Gene Wilhoit will be the luncheon speaker at Frankfort Rotary Dec. 13 at the Holiday Inn. Wilhoit was selected as Kentucky's third Commissioner of Education in September 2000. He will be introduced on the program by Don Armstrong, program chair for December.

Wilhoit oversees the Kentucky Department of Education, which operates under an annual budget of \$3.1 billion, almost all of which is passed through to local schools. The department provides assistance and resources to the state's 176 school districts and nearly 1,300 schools. He supervises approximately 800 employees in Frankfort and across the state.

Wilhoit, a native of Tennessee, began his education teaching career at Northmont Junior High School in Englewood, Ohio, where he was a social studies teacher. After his stint there and in other public schools, he moved on to the Indiana Department of Public Instruction as a program director. Wilhoit also has served as executive director of the National Association of State Boards of Education and Special

Assistant in the United States Department of Education. He was chief state school officer for the Arkansas Department of Education before coming to the Kentucky Department of Education in 1997 as deputy commissioner for the Bureau of Learning Support Services.

Wilhoit holds a master's degree in teaching, political science and economics from Indiana University in Bloomington, and a bachelor's degree in history and economics from Georgetown College. He also has studied educational administration at West Virginia College of Graduate Studies in Charleston.

Wilhoit is a member of the American Association of School Administrators, the Council of Chief State School Officers and the board of directors for the Agency for Instructional Technology. He was chair of the Education Commission of the States Advisory Commission from 1989 to 1991.

A resident of Lawrenceburg, Wilhoit and his wife Rebecca Campbell Wilhoit have three children: Christopher, Kara and Jason.

Some of his stories are humorous, while others are serious and heart-warming. He states that Governor Paul Patton is probably the hardest worker he has ever covered.

Jack stated that during his life as a writer he has been well blessed. He says that we are all leaders and will influence someone in our lives. 

This Week's Speaker: Gene Wilhoit

Gene is Kentucky's third Commissioner of Education. He comes to Kentucky from Arkansas where he was Commissioner for four years. Gene titled his comments for today "Return on Investment." He says that we are constantly aware of our return on investment in public education, since it is the largest investment in the Commonwealth.

We as Kentuckians invest \$3 billion a year in our education system. We are reminded of this every year when we pay our taxes. This supports 600,000 students, over 40,000 teachers, and 176 school districts. Gene stated that this is the wisest investment our society can make. It is an investment in terms of the future of our society. He reminds us that our students will inherit the responsibilities of our communities. They will be the future generation leading a path that we will either find productive or non-productive.

Our society is changing rapidly. Gene stated that every young person graduating from high school today would need further education to be successful. In essence we are redefining basic education. A

basic education today will be two years of technical schooling and a life-long re-education process, or a four-year education process.

Gene says that we could not afford to educate our children in a mediocracy any longer. Kentucky is in the process of creating a world-class education system with a goal to get all schools at a higher learning level. This will take time, but "...we are not about being average in Kentucky any longer."





Next Week's Program...



KSU Coach **Winston Bennett** will be the speaker at Frankfort Rotary Club on Wednesday, Dec. 27, at the Holiday Inn in Frankfort. Bennett has been chosen by the Kentucky State University to lead the Thoroughbreds into the 21st century, the first time a native Kentuckian has taken the helm

of KSU basketball.

Bennett is no stranger to Kentucky basketball. He played his high school basketball at Louisville Male, scoring a career high 2,161 points, which was just 26 points shy of Darrell Griffith's school record. Bennett was honored as the most valuable player in the McDonald's Basketball Classic and the Capitol Classic National All-Star game. Bennett was named to every prep All-American team.

Coach Bennett attended the University of Kentucky and received a bachelor of arts degree in business administration in 1987. As a student-athlete at the University of Kentucky, during his freshman year in 1984, Bennett averaged 6.5 points and 3.8 rebounds per game in a reserve role. The 1984

Wildcat team advanced to the NCAA Final Four. He averaged 18.7 points and 6.3 rebounds per game during the 1988 SEC Tournament to earn all-tournament honors. As a senior, Bennett, overcame a serious knee injury to help lead the Wildcats to the 1988 SEC championship and an NCAA tournament berth. During that season, Bennett averaged 15.3 points and 7.8 rebounds per game, his best season as a Wildcat. Bennett finished ninth on UK's career rebounding list with 799 and earned All-SEC honors twice.

Bennett was drafted in the third round (sixth player overall) by the Cleveland Cavaliers in the 1988 NBA draft. He played in 134 games, including 92 as a starter, over three seasons. He scored a career-high 23 points against New Jersey in 1991 and also grabbed a season-high 12 rebounds. He pulled down a career high 14 rebounds in a career high 42 minutes against Detroit on April 8, 1990. In Game 2 of the 1990 NBA Playoffs, he scored 22 points and pulled down eight rebounds against Philadelphia. Bennett averaged 10.0 points and 4.2 rebounds during the five game series against the Sixers. On November 16, 1990, vs. the Milwaukee Bucks, he came in off the bench to replace an injured player at the free throw line with only 17.2 seconds remaining. Converted both free throws to seal the Cavs' 99-94 win over the Bucks.

After a brief stint with the Miami Heat when he sustained a knee injury, Bennett came back to Kentucky and joined the UK radio broadcast team during the 1993-94 season. He provided analysis during pre- and post-game programming. In May 1994, Kentucky Head Coach Rick Pitino introduced Bennett as UK's assistant basketball coach.

"There is no finer role model for current or future players than Winston Bennett. His pro experience will be a great help in developing the defensive intensity of our front court. Winston brings great enthusiasm to our program. The fact that he played for the University of Kentucky is also extremely important," Pitino said. Bennett also served under Pitino as an assistant basketball coach with the Boston Celtics in 1997-98.

- Scheduled the next board meeting for January 22, 2001.



Thomas F. Whayne, Jr., M.D., Ph.D., will be the speaker at the Rotary Club of Frankfort Wednesday, Jan. 3, the first meeting of the club in 2001. He will be introduced by Ron Christopher, director of club service, who has the programs for January.

Dr. Whayne has been professor of medicine in the Division of Cardiovascular Medicine at the University of Kentucky since April 1998 and was a staff cardiologist at the Lexington Clinic, 1977-98.

Whayne was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine in 1963 and completed a residency in internal medicine at New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center. He began cardiovascular training at the Cardiovascular Research Institute, University of California-San Francisco where he also received a Ph.D. in biochemistry in 1970.

From 1970-72, Dr. Whayne was assistant

professor of medicine at Ohio State University, and from 1972-77 on the staff of the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation, as well as an associate professor of medicine at the University of Oklahoma.

He is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology and the American College of Physicians, and is board certified in both cardiology and internal medicine. His practice is limited to cardiovascular medicine with major interest in the aggressive treatment of coronary atherosclerosis, blood lipid disorders, and reduction of cardiovascular risks.




