Service Committee.

- (a) The chairman of the club service shall be responsible for all club service activities and shall supervise and coordinate the work of all committees appointed on particular phases of club service.
- (b) The club service committee shall consist of the chairman of the club service committee and the chairman of all committees appointed on particular phases of club service.

- (c) The president shall, subject to the approval of the board, appoint the following committees on particular phases of club service.
 - 1. Attendance committee
 - 2. Club bulletin committee
 - 3. Fellowship committee
 - 4. Magazine committee
 - 5. Membership committee
 - 6. Membership development committee
- 7. Program committee
- 8. Public relations committee

Appoint one member each year to the Classification and Rotary Information committees.

- (d) The president shall appoint the president-elect or vice-president to oversee and coordinate the work of the classifications, membership, membership development and Rotary Information committees.
- (e) Where feasible and practicable in the appointment of club committees, there shall be provision for continuity of membership, either by appointing one or more members for a second term or by appointing one r more members to a two-year term.
- (f) The Classification and Rotary Information committees shall consist of three (3) members, one member of each committee to be appointed each year for a term of three (3) years. The first appointments made under this provision shall be as follows: one member for a term of one year; one member for a term of two (2) years; one member for a term of three (3) years.
- (g) The magazine committee shall, wherever feasible, include the editor of the club publication and a local newspaper or advertising member of the club.
