Ron D. Bryant

Ron Bryant will speak to the Rotary Club of Frankfort on Wednesday, Dec. 8. Bryant will be introduced by December program chair David Clinkenbeard. Mr. Bryant has

not announced his topic as yet.

Bryant serves as Director of the Library Reading Rooms and Curator of Rare Books for the Kentucky Historical Society. He also serves on the history faculty of Lexington Community College. Ron graduated with honors from Western Kentucky University with a B.A. and M. A. in history. He completed his doctoral studies at the University of Kentucky. In 1995 Ron was named to Who's Who Among Teachers in American Colleges and Universities.

During the course of his career, Ron has served as Dean of Academic Affairs for Bowling Green Junior College, editor of a weekly newspaper, and teacher. He has written extensively on the subject of Kentucky history. He is the author of over eighty articles on state and local history in the Kentucky Encyclopedia.

In 1996 Mr. Bryant completed a 500+ page book on the bibliography of Kentucky history which is to be published by Greenwood Press in 2000. Currently he is working on a pictorial history of the Civil War in Kentucky and editing the antebellum Kentucky governor's papers.

Ron spends much of his spare time giving historical and genealogical lectures, including 75 speeches in 1998 on various topics. He also serves as historical consultant for a number of authors from around the world. Ron's wife Jane owns a consultant business in early childhood development and management. They have a West Highland Terrier named Fred.

#### **Salvation Army Luncheon**

On Wednesday, December 15 the Christmas program will be arranged by Secretary-Treasurer Clay Hulette and will bring Frankfort Rotary members to their annual luncheon with the Salvation Army Frankfort organization.

Rotarians draw names for special gifts to the children and help Santa distribute them to a special group assembled by the Salvation Army.

# What Is The Salvation Army Worldwide Which Our Rotary Club Has Long Supported?

In 1865 William Booth, a Methodist preacher, founded the Christian Mission in London's East End to help feed and house the poor. The mission was reorganized in 1878 along military lines, with the preachers known as officers and Booth as the general. After this the group became known as the Salvation Army. Booth sought to

bring into his worship services an informal atmosphere that would encourage new converts. Joyous singing, instrumental music, clapping of hands and an invitation to repent characterized Salvation Army meetings.

General Booth was deeply influenced by his wife Catherine Booth, who believed that women were equal to men and it was only inadequate education and social custom that made them men's intellectual inferiors. She was an inspiring speaker and helped to promote the idea of women preachers. The Salvation Army gave women equal responsibility with men for preaching and welfare work and on one occasion William Booth remarked that: "My best men are women!"

By 1882 a survey of London discovered that on one weeknight, there were almost 17,000 worshipping with the Salvation Army, compared to 11,000 in ordinary churches. Even Dr. William Thornton, the Archbishop of York, had to accept that Booth and his followers were reaching people that the Anglican Church had failed to have any impact on.

It was while working with the poor in London that Catherine Booth found out about what was known as "sweated labour". That is, women and children working long hours for low wages in very poor conditions. Catherine and fellow members of the Salvation Army attempted to shame employers into paying better wages. They also attempted to improve the working conditions of these women.

Booth's eldest son, William Branwell Booth, succeeded his father as general in 1912. His second son, Ballington Booth was the commander of the army in Australia (1883-85) and the USA (1887-96). One of his daughters, Evangeline Cora Booth, was elected general in 1934. The Salvation Army is now established in 80 countries and has 16,000 evangelical centers and operates more than 3,000 social welfare institutions, hospitals, schools and agencies.

#### **Financial Report**



#### Gary S. Cox AIKCU Activities and History

Gary S. Cox will present the program at the Rotary Club of Frankfort on Dec. 29, and will be introduced by David Clinkenbeard, program chair for the month of December. His topic will be the Association of Independent Ken-

tucky Colleges and Universities and its history.

Cox became president of AIKCU in November of 1997. He received his B.A. degree in political science from Morehead State University, followed by a fellowship in the Southern Regional Training Program in Public Administration, and his master and doctoral degrees in political science at the University of Kentucky.

Prior to his appointment as executive director, he served as director of the Public Affairs Internship Program at Morehead State University (1969-70); assistant professor at Morehead State University (1969-74); research analyst and executive assistant to the director of the Legislative Research Commission (1974-76); deputy director of the Legislative Research Commission (1976-77); dean of the School

of Public Affairs at Kentucky State University (1978-80); held numerous positions from 1978 through 1997 with the Kentucky Council on Higher Education, including executive director, from 1987 to 1997; and acting president of the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education from June through November of 1997.

Cox is chairman of the Board of the Governor's Scholars Program. He serves on the board for Cardinal Hill Rehabilitation Hospital, Kentucky Science and Technology Council, and the Southern Region Educational Board. He hosts a local television program called "Government: The People's Business." Gary and his wife, Linda have four children: Dana Berliner, Allyson Cox, Angela Hadley and Allison Jessee.

# 1999 Sees New Record Set by Rotary Bell-Ringers

Frankfort Rotary Club Chair Clay Hulette reports that a combined total of \$3,818.53 was raised for the Salvation Army this Holiday season, including the bell ringers who worked on Saturday, Dec. 11. The 1999 figures represent a new record for the annual club project, finally topping a previous record set in

1994.

Since 1993 the Frankfort Rotary Club has helped provide more than \$22,950 to the Salvation Army helping the most needy of Frankfort's children through support of the Salvation Army's Christmas programs, Hulette reported.

A breakdown of prior years is as follows: 1998, \$3,196.63; 1997, \$3,163.83; 1996, \$3,213.24; 1995, \$3,772.65; 1994, \$3,036.00;1993, \$2,752.00

The totals since 1993 include an estimated minimum amount of \$5 for each of 60 children's gifts, provided annually by Frankfort Rotary members. Hulette said no record is kept of the specific value of the presents provided by the club distributed by the Salvation Army at a special party each year.

The Salvation Army each year presents a traveling trophy for the civic organization which annually does best in bell-ringing competition. Frankfort Rotary has won the trophy every year since it was created over a decade ago.

James C. Thomas President and CEO of Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill

The Frankfort Rotary Club program for Wednesday, Dec. 22, will feature James C. Thomas, who is president and CEO of Shaker Village of

Pleasant Hill, in Mercer County. Mr. Thomas has been affiliated with Shaker Village for over 35 years. Introducing Mr. Thomas on the program will be David Clinkenbeard, who is program chair for the month of December.

Mr. Thomas was involved with the challenging restoration project from its earliest inception. Today, Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill, a national historic landmark, is the largest

and most completely restored Shaker Village in the United States.

Prior to joining the restoration effort at Shaker Village, Mr. Thomas worked as the restoration manager at Locust Grove, the home of George Rogers Clark in Louisville. While there he had the opportunity to work under nationally known restoration architect Walter Macomber of Alexandria, Va.

A native of Philadelphia, Mr. Thomas moved to Louisville at the age of 15. He is a graduate of the University of Louisville and the author of two books and numerous articles on preservation. Mr. Thomas also serves as a restoration consultant and is an authority on Kentucky log homes.

Jim Thomas' duties include overseeing every aspect of the village from restoration, interpretation, education, dining, lodging, and development; as well as overseeing the 2800 acre farming operation. He currently serves on a number of boards and is a life member of the Filson Club and past president of the Kentucky Historical Society and former member of the board of advisors for the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Mr. Thomas is married with two sons and lives on a 185-acre farm near Shaker Village.


