**Ed Hatchett, Auditor of Public Accounts**



Times have changed, and so have the techniques necessary to operate the state Auditor's office. Learn more about what it takes to properly protect the public's financial resources when Kentucky's Auditor of Public Accounts, Ed Hatchett, tells us why "It's Not Your Father's Audit Anymore"

during our June 13th Rotary Club meeting.

In 1999, Hatchett became the first Auditor of Public Accounts in Kentucky history to run unopposed for, and be elected to, a second consecutive term of office. During his tenure, he has gained a reputation for independence, for challenging the status quo, and for using state-of-the-art technology to protect taxpayers' money. Hatchett has initiated performance audits that have found \$231 million in savings and missed opportunities in such areas as tax collection, Medicaid, state investments, school districts, and public universities.

A native of Barren County, Hatchett is a graduate of Centre College and received his law degree from the University of Louisville School of Law.

He was a lawyer and a trust and investments manager in Glasgow before twice being appointed to serve as the state's Banking Commissioner. He and his wife, Dr. Judith Hatchett, Chair of the Arts and Humanities Program at Midway College, live in Frankfort. They have two daughters in college and a son at home. Hatchett is a member of the Frankfort Rotary Club.

Karen Schneider, Director of the Frankfort Career and Technical Center, which assists high school students in their preparation to attend and technical schools, presented an informative program on the exciting opportunities provided young people in the field of technical training. Schneider is a graduate of Franklin County High School. She received a Bachelor's Degree, a Master's Degree, and Rank One Certification from the University of Kentucky. She taught business education in Bourbon County High School for four years.

The Frankfort Career and Technical Center expects to have over 700 students next year and five new programs. There will be an emphasis on computer training in hardware and software, in addition to health services. These new programs will provide a solid preparation with more traditional technical training for a new generation of students.

Also on the program, Joe Yancey, welding and technical instructor, gave a spirited description of the history of technical training in Franklin County. Two students of the Frankfort Career and Technical Center, Connie Railey and Josh Perkins, spoke about their positive experiences as participants in the Center's programs.

• \$500 Cash Scholarship to the outstanding student at any one of our local high schools planning to attend Kentucky State University. This money is matched by Kentucky State University.

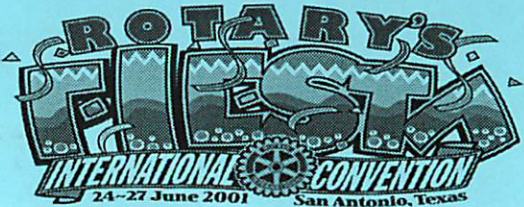
• \$500 Cash Scholarship to the outstanding student at any one of our local high schools planning to enroll in a Vo-Tech or Business School.

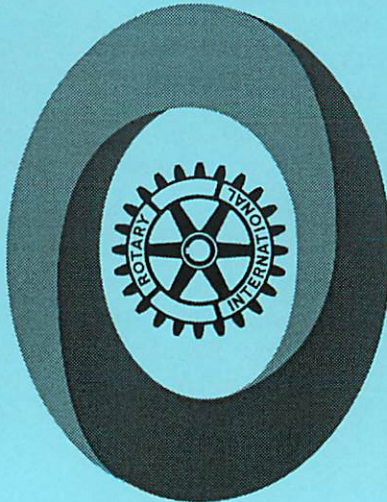

### **This week's speaker: Ed Hatchett**

Ed Hatchett, Kentucky Auditor of Public Accounts presented an informative program on "Why state audits are not your father's audits anymore." Ed stated that times have changed with the technology of the intranet. With the State having so many websites that are available to the public, it presents an enormous problem trying to keep confidential information from being accessed.

Ed jokingly stated that he is the state's cage rattler, and in his position he has the opportunity to irritate many people in so little time. He said, "I am the Rodney Dangerfield of State Government."

In his audits of government agencies and public education, Ed has centered on sound business practices, and demands effective cash, funding, and investment management. He has referred over 130 audits to law enforcement entities, ethic boards, or other regulatory agencies for further investigation or prosecution.

