Highway Safety Demonstrations

Sherrill Smith will introduce David W. Black as he headlines a very elaborate presentation and



series of displays. David Black is vice-president and General Manager of Lexington Cartage Company, a regional truckload motor carrier operating in 24 states and the Canadian province of Ontario. Lexington Cartage is a wholly-owned subsidiary of W.

T. Young, Inc. He has been with the corporation for over 20 years.

David is the former chairman of the Kentucky Motor Transport Association from 1995-1998; former state vice president to the American Trucking Association from 1995-1998; former Advisory Board member to the Trucking Profitability Strategies Conference at the University of Georgia; and a former Rotarian with the Lexington club.

Frankfort resident Terry Chism, a Transportation Safety Engineer with the Federal Highway Administration, is helping organize the displays involved in these presentations. He is among the organizers of the KAMVS, whose mission is to promote highway safety, save lives and reduce injuries. There will be many displays set up both prior to and after the Rotary meeting.

A "NO-ZONE Truck" will be parked in the gravel lot opposite the Holiday Inn. The truck demonstrates the areas around trucks where it is very difficult for the truck driver to see you. Vehicles will be parked in the "no-zones" and anyone who would like, can climb up in the driver's seat of the truck and look in the mirrors for themselves and become instantly educated in the hazards of "hanging out in the no-zone."

Parked in the guest unloading area in front of the Holiday Inn will be the brilliantly painted, DRIVE SMART KY, Child Passenger Safety Team Van, which will have a demonstration of the common mistakes made when installing child passenger safety seats and the proper methods to install the seats. Up to 90% of child passenger safety seats are improperly installed.

Inside the Holiday Inn, Terry will have a display showing new types of sign sheeting materials and a CRASH cushion. These are some engineering items related to making our highway safer. Other displays will include the effects of lack of proper sleep on drivers, safe driving by America's Road Team, Federal Motor Carrier Safety requirements, and AAA handouts. It is also anticipated that there will be a visit by Vince and Larry (the Crash Dummies) and Buckle Bear. Terry also hopes to have a truck with a CRASH avoidance system on board, parked near the "NO-ZONE truck."

Additionally, and for a lot of years, Terry has been an important associate soccer coach at Frankfort High School with Sherrill Smith.

Program Chair Sherrill Smith completes his month of fantastic programs with the nationally known humorist **Dr. Tim Stivers.** (The last Wednesday of the month will be the installation of the new Club Officers hosted by soon-to-be Past President

During the day, Dr. Tim Stivers treats patients' feet; at night, he knocks them off their feet with comedy routines. "I'm the only podiatrist in town who makes house calls in a toe truck," quips Stivers. A native of Louisville, Dr. Stivers grew up "in a family whose members came from all parts of Kentucky." His parents, both podiatrists, instilled a love for music in their two sons and daughter. Dr. Stivers and his brother, Pat, joined a barbershop quartet and on weekends toured the United States and Canada. Since launching his solo act, Dr. Stivers pilots his own plane to bookings which average more than 50 a year.

Dr. Stivers has spent years watching and listening to the rural people of his home state of

Kentucky and has meticulously woven some of the most hilarious stories told since the time of Mark Twain and Will Rogers. He approaches the everyday, looks at it with stunning clarity, peels off the facade and leaves his audiences spinning in laughter with a refreshing glimpse at new perspectives. Dr. Stivers recreates life in small town America with a cast of unforgettable folks. Distinctive voices, a good-natured, fun-poking wit and wisdom share the personal insights of Buford, Cova May, Chidley Dunlop, Floyd, Berla May, Therrel, Wendell, Otis, Udell and Elwood to name but a few of "them that ain't" and others. From airplanes to "country club lock jaw," purple bears to "dial a prayer for agnostics," nearly nothing escapes Dr. Stivers' charmingly witty, always clean, look at the world around him.

Always respectful of the sources of his hilarity, the humorist delivers his yarns with an authentic country twang, standing before his audiences dressed in a tuxedo or three-piece suit. It's only appropriate that this foot doctor by trade would turn even his appearance into an oxymoron.



Polly Jo Green Completes Year as Frankfort Rotary's First Woman President



The June 28 meeting of Frankfort Rotary is accepted not only as a milestone in the Rotary career and presidency of Polly Jo Green, but the landmark of being the first woman to preside over Frankfort's oldest and most influential civic organization. Wednesday will be the culmination of

President Green's year as the club turns forward into the new millennium. She took over from Ed Dance last July and will accede to Bill Miller at the next meeting.

Polly Jo (Allen) was born in Richwood, Union County, Ohio, to attorney Robert F. and Mildred F. Allen. Her first seven years were spent on a 70-acre farm playing with her brother and sister, riding horses and climbing trees before the family moved and she became a "townie."

Polly Jo graduated from Richwood High School where she was active in band, chorus, plays, National Honor Society, class officer, 4-H, and Kings Daughters. She sang in the choir, taught Sunday School, was song leader for Bible School, and was an

officer in MYF with the First Methodist Church.

In 1958, Polly Jo graduated with honors from Ohio University, having majored in English and minored in History, Government and Speech. College activities included Kappa Phi, Wesley Foundation, student government, and Alpha Delta Kappa, education honorary.

She married Robert L. "Bob" Green and moved to Frankfort, Ky., where she taught English and speech and coached debate and extemporaneous speakers for contests at Franklin County High School. While raising a son and daughter, Green was a substitute teacher in the Franklin County schools and completed her MA Education Psychology and counseling degree from the University of Kentucky.

From 1971 through 1986, she was the counselor for Frankfort High School during which she sponsored the band majorettes, Teens Who Care Club, and the initial YTeens Club.

Also, during this time, Green earned her Rank I in educational psychology and counseling with an emphasis on community counseling. From 1986-92, she worked for the Kentucky Department of Education in the Division of Compensatory Education and the Division of Student and Family Services.

Green is a past president of the United Methodist Women, lay speaker, former district lay speaker chair, Sunday School teacher, and former choir and church council member with the First United Methodist Church. She is a former member of the Frankfort Younger Woman's Club and Franklin County Democratic Woman's Club; former big sister with Big Brothers/Big Sisters; Indian Hills Homemekers; reading volunteer with The America Read Challenge (TARC) program in Collins Lane Elementary. Most recently, she has been a court-appointed special advocate (CASA) volunteer with the Franklin County Family Court.

Her present professional affiliations include the Kentucky Counselors' Association, Kentucky Education Association and Capital City Retired Teachers Association. Hobbies are reading and listening to music. She also and stays quite busy with family events that includes her three grandchildren's varied activities. She and Bob look forward to traveling again now that her year is complete as Rotary president.


