Barry Holder & Len Shirrell "The Rotary International Foundation"

On Wednesday, Nov. 8, Barry Holder and Len Shirrell will provide an informative overview of the lifeline of the RI's international and domestic programs, The RI Foundation.

Barry, who has 26 years of perfect attendance, served as the Frankfort Club's president from 1980-81, and later achieved the position of district governor in 1987. Barry, recently retired from the Kentucky Labor Cabinet, has served on numerous RI presidential task forces and committees.

Len, who has 46 years of perfect attendance, was the Frankfort Rotary Club's president in 1969-70, and in 1990 he served as the district

This Week's Speaker -Commissioner Derrick Graham

City Commissioner Derrick Graham gave a report on his nine years of service as a City Commissioner. He strongly believes that public service is a public trust. He listed five major areas of accomplishment by the City Commission:

1.) Regulatory Action - Best examples were

the establishment of the Code Enforcement Board, the setting of curfew limits, and a Code of Ethics for city officials.

- 2.) Public Safety The ambulance and paramedic services have been increased. Two new fire trucks will be delivered next month. The number of police officers has been increased, but racial profiling must not be a policy on the police force.
- 3.) Parks and Recreation Improvement The improvements to Fort Hill and other parks are examples.
- 4.) Fiscal Improvement Flood prevention efforts are continuing. A \$6.5 million tunnel will be built and many homes have been relocated.
- 5.) Finances The City is in excellent financial condition in spite of all the capital improvements which have been made. The Economic Development Authority has bee established. The first Industrial Park has been paid off.

Thank you, Commissioner Graham, for this most interesting program.

The Rotary Foundation History

In 1917, Arch C. Klumph, Rotary's sixth president, proposed to the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, the creation of an "endowment fund for Rotary . . . for the purpose of doing good in the world in charitable, educational, and other avenues of community service." A few months later, the endowment received its first contribution of \$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City, Missouri, USA.

In 1928, when the endowment fund had grown to more than US\$5,000, the fund was renamed The Rotary Foundation, and it became a distinct entity within Rotary International. Five Trustees, including Klumph, were appointed to "hold, invest, manage, and administer all of its property.... as a single trust, for the furtherance of the purposes of RI."

Two years later, the Foundation made its first grant of US\$500 to the International Society for Crippled Children. The ISCC — created by Rotarian Edgar F. "Daddy" Allen — later grew into the Easter Seals organization.

The Great Depression and World War II both impeded significant growth for the Foundation, but the need for promoting a lasting world peace generated great post-war interest in developing Foundation programs.

After Rotary founder Paul P. Harris died in 1947, contributions began pouring into Rotary International, and the Paul Harris Memorial Fund was created for the purpose of building the Foundation.

That same year, the first Foundation program was established — Fellowships for Advanced Study, which was the forerunner of the Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarships program. Then in 1965-66, three new programs were launched — Group Study Exchange, Awards for Technical Training, and Grants for Activities in Keeping with the Objective of The Rotary Foundation, which was later called Matching Grants.

The Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) program was launched in 1978, with the Rotary Volunteers program being created as a part of 3-H in 1980. The PolioPlus Program was announced in 1984-85, and the following year saw the introduction of Rotary Grants for University Teachers. The first Peace Forums were held in 1987-88, leading to the establishment of Rotary Peace Programs.

Then in 1989, 1963-64 RI President Carl P. Miller and his wife, Ruth, donated US\$1 million to establish the Discovery Grants program. Throughout this time, support of the Foundation grew tremendously. Since that first \$26.50 donation in 1917, the Foundation has received contributions totaling more than US\$1 billion. More than US\$68 million was donated in 1998-99 alone. To date, some 726,000 individuals have been recognized as Paul Harris Fellows — that is, someone who has contributed US\$1000 or has had that amount contributed in his or her name.

Such strong support and involvement of Rotarians worldwide ensures a secure future for The Rotary Foundation as it continues its vital work for international understanding and world peace. Periodicals Class Postage

David Fisher will speak to Frankfort Rotary Nov. 15, to be introduced by Program Chair Joe Russell Johnson. David will speak on his experiences in the Forestry Service and the recent wildfires out West. He is a charter member and past president of the Capital City Rotary Club.

Fisher was graduated from Purdue University in 1962 with a degree in forestry. In March 1962 he started working as a service forester in Jackson, Ky., with the Division of Forestry. He was promoted to assistant district forester in Morehead and then became nursery superintendent at the Kentucky Dam nursery at Gilbertsville. He became chief of nursery operations to the tree improvement and state forest programs.

David became chief of field operations for the Forestry Division for the entire state before taking retirement last September.

Fisher greatly enjoys the sport of shooting. His main interest is the pistol and is classified as

a distinguished master in the NRA pistol competition. He has won 14 gold and 2 silver medals in the Bluegrass State Games pistol competition since 1993. David is listed in the top 100 pistol shooters in the U.S. He is the winner of the President's 100 Medallion and has previously qualified for the Olympic tryouts. He also enjoys high power rifle competition.

This Week's Speakers: Len Shirrell and Barry Holder

The speaker for the day were Len Shirrell and Barry Holder who spoke on the Rotary Foundation. The Polioplus campaign was an example of the outstanding work of the Foundation. Two ways Rotarians can donate are through the annual giving and through a permanent fund in which only the interest is used. 60% is for local benefit. The allocation of this fund is left up to the individual. Our club has 96 Paul Harris Fellows and

13 are multiple Paul Harris Fellows. Three members have contributed more than \$10,000 and in addition we have 5 benefactors.

