Next Week's Program...



Dr. Kern Alexander, president of Murray State University, will be introduced Wednesday, Jan. 17, by Ron Christopher, Director of Club Service, who has the programs for January. Alexander became the ninth president of Murray State on July 1, 1994.

Alexander has pledged to lead Murray State to serve the region in rais-

ing the standard of living, introducing more advanced learning, instilling moral and ethical standards of justice and fairness, and more effectively applying research and knowledge to industry and agriculture. He served as university distinguished professor at Virginia Tech prior to coming to Murray State.

Born in Marrowbone, KY on June 30, 1939, Alexander is the son of two educators. He completed his baccalaureate degree in English and history at Centre College, and earned a master's degree in education at

Western Kentucky. He went on to earn the doctorate in educational administration from Indiana University. He received a graduate diploma in education administration "with distinction" from Oxford University.

Alexander, 55, began his teaching career at Fairdale High School in Jefferson County in 1962. He also taught at Valley High School in Louisville from 1963-64. In 1964, he joined the Kentucky Department of Education, assisting local school districts with fiscal planning and later became director of the division of statistical services and legislative liaison.

As his career advanced, Alexander worked with the U.S. Office of Education, served on the faculty of the University of Florida from 1968 to 1985, and served as director of the Institute for Educational Finance at the University of Florida from 1972 to 1982. From 1982-85 he served as education policy coordinator for Florida Gov. Robert Graham and was responsible of planning and budgeting for the university system, community colleges and public schools. He was president of Western Kentucky University from 1985-88.

A prolific writer and editor, he has authored more than 30 books, journal articles and chapters in other texts. Alexander is married to Elizabeth Alexander, M.D., a pediatrician.

This Week's Speaker: President Bill Miller

We were honored this week by having our own President Bill Miller of Frankfort Rotary Club as our guest speaker. President Bill gave an excellent presentation and slide show on his most recent trip to Cuba. While visiting Cuba, Bill represented the People to People (PTP) Ambassadors Program and the American Society for Public Administrators (ASPA). This was the first delegation of public administrators to visit Cuba.

President Bill commented that despite the best efforts of the power to its north, the sun still shines on Cuba. It's the Caribbean's largest commercialized island and on the world's last bastions of communism. The island's relative political isolation has prevented it from being overrun by tourists, and locals are sincerely friendly to those who do

venture in. The state plays the primary role in the economy and controls practically all foreign trade.

Although you can't quite hear the colonial architecture peeling in the streets, even Cuba's larger towns, such as Havana, are pretty relaxed. There are not many automobiles touring the streets and the ones you do see are probably classified as classics.

Major industries in Cuba are sugar, tobacco, and tourism. The average person will only make about \$10 to \$15 per month. Bill stated that if you are lucky enough to work in the tourist industry or in a cigar factory you could make as much as \$25 per month. President Bill summarized his trip to Cuba by saying, "It is like stepping back in time."

We thank you, President Bill Miller, for such a delightful experience and sharing it with us.



This Week's Speaker: Dr. Kern Alexander

Today's guest speaker was Dr. Kern Alexander, president of Murray State University. As he spoke about the university Dr. Alexander pledged to lead Murray State to serve the region in a better way for the future.

For three-quarters of a century Murray State University has served students from near and far. Today the school has grown from 202 students when founded in 1922 to over 9,000. US News consistently ranks Murray State among the leading universities in the South, and Barron's college guide lists MSU as "very competitive."

Murray State is located in western Kentucky

and features five academic colleges - Business and Public Affairs; Education; Health Science and Human Services; Humanities and Fine Arts; and Science, Engineering and Technology - as well as a School of Agriculture.

Dr. Alexander stated that Murray State is one of the few schools that have adopted the residential college program. Residential college is a small, faculty led community of students where there is incredible opportunity for personal growth and educational development.

\$100,000 of Rotary Scholarships Available Locally

The Frankfort Rotary club is seeking applicants for the highly regarded Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship. Four scholarships worth up to \$25,000 each are to be awarded. The scholarship includes travel expenses for nine months of study outside the United States during the 2002-2003 academic-year. Between the Frankfort Rotary Club and the Capital City Rotary Club, eight applicants may be nominated. Appli-

cants need to either have legal residence or attend college in Rotary District 6710 that encompasses the western half of Kentucky including Frankfort. Many other Rotary Districts throughout the world are vying for over 1200 scholarships worldwide. Other Rotary clubs and Districts may be operating with slightly different time lines.

In addition to academic studies, scholars are expected to perform as special "ambassadors of goodwill." They will make presentations before Rotary Clubs, Rotary District meetings, schools, civic organizations, and other forums in both their home country and in the study country hosting them. Leadership skills and the potential to be an effective leader are essential qualities for Ambassadorial Scholars. Scholars may not be assigned to areas of a country where they have already lived or studied except in unusual circumstances. The Rotary Foundation Scholarship is designed to promote international understanding.

