Cynthia was born and raised in Grayson, Kentucky. She graduated from Eastern Kentucky University with a BS in Education and from the University of Louisville with a M.E.D. in Math. Her post graduate work was completed at Eastern Kentucky University.

Things Program Chairs Must Do for Each Speaker

PLEASE NOTE: Here are some steps which will assist us in ensuring the maximum benefit from each of Rotary program, including advance publicity and program coordination.

1. Start working on speakers as far ahead as necessary. Not later than two weeks ahead of your program month the President needs the speaker's name, job title and program topic. The PR Committee needs (a) program topic, (b) a copy of their "one-page" bio sketch and (c) head and shoulders photograph. A multi-page vita has to be boiled down to be of use to you or to us, as well as for publicity purposes! Obviously, if you have to change or cancel a speaker, be sure that the President and PR Committee get the corrected information in a timely manner.

2. Provide an advance list of speakers for the month to Jim Graves, our general program chair, so he knows ahead of time who you are trying to schedule to prevent your scheduling the same speaker as another Rotarian. If your program order or speakers change, tell Jim as well. If you get "stuck" in getting a program, Jim can sometimes make suggestions. He and others are always willing to help you.

3. Provide bios and photos in advance of your Rotary program month, but NOT LATER than two weeks ahead of each scheduled program. Provide these bios and photos to Don Armstrong and/or Dean Sorg, together with your speaker's program subject or topic. If you are having problems getting the bios and photos, let Armstrong or Sorg know so arrangements

can be made to avoid last-minute rushes.

4. The very best way to provide your speaker bio is to send it by e-mail either to Armstrong or Sorg. We can handle biographies submitted on paper, but the paper format will have to be retyped for use in the Frankfortarian or to be sent to the news media. Forwarding the bio via e-mail promotes attendance and gives Armstrong or Sorg a chance to get publicity in local media ahead of our meeting dates.

5. If your speaker offers to provide an electronic graphic (instead of a conventional photo) please try to get the graphic image sent via e-mail, preferably to Steve Fry by e-mail at his State Journal address, saving a lot of time for everybody involved. Tell Paula Rarden, plus Don and/or Dean you are using the e-mail to send the graphic so they will know not to duplicate your effort.

6. Channel 10 Cable TV will automatically be provided advance information from the PR Committee so the cable system can also list and promote Rotary's programs. Armstrong or Sorg take care of Channel 10.

This helps us as well!

RI and Frankfort Rotary Club honored for polio work

The House of Representatives and the Senate of the state of Kentucky recently adopted citations honoring Rotary International and the Rotary Club of Frankfort, Kentucky, USA, for the work the organization is doing to combat polio.

The February 25 event was the second time that the two chambers of the state's legislature have praised Rotary International and its partners for leading the global efforts to eradicate polio. In 1998, the House and Senate adopted similar citations to recognize PolioPlus, one of the most ambitious humanitarian undertakings ever made by a private entity in the history of private-public collaborations in the fight against disease.

"[This] extraordinary organization is afforded the deepest gratitude for their immense and valuable work to develop and support the PolioPlus Program," said the citation signed by Jody Richards, Speaker of the House, and state Representative Gippy Graham, sponsor of the motion calling for the citation. "The success of this program is demonstrated through the prevention of over 500,000 cases of polio each year."

The Senate's version of the citation bore the signature of Senate President David L. Williams and Senator Marshall Long, who sponsored the citation motion in the upper chamber. Rotarians who were invited to appear before both houses included Len Shirrell and Barry K. Holder, past governors of District 6710, and Polly Jo Green, president of the Rotary Club of Frankfort.

"Those of us who attended the sessions were deeply moved by this recognition of Rotary by our legislature," said Green. "The citation is an honor that belongs to all Rotarians, not just our club." She said that, regardless of where it happens, recognition of the work that Rotary does should inspire Rotarians everywhere to get more involved in service in their communities and the world so that they are not members of the organization in name only.

According to Donald L. Armstrong, chairman of the club's public relations committee, the citation raised the profile of Rotary and the PolioPlus program in Kentucky. Not only are the state's lawmakers now aware of what the organization does, he said, but their constituents, who watched the event live courtesy of Kentucky Educational Television now know what Rotarians in their communities are accomplishing globally.





On June 7, noted commentator **Byron Crawford** will be the first of Rotarian Sherrill Smith's interesting June programs.

Byron Crawford's stories

have appeared in such papers as the *New York Times, USA Today*, the *Los Angeles Times* and the *London Sunday Telegraph*. But they are most at home on the Kentucky pages of the *Louisville Courier-Journal* and the *Cincinnati Enquirer*.

His popular television and newspaper features about Kentucky's people, places and folkways have become an everyday part of Kentucky like for

many people over the years.

Byron spent his early career in radio at WCKY in Cincinnati and WHAS in Louisville before moving to WHAS-TV in 1974. There he hosted the syndicated feature series, "Sideroads," which aired on several other stations across the South and Midwest.

He became the Courier-Journal's Kentucky Columnist in 1979 and has carried on the tradition of the late Joe Creason and Allan Trout who wrote the column before him.

Byron is the former host of KET's Emmy-award

winning *Kentucky Life* series and is the author of two books of Kentucky stories.

Publisher Barry Bingham Jr. declared his writing, "addictive," and the late Charles Kuralt proclaimed him, "The best storyteller in Kentucky, if you count only the ones who tell the truth." But Byron says he wishes Kuralt had left out that part about the truth.


