Leonard Cox will speak to Frankfort Rotary Wednesday, April 11 at the Capital Plaza Holiday Inn, to be introduced by Vocational Service Director Don Dykman. Cox is a member of the Lexington Sunrise Rotary, where he has belonged since moving in 1997 from the traditional Lexington Rotary

Club, which he joined in 1965.

Cox will talk about his recent interest "in the challenges facing our high school seniors with respect to their continuing education and the competition in the job market." This has led to his spending much time working with the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS).

He is connected with his family business; the older Graves Cox in Lexington that was sold in 1969 to Genes Co, for which he continued as merchandise manager and on their national retail board until 1974. He started his own business, Leonard Cox Clothes, in 1975. Since 1991 he has

specialized in direct sales to the professional businessman. He now advises Dawahares on traditional business clothing.

Cox has served on the boards of the Rotary Club, YMCA, and Better Business Bureau, and Lexington Chamber of Commerce. He and his late wife, the former Lucia Bridgforth of Versailles, had a son and two daughters. He is a member of Christ Church Cathedral Episcopal Church where he has been a member of the vestry.

He is a graduate of the University of Virginia (1964) with a bachelors in geography and foreign affairs, and remains active in their alumni association. Cox also volunteers as a kicking coach for the Henry Clay High School football team.

#### This Week's Speakers: Amy Carman & John Lina

This week's guest speakers were Frankfort Rotarian Amy Carman and Louisville Rotarian John Lina. Amy and John gave a presentation on their Group Exchange Program Trip, which took them to Moldova-Romania. Since 1965, the Group Study Exchange Program has provided grants for countless teams of men and women in the early stages of their business and professional careers to travel abroad and share vocational information with the representatives of their respective professions in another country. Team members spend about six weeks studying the host country's institutions, economy, and culture, while observing how their own professions are practiced abroad.

Rotary districts select teams comprising four non-Rotarians and one Rotarian leader, engaged in different businesses and professions. While the team visited abroad, members followed a carefully planned itinerary, including visits to government and cultural institutions, schools, religious and historic sites and other points of interest.

Applicants must be between ages 25 - 40 and employed full-time, with a minimum of two years experience in a recognized business or profession. Individuals interested will go through an application and selection process.



#### This Week's Speaker: Leonard Cox

This week's guest speaker was Rotarian Leonard Cox from the Lexington Sunshine Club. Leonard spoke about the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS) and the challenges that high school seniors face today in the job market.

KCTCS was created by the Postsecondary Education Improvement Act of 1997. KCTCS blends tow education systems with long histories of service in Kentucky: 13 community colleges and 15 technical colleges. In this powerful new alliance, KCTCS provides accessible and affordable education and training in a two year program.

Leonard also explained the ACCESS Program, which is a partnership between the Kentucky Rotary Club's and the community and technical colleges. Each year a campus day for high school seniors is sponsored to local community colleges and technical schools. This is a great chance for Rotarians to promote educational and career opportunities, and to raise awareness of Rotary's commitment to community service. 
# (More)Answers to the Question: Why Join Rotary?



## Answers to the Question: Why Join Rotary?

- Friendship: In an increasingly complex world, Rotary provides one of the most basic human needs: the need for friendship and fellowship. It is one of two reasons why Rotary began in 1905.
- Business Development: The second original reason for Rotary's beginning is business development. Everyone needs to network. Rotary consists of a cross section of every business community. Its members come from all walks of life. Rotarians help each other and collectively help others.
- Personal Growth and Development: Membership in Rotary continues one's growth and education in human relations and personal development.
- Leadership Development: Rotary is an organization of leaders and successful people. Serving in Rotary positions is like a college education. Leadership: learning how to motivate, influence, and lead leaders.
- Citizenship in the Community: Membership in a Rotary club makes one a better community citizen. The average Rotary club consists of the most active citizens of any community.
- Continuing Education: Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed about what is going on in the community, nation, and world. Each meeting provides an opportunity to listen to different speakers and a variety of timely topics.
- Fun: Rotary is fun, a lot of fun. Each meeting is fun. The club projects are fun. Social activities are fun. The service is fun.
  - Public Speaking Skills: Many individuals

who joined Rotary were afraid to speak in public. Rotary develops confidence and skill in public communication and the opportunity to practice and perfect these skills.

- Citizenship in the World: Every Rotarian wears a pin that says "Rotary International." There are few places on the globe that do not have a Rotary club. Every Rotarian is welcome even encouraged to attend any of the 29,000 clubs in 194 nations and geographical regions. This means instant friends in both one's own community and in the world community.
- Assistance when Traveling: Because there are Rotary clubs everywhere, many a Rotarian in need of a doctor, lawyer, hotel, dentist, advice, etc., while traveling has found assistance through Rotary.

- Family Programs: Rotary provides one of the world's largest youth exchange programs; high school and college clubs for future Rotarians; opportunities for spouse involvement; and a host of activities designed to help family members in growth and the development of family values.

 Vocational Skills: Every Rotarian is expected to take part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation; to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation. Rotary helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher, etc.

• The Development of Éthics: Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test that governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical

in business and personal relationships.

• Cultural Awareness: Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color, and ethnic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background. Rotarians become aware of their cultures and learn to love and work with people everywhere. They become better citizens of their countries in the process.

• Prestige: Rotary members are prominent people: leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion, and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world. Its ranks include executives, managers, professionals - people who make decisions and influence policy.

• Nice People: Rotarians above all are nice people - the nicest people on the face of the earth. They are important people who follow the policy of it is nice to be important but it is important to be nice.

• The Absence of an "Official Creed": Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official creed, no secret meeting or rituals. It is an open society of men and women who simply believe in helping others.

• The Opportunity to Serve: Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind. Its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. This is perhaps the best reason for becoming a Rotarian: the chance to do something for somebody else and to sense the self-fulfillment that comes in the process and return of that satisfaction to one's own life. It is richly rewarding. "He profits most who serves best."
