This Week's Program: Club Assembly/Rotary Information

Speakers included: Dave Weller, PDG Len Shirrell, PDG Barry K. Holder, Pete Walsh, Ron Christopher, Tom Fugate, Christine Richards, Bobbye Brown, and Don Dykman. Dave Weller talked about new member recruitment, orientation, make-ups, and attendance. He noted that members must attend 60% of the time; however, 30% of this could be visiting other Rotary Clubs. He also noted that members have two weeks before and two weeks after the scheduled meeting to make-up. PDG Len Shirrell shared some of the changes made by RI's Council on Legislation 2000. Members can now transfer from one Rotary Club to another. Also, a club can now have five members with the same classification. Holder discussed the importance of supporting the Rotary Foundation which pays for programs around the world, such as Polio-plus, disaster relief, humanitarian programs, group study exchange (GSE), and the Ambassadorial Scholarship program. Treasurer Pete Walsh distributed the end-of-fiscal-year financial statement and the draft budget for the new year, and discussed sources of revenues and expenditures. President-elect Ron Christopher discussed the membership goal of two new members per month, with a net gain of ten new members for the year. The Directors of each of the Avenues of Service shared some of their goals and projects for the current year and asked for suggestions for other projects. A feedback form was provided for the recording of comments, suggestion, and questions from the membership.



Rotarian John Sower, a former Frankfort mayor, will speak to the Rotary Club of Frankfort Wednesday noon, Aug. 15, at the Holiday Inn. Sower is the president of Citizens for Open Government (COG), a newlyformed organization which focuses on open meetings, open records and full disclosure.

COG encourages civic involvement in the democratic process. Sower will be introduced by the August Rotary Club program chair, Sallie Clay Lanham.

John Sower is a 31-year member of the Frankfort Rotary Club and a Frankfort businessman, who grew up a few blocks away from the location of his Frankfort business. He is the owner and manager of Sower Office Supplies, located across from the Franklin County Courthouse. He has lived most of his life in Frankfort, prior to acquiring a farm in Shelby County a few years ago.

John was elected mayor of Frankfort in 1979. Prior to his election as mayor, he was elected and served as city commissioner. During his administration, he was instrumental in obtaining funds for the restoration of the Southern Hotel, in the

issuance of \$25 million in industrial revenue bonds for business expansion and building restoration, in the purchase and restoration of the Gooch House for tourism, in the substantial rehabilitation of city housing projects, and in moving Congress toward making an allocation for the floodwall now protecting South Frankfort.

In addition to COG, Rotary and public office, Sower's record of public service includes various offices with the Frankfort Jaycees, Bureau of Volunteer Services, Chamber of Commerce, Emergency Food Pantry, YMCA, Capital Area Right to Life, Boy Scouts, and Church of the Annunciation (Shelbyville).

John and his wife, Phyllis, who is a Frankfort attorney, have three sons: Johnny (age 20), Tom (age 14) and Will (age 11).

This Week's Program: John E. Hornback

This week's guest speaker was John. E. Hornback, introduced by August program chair Sallie Clay Lanham. John is the Director of the Division of Air Quality, in the Cabinet for Natural Resources and Public Protection.

John spoke today on the structure and mission of the Division of Air Quality. The primary responsibility of the division is enforcing state and federal standards in the Commonwealth, with the goal of protecting public health and welfare. To achieve this goal, the division operates a multi-faceted program with staff performing separate interrelated tasks. The Division of Air Quality is organized as follows: The Director's Office, Enforcement Branch, Field Operations Branch, Permit Review Branch, Special Programs Branch, Technical Services Branch, and the Planning/Administration Branch.

With many regulatory requirements, John stated that their main concern is to handle complaints, enforcement of regulations, control open burning, permitting, and education of the public. The Division of Air Quality states that to keep the environment safe we must remember the three 'don'ts': Don't dump illegally; don't burn illegally; and don't discharge waste illegally. We want to thank John for a very informative presentation.


Board Action Taken



Introducing the program will be Rotarian Sallie Clay Lanham, program chair for August and who also is the Frankfort club's Environmental Committee chair (below, right).





The panelists for Aug. 22 are: Mark Barrett, solid waste coordinator for Franklin County; Jeff Hackbart (above, left), Public Works director for the city; Larry Hook, general manager, BFI-Lexington; Rudy Davidson, Louisville Public Works, and Jill Robinson, Franklin County's First District Magistrate, and a representative of the Environmental Technology Task Force.

Buying product made from recycled materials helps create and maintain demand for these products. The following are six reasons to buy recycled products:

. We conserve land and reduce the need to drill for oil and dig for minerals by making products from recycled instead of virgin materials.

2. Making products from recycled content usually requires less energy. For example, recycled aluminum takes 95 percent less energy than new aluminum made from bauxite ore.

3. In most cases, constructing products from recycled materials creates less air and water pollution than making products from virgin materials.

4. You save landfill space because the items you recycle don't go into a landfill or incinerator.

5. Recycling often is the least expensive waste management method for cities and towns.

6. It also creates jobs and saves money. The recycling process creates far more jobs than those produced at landfills or incinerators.



- Vocational Skills: Every Rotarian is expected to take part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation; to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation. Rotary helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher, etc.
- The Development of Ethics: Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test that governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical in business and personal relationships.
- Cultural Awareness: Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color, and ethnic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background. Rotarians become aware of their cultures and learn to love and work with people everywhere. They become better citizens of their countries in the process.
- Prestige: Rotary members are prominent people: leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion, and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world. Its ranks include executives, managers, professionals people who make decisions and influence policy.
- Nice People: Rotarians above all are nice people the nicest people on the face of the earth. They are important people who follow the policy of it is nice to be important but it is important to be nice.
- The Absence of an "Official Creed": Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official creed, no secret meeting or rituals. It is an open society of men and women who simply believe in helping others.
- The Opportunity to Serve: Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind. Its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. This is perhaps the best reason for becoming a Rotarian: the chance to do something for somebody else and to sense the self-fulfillment that comes in the process and return of that satisfaction to one's own life. It is richly rewarding. "He profits most who serves best."