Ed Hatchett takes his job seriously, and stated that he takes his strengths from the encouragement of the Kentucky citizens. He invites all citizens to keep the pressure on his office to keep Kentucky information safe and secure.

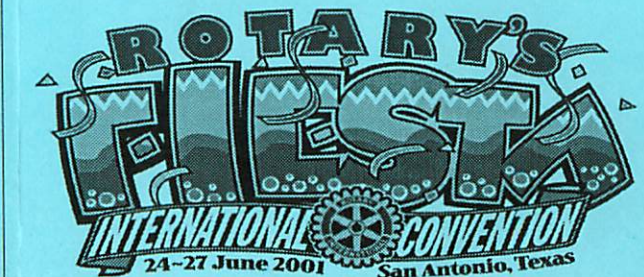

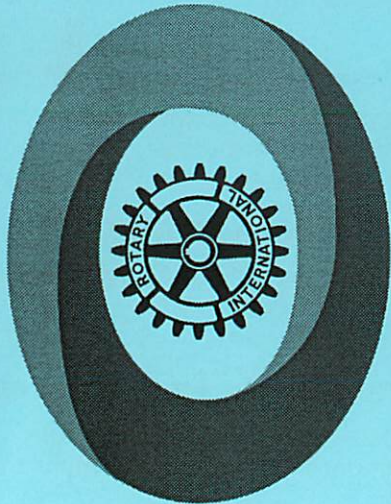

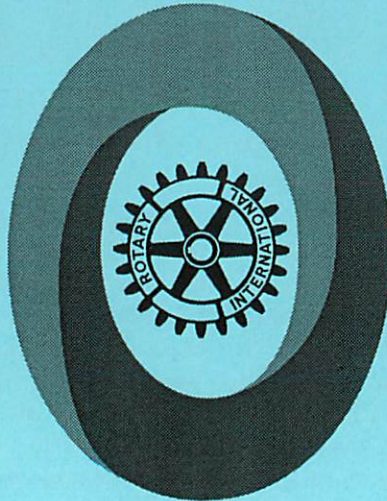

**Answers to the Question:  
Why Join Rotary?**

• **Continuing Education:** Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed about what is going on in the community, nation, and world. Each meeting provides an opportunity to listen to different speakers and a variety of timely topics.

• **Fun:** Rotary is fun, a lot of fun. Each meeting is fun. The club projects are fun. Social activities are fun. The service is fun.

• **Public Speaking Skills:** Many individuals who joined Rotary were afraid to speak in public. Rotary develops confidence and skill in public communication and the opportunity to practice and perfect these skills.

• **Entertainment:** Every Rotary club and district has parties and activities that provide diversion in one's business life. Rotary holds conferences, conventions, assemblies, and institutes that provide entertainment in addition to Rotary information, education, and service.

• **The Development of Social Skills:** Every week

and at various events and functions, Rotary develops one's personality, social skills and people skills. Rotary is for people who like people.

• **Family Programs:** Rotary provides one of the world's largest youth exchange programs; high school and college clubs for future Rotarians; opportunities for spouse involvement; and a host of activities designed to help family members in growth and the development of family values.

• **Vocational Skills:** Every Rotarian is expected to take part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation; to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation. Rotary helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher, etc.

• **The Development of Ethics:** Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test that governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical in business and personal relationships.

• **Cultural Awareness:** Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color, and ethnic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background. Rotarians become aware of their cultures and learn to love and work with people everywhere. They become better citizens of their countries in the process.

• **Prestige:** Rotary members are prominent people: leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion, and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world. Its ranks include executives, managers, professionals - people who make decisions and influence policy.

• **Nice People:** Rotarians above all are nice people - the nicest people on the face of the earth. They are important people who follow the policy of it is nice to be important but it is important to be nice.

• **The Absence of an "Official Creed":** Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official creed, no secret meeting or rituals. It is an open society of men and women who simply believe in helping others.

• **The Opportunity to Serve:** Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind. Its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. This is perhaps the best reason for becoming a Rotarian: the chance to do something for somebody else and to sense the self-fulfillment that comes in the process and return of that satisfaction to one's own life. It is richly rewarding. "He profits most who serves best."