Barry Holder spoke on the need for Rotarians to know where their money is going. 33% of each dollar goes to the Polioplus campaign, which is being waged in conjunction with the United Nations World Health Organization and the UN Children's Fund (UNICEF). Over one billion children will soon be immunized against Polio. 25% goes to educational programs which include the Ambassadorial Scholarship Program as well as the Group Study Exchange. The other 44% goes to Humanitarian Programs like disaster relief. The US gives 47 cents on the dollar to the Foundation.

All members of the Frankfort Rotary Club are encouraged to become Paul Harris Fellows, Sustaining Members, and donors to the Rotary Foundation. Thanks to Len and Barry for this most informative program today.



Bo Shafer of Knoxville, TN, president of Kiwanis International, will be the program speaker Wednesday, Nov. 22, at the traditional Thanksgiving joint program with Frankfort Rotary and Frankfort Kiwanis clubs. The program for the meeting will be conducted by Frankfort Kiwanis, which

alternates each Thanksgiving. Presiding will be Tom Utterback of Frankfort, this year's President of Frankfort Kiwanis, who also is a member of Frankfort Rotary.

Shafer became Kiwanis president at the 85th International in Miami in June 2000. He first joined the International Board as a trustee in 1994 and then served as one of the two vice presidents during 1997-98 and as treasurer in 1998-99. He is a 37-year member and past president of the Kiwanis Club of Knoxville. He earned distinguished honors as governor of the Kentucky-Tennessee district in 1988-89.

Bo is a second-generation Kiwanian whose

father was district governor in 1965. He was a charter member of West High School Key Club and the University of Tennessee Circle-K Club. Before his election to the International Board, he served as a member of three International committees. He holds Life Member Status in Kiwanis International, and is a Hixson Fellow of the Kiwanis International Foundation.

Shafer is an independent insurance agent, board member at First Tennessee Bank, and former board member of Valley Bank. In addition to his Kiwanis involvement, he is a past vice president of the Chamber of Commerce and past president of the Knoxville Executives Club. He has served on the board of the Salvation Army more than 30 years.

He has been a leader in many civic groups and fund-raising campaigns, including United Way, Salvation Army, Children's Hospital, Heart Fund, and Ronald McDonald House. He is a co-founder of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Knoxville, the Knoxville Harvest to feed the hungry with restaurant food surpluses, and a Boy Scout Troop in a low-income housing project. He was recently recognized with the outstanding civic leader award from the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

This Week's Speaker: David Fisher

The speaker for the day was David Fisher, formerly with the Forestry Service. Kentucky Division of Forestry dates to 1912 to protect 12 million acres of private forests. It assists 100,000 private forest owners. The Nursery Program is in addition to Fire Protection Programs and Forestry Logging Programs. Most of the fire problem has always been in East Kentucky. He spoke about his experience in the Forestry Service in Breathitt County, Kentucky, especially the terrible year of 1963, in terms of wildfires. Fire towers are no longer used and fire spotting is done by airplanes. Heavy-duty pumper units are also used. The National Guard has been utilized in firefighting

this year. David demonstrated several of the tools used by the firefighters. Thank you, David, for this most informative program.



Veteran news reporter Jack Brammer of the Lexington Herald-Leader will be the first program speaker for the Rotary Club of Frankfort. Introduced by December program chair Don Armstrong, Brammer will talk about newspapers as the "first draft of history." He plans to comment on

the outcomes of the Nov. 7 elections and tell anecdotes about governors he has covered for the Herald-Leader.

Born in 1951 at Maysville, Brammer graduated in 1969 from Maysville High School as class covaledictorian with a perfect grade point average. In 1973 he received the bachelor's degree from UK and added a master's degree in communications from UK in 1976. In 1974-75 Brammer was a physics and biology teacher at Matoaca High School near Petersburg, VA.

He held his first reporting job with *The Sentinel-News*, Shelbyville, 1976-78. Brammer became a reporter for *The Lexington Leader*, 1978-82, and in

1983 moved to the Frankfort bureau as a reporter for the *Lexington Herald-Leader*, where he serves at present, primarily reporting on state government and politics.

Brammer is a former president of Shelby County High PTA; secretary of Bluegrass Chapter of Society of Professional Journalists, Lexington; vice president of the Shelby County Historical Society; board member of University of Kentucky Shelby County Alumni Association; former president of Shelby County Big Brothers-Big Sisters and a Christian lay speaker member for Southeast Christian Church in Louisville.

His recent journalism awards include winning the 1999 Kentucky Press Association award for coverage of gambling in Kentucky; the 1999 Anthony Lewis Media Award for story about poor pay for public defenders; 1994 Sigma Delta Chi Award for public service for "Little Kingdoms," a series detailing the corruption of power among the state's 120 counties. He also took a KPA first place award in 1993 for the best investigative/analytical story, "Givers and Takers," a look at how state legislators finance their election campaigns and how lobbyists influence elections. He was the 1990 finalist for a Pulitzer Prize in investigative reporting for "Cheating Our Children," a series of stories that helped spark major education reforms in Kentucky. The series exposed widespread abuse of the state's education system and of property taxes used to fund education.

His wife, Brenda Gallagher Brammer, is a speech pathologist in Shelby County school system. They have a 19-year son, Ben, who is a freshman at UofL. They live at 210 Adair Ave. in Shelbyville.


