Next Week's Program...



"Eleanor Roosevelt" will be making a preview personal appearance at the Rotary Club Wednesday, March 14. The Frankfort Arts Foundation is presenting this Friday, March 16th "Meet Eleanor Roosevelt," which stars Elena Dodd. She will be introduced by Rotarian Christine Richards

when Rotary meets at the Holiday Inn at 11:45 a.m.

"Meet Eleanor Roosevelt" is a 3-part historical portrait, presenting the former First Lady and United Nations delegate in the format of a lecture tour, in a personal, informal style. This performance will feature Part III, "Private Citizen and First Lady of the World." The one-woman show, directed by Josephine Lane of Bookline, Mass., and performed by Miss Dodd of Westminster West, Vermont, is co-authored by Lane and Dodd.

"Meet Eleanor Roosevelt: Private Citizen and First Lady of the World," covers Eleanor's experience in the years after Franklin Roosevelt's death — the grief and loneliness as well as the challenges and opportunities. She looks back on a rich life as journalist, world traveler, chair of the United Nations Commission on Human Rights and Advisor to the Democratic Party.

Actress Elena Dodd worked with People's Theatre of Cambridge, Mass., CityStage and New African Company in Boston and Whetstone Theatre Company of Brattelboro, Vermont. She is a member of The Streetfeet Women, a Boston-based company of writers and performers.

Lane Dodd's script is based on Eleanor Roosevelt's Autobiography, works by Joseph Lash and research at the Roosevelt estate in Hyde Park, New York. Development of the piece was supported in part by the American Association of University Women and the Polaroid Foundation.

This Week's Speaker: Frank Ashley

This week's guest speaker was Frank Ashley, former press secretary to two governors and former reporter/editor for the Courier-Journal and a reporter for Frankfort's own State Journal in the late '60s. Frank currently owns his own communications company, Ashley Media Company/AMC, and talked today on "Man and Modern Media."

Frank stressed the importance of the media and what a key part it plays in our lives today. Statistics show that in Kentuckians get 41% of the news from television, 36% from newspapers, and only 2% from radio. He stated that today 62% of all Kentuckians have cable TV.

He stated that some people often have bad experiences with the media. This could mean that you could be in the wrong place at the wrong time. Frank said that the media spends too much time on gossip and trivia, when they really should stick to the facts of life.

In the future if you have a media interview always remember to take control of the story, think before you speak, and don't shoot from the hip. Remember every story has a life of it's own and the media has plenty of power. The best precaution you can take in an interview is to set the limitations up front.



John D. Stempel will be the program speaker at the Frankfort Rotary Club on Wednesday, March 21, to be introduced by Christine Richards, who is March program chair. His subject is "Globalization: Good or Bad."

Dr. Stempel became director of the University of

Kentucky's Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce in July, 1993. He served as associate director 1988-1993, coming to U.K. following a 24-year career in the U.S. Foreign Service. Focusing on political and economic affairs, he had overseas assignments in Africa, Iran, and India, concluding with three years as U.S. Consul General in Madras, where he quadrupled U.S. commercial collaboration with South India. His Middle East service (1975-79) in Tehran provided much of the material for his book, *Inside the Iranian Revolution*.

His Washington assignments featured duty for both the State and Defense Departments, including a two-year tour as director of the State Department's Crisis Center. He had teaching stints at George Washington and American Universities, plus two years as "diplomat in residence" at the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis. He is a member of the New York Council on Foreign Relations.

Dr. Stempel holds the AB from Princeton, and the MA and Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley. Married to the former Susan Hodgetts of Lexington, the Stempels have three daughters, Amy, Alix and Jill.



Gary W. Brown will be the speaker at Frankfort Rotary on Wednesday, March 28, and will be introduced by Past President Polly Green. His topic will be "Weaving the Fabric of America: Lest We Forget," which will focus on the

Underground Railroad Movement. He and his wife, Wanda P. Brown, are founders of a not-for-profit organization called Ancestral Ambassadors and have a large collection of artifacts related to the Black experience in America, some of which will be on display as you enter the meeting room. Please enjoy looking at these artifacts before and/or after the business and program part of the meeting.

The presentation will consist of audio-visual materials on exhibit and is designed to present "a more inclusive view of history." Gary and Wanda are direct descendants of African-American men who served during the Civil War as members of what was then called "U.S. Colored Troops" or USCT. Brown is very much aware that most Americans have no knowledge of their general contributions to the Union

cause during the conflict.

