Brigadier General D. Allen Youngman was appointed as the 50th Adjutant General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky by Governor Paul E. Patton on August 10, 2001, and will be the speaker at the Frankfort Rotary Club meeting on Nov. 14.

He was born in Owensboro, Kentucky on August 18, 1947

and was commissioned through Infantry Officer Candidate School on April 16, 1970. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from the University of Kentucky and a Juris Doctor from the University of Kentucky College of Law. His military education includes the Special Forces Officer Course, Infantry Officer Advanced Course, Command and General Staff College, and the Army War College. Significant active duty assignments included tours with: the 8th Special Forces Group (Airborne); the Military Assistance Command, Viet Nam; and the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault).

After leaving active duty, he served in various Special Operations assignments in the United States Army Reserve (USAR) prior to joining the

Kentucky Army National Guard and transferring to Armor Branch. Significant Army National Guard assignments have included: Commander, Troop A, 240th Cavalry; Commander, 2nd Battalion, 123d Armor; and Commander, 149th Armor Brigade, 35th Infantry Division (Mechanized), Other assignments have included: Chief, Unit Training Branch, National Guard Bureau; Chief, Research and Staff Support Group, Office of the Director, Army National Guard; and Special Assistant to the Director, Army National Guard. In 1997, he was selected to represent the Reserve Components on the staff of the National Defense Panel and, from 1998 to 1999, he served in the Office of the Assistants to the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff, for National Guard and Reserve Matters. On August 1, 2000 he was appointed as the Deputy Commander, Kentucky State Area Command (STARC). His most recent assignment prior to assuming his duties with Headquarters, Kentucky Army National Guard, was as the Special Assistant to the Commanding General, United States Army Armor Center, Fort Knox, Kentucky.

His awards include the Silver Star, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with Oak Leaf Cluster, Bronze Star, Purple Heart, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Army Meritorious Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Air Medal (7th), Combat Infantry Badge, Master Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Special Forces Tab, Joint Chiefs of Staff Identification Badge, and Army Staff Identification Badge.

He is married to the former Alisa Jane Cossey of Bowling Green, Kentucky.

## This Week's Speaker....

The speaker for the day was Transportation Secretary James C. Codell III. The Transportation Cabinet provides connections and mobility which is central to the well-being of our society. The Cabinet is charged with the responsibility of providing easy access to our everyday needs. The warehouses of today are on 18 wheels. Kentucky is ranked 9th in efficient managing of its highway system. Kentucky has 73,000 miles of highway, 27,000 miles of which are state maintained. Unfortunately, fatalities on rural roads are very high due to poor maintenance and the need for widening in part. Kentucky's investment in its highway system is 60% of the national average and the road fund has remained stagnant. Kentucky has the 46th lowest gas tax in the nation. The fuel tax fund has not kept up with current needs and inflation.

Secretary Codell also spoke about the new Transportation Building which is being built on Mero Street.



The speaker for the day was Brigadier General D. Allen Youngman who is the Kentucky Adjutant General. He spoke on how September 11 affected the Kentucky National Guard. We have been at war with this group of terrorists for about twenty years but just did not know it. This is a two-front war. One is the one we see on television. The other front is right here at home. The new watchword is Homeland Security. Consequence management means we deal with this threat at home. In Kentucky, we have been training for a possible disaster with the New Madrid fault. Emergency Management division deals with some of the same human concerns. One area of concern is the Open Records Act as it impacts on national security. Your driver's license is your passport to American society. This is another matter of concern. However, we do not want to go overboard in curtailing civil liberties. The target here is our way of life. Let's not damage it by overreacting. Unfortunately, patience is not an American virtue. The war here at home will need patience. We are all part of this war whether we like it or not.







# Answers to the Question: "Why Join Rotary?"

- Friendship: In an increasingly complex world, Rotary provides one of the most basic human needs: the need for friendship and fellowship. It is one of two reasons why Rotary began in 1905.
- Business Development: The second original reason for Rotary's beginning is business development. Everyone needs to network. Rotary consists of a cross section of every business community. Its members come from all walks of life. Rotarians help each other and collectively help others.
- Personal Growth and Development: Membership in Rotary continues one's growth and education in human relations and personal development.
- Leadership Development: Rotary is an organization of leaders and successful people. Serving in Rotary positions is like a college education. Leadership: learning how to motivate, influence, and lead leaders.
- Citizenship in the Community: Membership in a Rotary club makes one a better community citizen.
   The average Rotary club consists of the most active citizens of any community.
- Continuing Education: Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed about what is going on in the community, nation, and world. Each meeting provides an opportunity to listen to different speakers and a variety of timely topics.
- Fun: Rotary is fun, a lot of fun. Each meeting is fun. The club projects are fun. Social activities are fun. The service is fun.
- Public Speaking Skills: Many individuals who joined Rotary were afraid to speak in public. Rotary develops confidence and skill in public communication and the opportunity to practice and perfect these skills.
- Citizenship in the World: Every Rotarian wears a pin that says "Rotary International." There are few places on the globe that do not have a Rotary club. Every Rotarian is welcome even encouraged to attend any of the 29,000 clubs in 194 nations and geographical regions. This means instant friends in both one's own community and in the world community.
- Assistance when Traveling: Because there are Rotary clubs everywhere, many a Rotarian in need of a doctor, lawyer, hotel, dentist, advice, etc., while traveling has found assistance through Rotary.
- Entertainment: Every Rotary club and district has parties and activities that provide diversion in one's business life. Rotary holds conferences, conventions, assemblies, and institutes that provide entertainment in addition to Rotary information, education, and service.

- The Development of Social Skills: Every week and at various events and functions, Rotary develops one's personality, social skills and people skills. Rotary is for people who like people.
- Family Programs: Rotary provides one of the world's largest youth exchange programs; high school and college clubs for future Rotarians; opportunities for spouse involvement; and a host of activities designed to help family members in growth and the development of family values.
- Vocational Skills: Every Rotarian is expected to take part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation; to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation. Rotary helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher, etc.
- The Development of Ethics: Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test that governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical in business and personal relationships.
- Cultural Awareness: Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color, and ethnic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background. Rotarians become aware of their cultures and learn to love and work with people everywhere. They become better citizens of their countries in the process.
- Prestige: Rotary members are prominent people: leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion, and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world. Its ranks include executives, managers, professionals people who make decisions and influence policy.
- Nice People: Rotarians above all are nice people
   the nicest people on the face of the earth. They are important people who follow the policy of it is nice to be important but it is important to be nice.
- The Absence of an "Official Creed": Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official creed, no secret meeting or rituals. It is an open society of men and women who simply believe in helping others.
- The Opportunity to Serve: Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind. Its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. This is perhaps the best reason for becoming a Rotarian: the chance to do something for somebody else and to sense the self-ful-fillment that comes in the process and return of that satisfaction to one's own life. It is richly rewarding. "He profits most who serves best."


