Speech Contest Scheduled Feb. 14

The local competition for the District 6710 speech contest will be the club program for Feb. 14. Chair of the speech contest event is Rotarian Chuck Ellestad. The function is a part of the Avenue of Vocational Service headed by Don Dykman.

This year's speech contest topic is the Rotary International theme, "Rotary 2001—Create Awareness, Take Action." Each contestant will be judged on the delivery (without notes) of a speech, of his or her own composition, from 5-8 minutes in length. Each speech will be rated by judges chosen from the members of our club on the basis of delivery, originality and content.

There are three young persons entered, one from each high school in Franklin County: Erik Garrison from Frankfort High, Anne Raff from Franklin County, and Ryan Grogan from Western Hills, all of whom are excellent students.

The winner of the local contest will receive a \$100 Savings Bond, and will qualify to participate in the area run-off scheduled for the following evening, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Springfield, Ky.

This year's local judges will be Don Armstrong, Bobbye Brown and Richard Taylor, with Sara Dent serving as alternate. Volunteer tellers and timekeepers will also be needed, so Rotarians who can "add" and "keep time" may be asked to help.

In addition, Ellestad says he hopes members will be available to provide transportation for these students to and from the meeting. If you can help please call Chuck Ellestad at one of the following numbers, 223-0557 (w) or 695-7024 (h).

Rotarians are asked to be aware of the requirement to keep to a fairly tight time schedule in the contest, to allow enough time for these presentations, and to be fair to all contestants. Any Rotarian who must arrive late, or must leave early, is asked to take special care to be as quiet and courteous as possible.

These Week's Speaker: Jody A. Lassiter

Today's guest speaker was Jody Lassiter, Commissioner of the Department of Local Government (DLG) in the office of Governor Paul Patton.

Jody is a 32-year-old native of Alamo, KY, and is the youngest commissioner to ever hold that office. Commissioner Lassiter spoke today on the composition and responsibilities of the Department of Local Government.

The mission of DLG is to provide services and technical assistance to local government within the Commonwealth. The department offers assistance in obtaining federal and state monies for the funding of various projects. These projects provide for construction and improvement of lowincome housing, recreational facilities, public facilities and economic development.

The Department of Local Government is made up of four divisions: Support Services, Training and ADD Services, Community Development, and Financial Services.

Jody said that it is a real honor to serve Kentuckians as the Commissioner of DLG, and to be able to partner state government with the local communities. He is looking forward to serving local communities and to bridge the gap between local government and the new economy. He wants to enhance the quality of life in Kentucky and to promote community development. Jody stressed the importance of citizens communicating with their local officials, and to be a part of the community. He stated that citizens should always let local leaders know what they want.

"Man and Modern Media"

Frank Ashley, former press secretary to two governors and former Courier-Journal reporter and editor, will be the 11:45 a.m. luncheon speaker on March 7 at Frankfort Rotary Club at the Holiday Inn. He will be introduced by Christine Richards.

Ashley, who now heads his own communications company, Ashley Media Company/AMC, has been involved in media relations in one way or another since coming to Frankfort as part of the Gov. Breathitt Administration upon graduating from Western Kentucky University in1965.

Many of you may remember him as a young reporter for the Frankfort State Journal back in 1967-68. In 1969, he moved to the Courier-Journal in Louisville where he covered state and local government and rose to become political editor, with his own political column. In 1980, he became press secretary for Gov. John Y. Brown, Jr., but left that job after two years to become head of worldwide communications for the late Dr. Armand Hammer, chairman of Occidental Petroleum Corporation in Los Angeles.

From Los Angeles, he covered the world, traveling extensively and continuously to China, Russia, the Middle East and South America. Finally, in 1990 he came home, once again to be the governor's press secretary to Gov. Brereton Iones

He headed public affairs for the state's two largest advertising agencies before founding his own company. He specialized in corporate and crisis communications, and because of his extensive background and unique experiences, is considered one of the nation's top experts on his subject today, "Man and Modern Media."