Gary Brown was born in Lawrenceburg. He attended elementary school in there, however due to segregation at that time, he attended high school at Lincoln Institute at Lincoln Ridge, near Simpsonville (Shelby County) where he was graduated with honors.

After high school he graduated from United Electronics Institute with a certification as an electronic technician. American Telephone and Telegraph in Memphis, Tennessee hired him as a toll test board technician immediately after graduation. A year after he was employed, with the Vietnam War raging, he received his draft notice, which motivated him to enlist in the U.S. Navy, which offered him further electronic training.

Gary then returned to Kentucky and was employed by IBM as a customer engineer in Lexington. He recently retired from IBM after 30 years. In his last position at an IBM subsidiary, he was vice president of operations.

Gary has served as an elected official as a city councilman in Lawrenceburg. He is an ordained deacon in the Baptist Church. He graduated from Mercy College in Dobbs Ferry, NY, with a bachelor's degree in business administration and attended the executive NMA program at Columbia University in New York City. In addition to the corporate recognition he has received, he has been recognized by various community organizations for volunteer service in public schools, literacy, Christian education and job creation programs.

Now retired, he started his own business in January 1999, Braun Home Automation Services. He and Wanda now reside in Woodford County. They have a son Derek in Chicago and a daughter Farah in Lexington.

This Week's Speaker: Dr. John Stempel

This week's guest speaker was Dr. John Stempel, director of University of Kentucky's Patterson School of Diplomacy and International Commerce.

Dr. Stempel stated that today's era of globalization, which replaces the Cold War, is a similar international system, with its own unique attributes. It is not static, but a dynamic ongoing process: globalization involves the inexorable integration of markets, nation-states, and technologies to a degree never witnessed before, in a way that is enabling individuals, corporations, and nation-states to reach around the world farther, deeper, and cheaper than ever before.

Today globalization has its own defining technologies: computerization, miniaturization, digitization, satellite communications, fiber optics and the Internet. Some of the globalization problem areas in

the future are the world's population growth, the shortage of water in the Middle East, and the lack of resources. Dr. Stempel said that his meaning of economics is that, "there is no such thing as a free lunch."

Dutch Team Visits Here April 16-19

Local Students Tour Tech College

Responding to a vocational service project generated several months ago by a member of the Lexington Sunrise Rotary Club, 35 students from Frankfort visited the Central Kentucky Technical College at Lexington Tuesday, Feb. 27, on a field trip sponsored by the Frankfort Rotary Club.

The delegation was led by Rotarian Sherrill G. Smith, who doubled as tour guide and bus driver. On the trip were 20 students from Frankfort High and 15 from Western Hills, the first ever trip to take local students to an introductory visit to a vocational/technical institution. Smith is a past president of Frankfort Rotary who works for the Frankfort Independent School District.

Adding an important dimension to the tour were High School Counselors Joretta Mayes, Frankfort High, and Greg Roush, Western Hills High, who also went along. The counselors had preselected their students interested in pursuing vocational-technical education.

Rotarian Len Cox of the Lexington Sunrise Club coordinated the trip. Students were initially separated into "groups of interest" such as electronics, electricity, HVAC, welding, etc., who then shadowed teachers which specialize in those areas.

After a pizza lunch the Frankfort/Franklin County students then had a conducted tour of the extensive Central Kentucky campus facility. Sherrill Smith reported the students really appreciated the trip and called the venture a "huge success." Vocational Service Don Dykman, who had coordinated with Club President Bill Miller, guided the whole idea.



This Week's Speaker: Gary Brown

This week's guest speaker was Gary W. Brown. Gary's topic today was "Weaving the Fabric of America; Lest We Forget," focusing on the Underground Railroad Movement during slavery in America.

The Underground Railroad was neither "underground" nor a railroad, but was a loose network of aid and assistance to fugitives from bondage. Perhaps as many as one hundred thousand enslaved persons may have escaped in the years between the American Revolution and the Civil War.

Gary stated that the Underground Railroad was perhaps the most dramatic protest action against slavery in U.S. History. It was a clandestine operation that began during the colonial period, later became part of organized abolitionist activity in the 19th century, and reached its peak in the period 1830-1865. The story of the Underground Railroad is one of individual sacrifice and heroism in the

efforts of enslaved people to reach freedom from bondage. We thank Gary for his in-depth research and taking the time to share it with us.