The Frankfort Rotary Club will receive applications until March 20, 2001. Personal counseling for serious applicants is available. The top four applications from each club will be submitted to the Rotary District Subcommittee. The Subcommittee will conduct mandatory personal interviews with all applicants on Saturday, May 19, 2001 in Paducah, KY. Immediately after that date, four applicants from District 6710 will be notified of their nomination. Formal announcement of the scholarship awards are made by the Rotary Foundation Trustees of Rotary International in Evanston, Illinois prior to December 2001.

Outstanding applicants need make immediate contact for more information and application forms with Dean Sorg at his office (502) 227-4521 or by e-mail at DeanSorg@aol.com. Rotarians and their families are not eligible. Applicants must complete two years of college course work prior to 2002 (or have a secondary school education with two years employment).



Don Mills, former editor of the Lexington Herald and Sunday Herald-Leader, will be the luncheon speaker at Frankfort Rotary Club Jan. 31 at the Holiday Inn. He will be introduced by the program chair for January, Club Service Director Ron Christopher.

Mills, who just visited China in November, will speak on "China's Potential for Change." It was his sixth trip to China since 1978, when he went there as a newspaperman along with some other Kentuckians. He will discuss advances in technology, the World Trade Organization and their impact on China.

Mills is a Rotary Foundation Fellow, having won the scholarship in 1960 to study at Edinburgh University in Scotland after graduating with a journalism degree from the University of Kentucky. He was nominated for the award by the club from Clinton where he grew up.

Mills left state government in December after

serving some 16 years. He was press secretary to Gov. Ned Breathitt, chief of staff to Gov. John Y. Brown, executive director of the Kentucky Public Service Commission and a director in the Kentucky Department of Financial Institutions. Mills served 12 years as editor of the Lexington newspapers.

While working for the Public Service Commission, Mills visited Russia, Armenia, Brazil and Portugal at the expense of the U. S. State Department to talk about utility rates and services as those countries privatized their utilities during the last decade. Mills, a resident of Lexington, is a former member of the Lexington Rotary Club.

This Week's Speaker: Mayor Dave Armstrong

Today's guest speaker was Mayor Dave Armstrong of Louisville. Mayor Armstrong was elected mayor of Louisville in November 1998, with more than 75% of the vote.

Mayor Armstrong spoke about the growth and economy of Louisville, and his insight for keeping it the number one city in the state. He has pledged to call out for people to "come to the city" to live, to work, for recreation, and for entertainment. He believes people are anxious to return to an urban way of life and is designing programs and policies to strengthen the city's neighborhoods and boost job creation and housing in the community's urban core.

Another key component of his economic development strategy is to redevelop the city's brownfields and free-up much-needed land for job creation. The mayor is also a strong advocate for connecting the city's schools to its neighborhoods and developing programs to ensure Louisville is a national leader in workforce development.

Mayor Armstrong stated that he has worked hard for many years to see the city and county government's merge. He said that merging would maximize opportunities and that the city would be better able to serve the citizens at a higher level.

A 32-year-old native of Alamo in Calloway County, KY, Jody Lassiter is an attorney currently serving as the Commissioner of the Department for Local Government (DLG) in the office of Governor Paul Patton. He will be the luncheon speaker at Frankfort Rotary Club Feb. 7 at the Holiday Inn. He

will be introduced by Club Service Director Ron Christopher.

Before his appointment as Commissioner, Lassiter served in the Governor's Office of Constituent Services, first as the Western Kentucky Liaison and then as the Director of Constituent Services. In his role as Western Kentucky Liaison he was the Governor's adviser on affairs affecting the 27 western-most Kentucky counties. As director, he coordinated the efforts of Governor Patton's constituent liaisons to all 120 counties in Kentucky and to the members of the Governor's Executive Cabinet in Frankfort.

Prior to his service in the Governor's Office, Lassiter was staff attorney for Kentucky Court of Appeals judge Rick Johnson in Mayfield, then general counsel/hearing officer for the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals in Frankfort. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree with a double major in political science and history from the University of Mississippi in 1991, graduating magna cum laude. He subsequently received his juris doctor degree from the University of Louisville School of Law in 1994. Lassiter currently resides in Shelbyville with his wife Kelley and their son, Jacob.

This Week's Speaker: Don Mills

Today's guest speaker was Don Mills, former editor of the Lexington Herald-Leader. Don returned from a visit to China in November, and spoke today on "China's Potential Change."

Prior to 1979, China maintained a centrally planned economy. A large share of the country's economic output was directed and controlled by the state, which set production goals, controlled prices, and allocated resources.

Since the initiation of economic reforms in 1979, China has become one of the world's fastest growing economies. During the '90s China's economy maintained rapid growth while inflation steadily declined.

Today, China's economy benefits by world trade. It has an export business of \$249 billion per year; while its import trading exceeds \$225 billion annually. China's top trading partners are Japan, Europe, and the United States.

Don stated that while China's political approach has not changed, the economy continues to march forward. In China, you still do not challenge the "Communist Rule."


