Harold R. Benson, Ph.D., a member of the KSU Cooperative Extension Faculty, has been the director of land grant programs for Kentucky State University since 1985. This places Dr. Benson in charge of all research and extension programs of the university. He will be introduced Oct. 11 by Prof.

Andrew Smith, program chair for October.

Dr. Benson was awarded the doctorate in adult and continuing education at the Ohio State University, Columbus, in 1975, where he also received the master's degree in guidance counseling in 1972. He came from Bamberg, SC and holds the BS in math from Morris College in Sumter, SC.

In addition to administrative responsibilities, Dr. Benson was a math teacher and a coach of boy's athletics at Green Sea High School, Green Sea, SC, and also taught at Finklea High at Loris, SC, and Corbertt High at Wagener, SC.

He owns a number of impressive awards and recognitions including a leadership award in 1986 from the president of KSU for his service in Land-Grant programs.

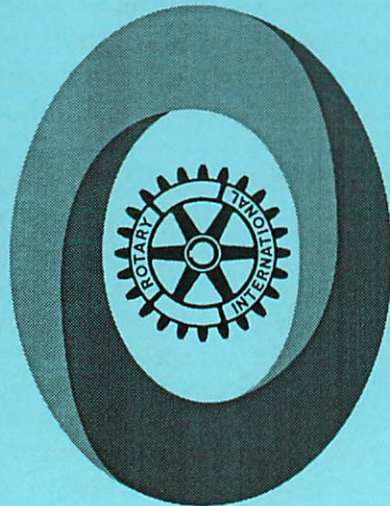

Austin Simms has served as executive director of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Housing Authority the past 23 years. He is responsible for the administration of some 3,000 units of housing for low-income residents in Lexington. Simms will be introduced as the Rotary speaker

Oct. 18 by Andrew Smith, program chair for October.

Simms was the recipient of a grant of \$19.3 million in "Hope VI" funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. These were to be used to revitalize the Charlotte Court public housing development. Lexington's recognition resulted from competition among more than 100 cities submitting applications for the Hope grant.

He is a driving force behind the changes in attitude in Lexington toward assisting low- to moderate-income residents of the community. Simms has stressed scattered site housing through construction and purchase of housing units all over town.

Simms is the immediate past president of the Southeastern Regional Council of the National

Association of Housing and Redevelopment Officials. He also is a licensed realtor who serves on a number of regional and national housing committees. In Lexington he serves on the Mayor's Criminal Justice Commission, St. Joseph Hospital Board, Lexington Chamber Board, United Way board.

He is married and has two grown sons.

This Week's Speaker

**Dr. Harold R. Benson, KSU Director of
Land Grants Program**

The program for the day was Dr. Harold R. Benson. Dr. Benson is the Director of the Land Grants Program at Kentucky State University and a member of the KSU Cooperative Extension Faculty. He spoke on aquaculture in Kentucky and why it's research and development is much needed. Dr. Benson stated that seafood is the fastest growing food activity in the world, and increases about 20 percent each year. He stated that Kentucky's intent is to assist farmers in being part of the future development of aquaculture. Kentucky is at a crossroads because there is a need for on-farm diversification to replace tobacco. Kentucky State University has a full-service Aquaculture Program which offers 10 major courses. Anyone interested in aquaculture may call their local County Extension Office, or visit Dr. Benson at Kentucky State University.

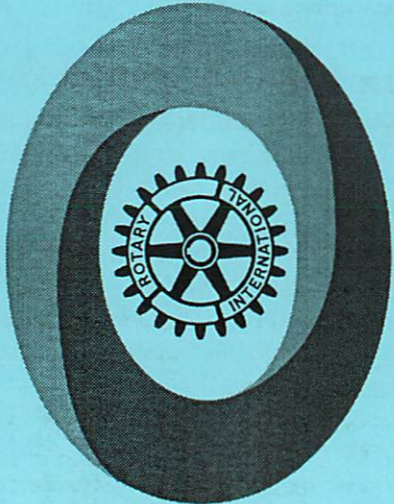

Under the direction of Mr. Simms, the Lexington-Fayette County Urban Housing Authority has changed that way of thinking over the past few years. He has been a major player, as well as the driving force, behind the development and upgrading of the low-income affordable housing in the Lexington-Fayette County area.

Today that housing authority is providing safe and affordable housing, not only to low- and moderate-income persons, but to persons with special needs. The new housing programs have eliminated the so-called slum and blight areas of Lexington, and made public improvements and neighborhood revitalization in low and moderate-income housing areas.

As Director, Mr. Simms states that his goal is to accommodate all low-income families in Lexington to have a better life, and to "just feel good about where they live."

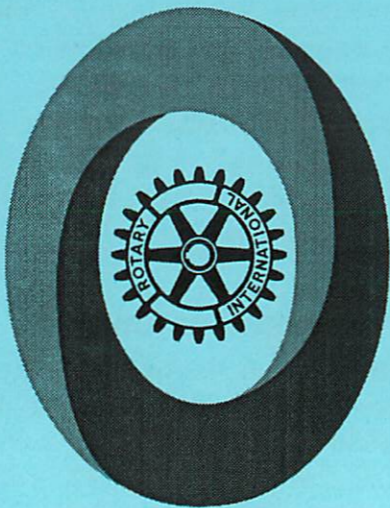

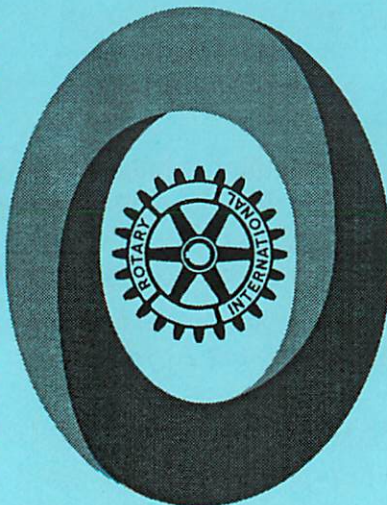
