New Member Proposal Process


When one proposes a new member, one is required to complete, on either a white or green card, the sections that are designated by a Rotary wheel at the top. That card is given to Paula either at the meeting or at her office at the Plant Board. She checks cards for complete information and forwards completed cards to Jim Richardson's committee. Jim checks classification with Tom Cockley. When the Membership Classification Committee completes their process, the proposal card comes before the Board for approval. After Board approval, the sponsor should meet with the person proposed (alone or with another Rotarian) to go over the responsibilites of membership (financial and otherwise) and attain the signature of the potential member on the back side of the proposal card. The information of membership proposal is published in the bulletin for members' attention. Two weeks after this publication and with no objections, this newly proposed member can be inducted into membership of the Rotary Club of Frankfort. Our subject today is Herman T. "Hub" Perdew. Everybody knows Hub. If you don't know him, it's your loss. Hub had his 95th birthday last week. He is an Honorary member of our club. He first joined Rotary in 1948. Now for the rest of the story.

Hub was born and raised in Paducah, graduating from Paducah Tilghman High School, class of 1924. He is the last surviving member of the State Championship football team of '23. He was a tackle for three years, the average weight of the team being about 160 pounds. In all the games of 1923, not a single team crossed their goal line. Hub says Saint X got three points by kicking a field goal. When he wasn't playing football he participated in track & field, and found time to play the trumpet in the school orchestra and band. While at UK for one year, he played freshman football.

Hub was too young for WWI and too old for WWII, but he prepared a lot of men during WWII in the art of handling a rifle.

Hub served for 12 years as Chief Clerk-Office of Kentucky Secretary of State, and ran for Secretary of State in 1947. Hub was a securities salesman for a lot of years and actually worked under Kurt Vezner for a short time.

Dr. Richard Lawrence Taylor




