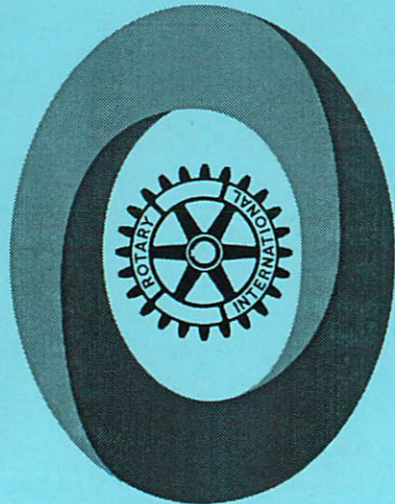

Mary King will furnish our program for September 20 as she recounts her experiences as a Rotary scholar. The Frankfort Rotary Club nominated Mary for consideration of this international scholarship. The Rotary Foundation awards over 1200 such scholarships annually to students

worldwide through nominations by local Districts. As one of our District 6710 Ambassadorial Scholarship recipients, she attended La Universidad Nacional de La Plata (The National University of La Plata) near Buenos Aires, Argentina. Mary studied International Relations at the university while in Argentina, but had many opportunities for travel and intense immersion in the culture of South America. Her experiences regarding participation in this program will be an incentive to encourage others to apply for the next round of these valuable scholarships that are currently worth up to \$25,000 for an academic year abroad.

Coming from a family of nine children, Mary Kathleen King is a graduate of Rock Island High School in Rock Island, Illinois. While there, Mary

was a Rotary Exchange high school student to Veracruz, Mexico where one of the highlights of her experience was to help administer polio vaccine under Rotary's Polioplus international program. A Magna Cum Laude graduate of Kentucky State University in Secondary English Education, she is currently teaching at Wilkinson Street School and active in the NEA and several scholastic clubs. Mary will continue her education to finish next year at the prestigious Patterson School of International Development. Fluent in Spanish, Mary also has spent a significant amount of time providing language interpretation for court systems throughout the area.

Susana Martins, whom Mary met as President of the Rotaract Club of La Plata (college-age clubs sponsored by a Rotary Club), and who is a journalism student at La Plata, will be in attendance with Mary. Susana and Mary became roommates and friends. Susana is visiting our country for a few months before returning to her native Argentina.

This Week's Speaker: Elaine Greer, Staff Chaplain

Certified Staff Chaplain Elaine Greer of Central Baptist Hospital gave insights on visiting a hospital. Things are changing as hospital rules become more flexible and less rigid. She has talked to many patients and offered advice on what patients want. Be sensitive to patient's dignity. Ask yourself why you are making this visit. When you just want to be some help this is a fine reason to visit.

*Always call first. Give the patient some control. Early evening is the best time.

*Look for signs on the door. Go to the nurse's desk first.

*Bring gifts but beware of bringing cut flowers that make an odor.

*When you knock, introduce yourself to give that patient some control. Beware: It is not always best to shake hands.

*15 minutes is a very long visit. Do not make the patient strain to see you and do not sit on the patient's bed.

*Keep your troubles to yourself and be a good listener. Patients enjoy visits most where they do most of the talking.

*Talk in a moderate tone of voice.

*Do not talk about patients when you are in the room with them.

*Do not follow physicians out of the room.

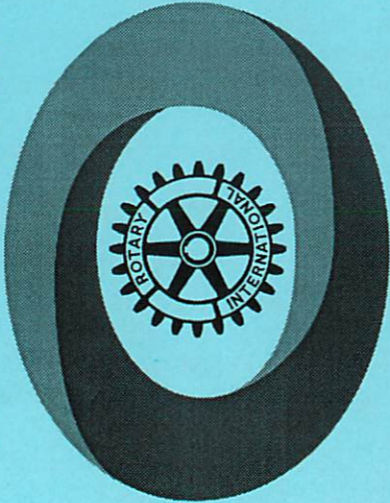

Gatewood Galbraith **Gubernatorial Candidate**



Gatewood Galbraith was born January 23, 1947 in Carlisle, Nicholas County, Ky. Divorced, with three daughters. Galbraith graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1974 and University of Kentucky Law School in 1977. He is a practicing attorney with law office in

Lexington, Kentucky concentrating in criminal defense and personal injury.

Mr. Galbraith ran in the Democratic Primaries for Commissioner of Agriculture in 1983 and for Governor in 1991 and 1995. He ran for Governor in the General Election in 1999 as the Reform Party Candidate, receiving 15.3% statewide and over 30% in the 6th Congressional District.

According to Mr. Galbraith, the top issues in this Congressional race are as follows: "The sovereignty of the United States of America. A 'New World Order' must not supplant the Constitution of the United States as our blueprint for government.

"Social Security and Medicare must be fully funded and can be if we spend our tax dollars in that direction instead of using them trying to play policemen to the rest of the world.

"Health Care must become affordable and we can

make progress in the direction if we take government and large corporations out of basic relationship between the patient and their doctor."
