Our speaker for Frankfort Rotary Club on Wednesday, Aug. 16, will be Laurel True, who will be introduced by Terry Shockley, program chair for August.

Laurel True began his career in state government in 1959 with the Department of Revenue and moved to the staff of the Health

Department in 1961 to initiate the state Medicaid Program. He afterward worked in various management roles in the state Health Department. He was the first Secretary for Human Resources.

He spent three years with the UK Medical Center working with UK, UofL and University of Cincinnati Medical School to launch area Health Education Centers in Kentucky, southern Indiana and southern Ohio.

True joined the staff of former Governor Wendell Ford working in government regulations. He worked on Governor Julian Carroll's team that regulated local government, and later served as executive director of Gov. Carroll's Mine Safety Commission. True initiated and served as executive director of the 49-county West Kentucky Health

System Planning and Development Agency from 1978-80. In 1980 he became deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction and Secretary of the State Board of Education, a position he held until his retirement on Feb. 1, 1988.

Laurel True was born in 1933, in Scott County and grew up at Burgin in Mercer County. He is married to the former Alice Stivers, who is a retired schoolteacher. They have one son, Guthrie, an attorney in Frankfort, and two granddaughters.

He was graduated from Georgetown College, with an accounting degree, and holds a master's from the University of Michigan in medical care financing and administration. Mr. True is a veteran of four years active duty Marine Corps, with 10 years in active USMC reserves.

While continuing his life-long second occupation of farming he also became a very active AARP volunteer. He has served as a member and chair of the Kentucky AARP State Legislative Committee, as member of the State Leadership Council and currently serves as state coordinator for voter education and federal legislative affairs. At the national level he has served as a member of The AARP National Legislative Committee, a 41-member group that establishes public policy for the 34 million-member organization.

He serves as a member and treasurer on the board of Frankfort Habilitation, Inc. He and his wife remain active in Immanuel Baptist Church where they are charter members.



Next Week's Program...



Former U.S. Rep. Scotty Baesler will be the Frankfort Rotary Speaker on Wednesday, Aug. 23, and will be a part of the August program schedule organized by Terry Shockley.

Born in Lexington, KY, Henry Scott Baesler, known as

Scotty, captained the University of Kentucky basketball team under the legendary coach Adolph Rupp. Baesler received his bachelor's degree in accounting in 1963 and a law degree from the University of Kentucky Law School in 1966. He also received a Masters of Arts in Education and Human Development from George Washington University in Washington, D.C. in 1996. During his years of public service, he worked as an administrator for Fayette County Legal Aid from 1967 to 1973. Baesler gained political experience as the vice-mayor of Lexington (1974-1978) and as Fayette County district judge (1978-1982). He served as the mayor of Lexington for three successive and successful terms (1982-1992).

In 1992, voters elected him by a wide margin

to represent the Sixth Congressional District. He was re-elected to two additional terms in 1994 and 1996 with decisive margins. He vacated the Congressional seat in 1998 to run for the United States Senate as the Democratic candidate.

Baesler's work on the Agricultural Committee, where he had served since his first term as a congressman, positioned him well in his efforts to try and protect both Kentucky dairy and tobacco interests.

Baesler was founding member of The Coalition, a group of fiscally conservative Democrats. Baesler helped to develop three major policy initiatives considered by the House: the Common Sense Balanced Budget Act of 1995; the Coalition's welfare reform package, the Individual Responsibility Act; and the Campaign Finance Reform Act. He also chaired the Coalition's task force on Education and Employment.

A lifelong resident of Fayette County, Mr. Baesler and his wife own and operate a 300 acre farm in Athens. Mrs. Baesler is the former Alice Dudley Woods. Currently she serves as an agriculture specialist in the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. They have two children, Scott and Ashley; and two grandchildren, Fritts and Adeline.

Baesler is opposed in the November, 2000 election by the incumbent Ernie Fletcher of Lexington, who is scheduled to speak to our club on Aug. 30.



U.S. Congressman Ernie Fletcher will speak to the Rotary Club of Frankfort on Wednesday, Aug. 30, as the last of the August programs arranged by Terry Shockley. Rotarian Bob Johnston will introduce Congressman Fletcher on Aug. 30.

Ernie Fletcher was first elected to Congress in 1998 from Kentucky's

6th Congressional District, which includes Franklin and 19 other Central Kentucky counties. He serves as a member of the House budget and agriculture committees. He also serves on the committee on education and the workforce where he is vice-chair of the subcommittee on employer-employee relations. In addition, Fletcher has already ascended to a leadership position within the U.S. House of Representatives by being elected as freshman liaison to the House leadership.

Ernie's service to our nation began in the United States Air Force. It was here that he became a F-4E Aircraft Commander and NORAD Alert Force Commander. During his service as a fighter pilot in the Air Force, Ernie led flights that intercepted Soviet military aircraft during the cold war.

Fletcher began his public service as a State Representative for the 78th House District of Kentucky. During his term in office he served on numerous committees, including the Kentucky Commission on Poverty and the Task Force on Higher Education. It was also during this time that Ernie was chosen by the Governor to play an important leadership role in reforming Kentucky's ailing health-care system.

Congressman Fletcher's primary legislative priorities include: ensuring patient protection in managed care plans; securing affordable and quality health-care for Americans; establishing the best and safest schools for our nation's children; maintaining fiscal responsibility in Washington and providing real tax relief and reform for all Americans.

Prior to his election to the House, Fletcher, a Family Practice physician, served as CEO of the Saint Joseph Medical Foundation. He has shared his medical expertise by volunteering to assist high school teams in his local community and has also been active in his community by serving as a Lay Minister with the Porter Memorial Baptist Church.



Jo has served as president of Clinton Rotary where she maintains a perfect attendance record, as well as a Paul Harris fellow.

She served on the district nominating committee and because of exceptional leadership she was named Rotarian of the Year and also won the "outstanding programs award" from her club.

Jo retired in 1997 after serving 18 years of her 38-year career as president and CEO of her com-

pany in the transportation industry. She was chairperson, secretary and treasurer of the Kentucky Motor Transportation Association. She also served on the executive board of the American Interstate Truck Load Carriers in Washington, DC, and the Kentucky Motor Carrier Advisory Council in Frankfort.

She has been selected for many awards in Clinton, including the Outstanding Service Award, Outstanding Leadership Award, Woman of the Year, Woman of Achievement and Progress and Team Effort Award. Her interest in journalism led to her becoming president and publisher of the weekly newspaper. Currently she serves on the dean's advisory council at Murray State University.



Congressman Ernie Fletcher was today's speaker. He believes the purpose of government is to empower the people and not to empower itself. The Social Security surplus was not touched this fiscal year. By paying down the debt, we can use these savings for other purposes. People should not have to choose between food and medicines - particularly seniors. Education has been increased by \$2 billion. More control needs to go back to parents and teachers. One of the important purposes of education is to instill virtue and this must be done on a local level. 
