ALDONA K. VALICENTI Chief Information Officer Governor's Office for Technology

In December, 1997, Aldona Valicenti, a former senior executive of the Amoco Corporation, was announced as the first Chief Information Officer for the

Commonwealth of Kentucky. During 1998, Aldona defined the legislation creating and establishing the position as part of the Executive Cabinet. She has also undertaken a major transformation effort of the information technology organizational structure for the Executive Branch of state government. She has oversight for all major information technology procurements, all major systems implementations, and accountability for managing the Year 2000 efforts.

Ms. Valicenti has a BS and MS degree in scientific disciplines and began her career with the Dow Corning Corporation. There she held various staff and management positions in support of product and formulation information. She then joined Amoco Corporation and for the next 21 years held positions of increasing responsibility including:

Manager, Office Technology; Manager, Planning and Architecture; Manager, System Development and Support; Divisional CIO for the Amoco Chemical Company; and Manager, Customer Solutions Information Technology Shared Services. In December, 1997, she was appointed CIO for the Commonwealth of Kentucky by Governor Paul E. Patton.

In her career, Aldona has had the opportunity to be instrumental in business start-ups and growing existing business units, as well as restructuring and downsizing functions to remain competitive in fast paced and changing business environments. She has managed the transition of a 2000 staff organization from a decentralized information technology approach to a shared services organization performing as an autonomous \$370 million business unit.

In high school Tom was a world class gymnast, being ranked in the top six nationally. He says he was preparing for the Olympic trials when he was in a car collision, sustaining a broken back. After that he turned to coaching gymnastics.

Tom has a B.S. from East Stroudsburg University; a M.S. from the University of Maryland and a Ph. D. from Florida State University. He has published several papers on subjects like; "Biomechanical Analysis of Specific Sport Skills" and "Health and Wellness Issues."



Tom is involved in many community activities when he's not carrying out his responsibilities at Kentucky State University.

Among Tom's many accomplishments is having coached Maryland High School State Champions, in gymnastics, from 1981 to 1987. His teams finished on top nationally and produced fifty-two All-Americans a six national titles.

Tom has been a Rotarian since 1993.



At the same time we can expect a 5-person


team from Moldova to visit Dist. 6710 clubs for four days at a time. Bill McKinney of Louisville will be coordinating that schedule.



Next Week in Rotary....

Dr. Kevin Graffagnino

Sponsored by Dr. Richard Taylor, Bio Thanks to Kelli Summers

The recently appointed Director of the Kentucky Historical Society, Dr. Kevin Graffagnino is an engaging personality. At first he seems shy and self-deprecating but upon further acquaintance it becomes apparent that here is a man who has an active sense of humor and an equally active intelligence. That's a good combination in a scholar.

His *curriculum vitae* describes a man who has spent his life steeped in the traditions and culture of the United States, but further reading brings some interesting points to light. Kevin holds a Ph.D. in History from the University of Massachusetts and completed his M.A. and B.A. at the University of Vermont. From 1978 to 1995 he worked his way from an entry-level position at the University of Vermont Library to Head of the Special Collections Department. At the same time he went from Instructor to Professor within the faculty. Going back a little further in his past

reveals a fascinating key to Dr. Graffagnino's personality.

From 1972 to 1977 he was an entrepreneur. He worked his way through undergraduate school as proprietor of his own business, J.K. Graffagnino, Books. The interest in antiquarian books that had always been his passion was turned into the first profitable step of a career in research, education and North American history and culture. His love of books continues today and is reflected in his addiction to reading. Any bibliophile will recognize the behavior of another book-lover who reads simply for pleasure, instead of for business or study.

From 1989 to 1995 Kevin served on the Board of Directors of the Ethan Allen Homestead and since 1987 he has been on the Board of Directors of the Lake Champlain Maritime Museum. Both designations underscore his commitment to the careful preservation of the past and the education of future generations.

Kevin's most recent position was that of Library Director for the State Historical Society of Wisconsin, where he oversaw a \$2.5m budget and a collection of 3.6 million printed items in North American history. His tenure in Wisconsin was highlighted by the fact that there he worked with and for his mentor and friend, Dr. H. Nicholas Muller, who is now the CEO of the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation.

Obviously, Dr. Graffagnino comes to the Kentucky Historical Society at a critical time in the Society's history. The quality of the facility and staff at the new Kentucky History Center has propelled the Commonwealth to the forefront of the public's consciousness of culture and tradition. It is his privilege and responsibility to ensure that the Society and the general public appreciate, support and benefit from the Kentucky History Center. "I see the new Kentucky History Center as an important part of the Kentucky Historical Society," Dr. Graffagnino said. "The Society's mission is to work with people to preserve, disseminate and publicize the distinctive heritage of the Commonwealth and to collaborate rather than

compete with the private and public sectors on initiatives to advance that goal."

More personal conversations reveal that Kevin has a wonderfully supportive wife, Leslie. His favorite color is blue and his favorite book is *All the King's Men*, appropriately enough, by one of Kentucky's favorite sons, Robert Penn Warren.

These are exciting times for the Kentucky Historical Society. The Society is fortunate to have a new director with vision, intelligence and the experience necessary to lead the Society into the next millennium.
