Derrick Ramsey will be the speaker at the Oct. 10 meeting. Ramsey graduated from the University of Kentucky, earning a degree in General Studies with an emphasis in communications. Derrick was quarterback of the 1976 Peach Bowl and SEC Championship team. In 1977 he was

named United Press International Kentucky's Football Athlete of the Year and in 1993 was named to the all-time greatest team and his jersey was retired.

Upon leaving UK, Derrick played professional football for the Oakland Raiders, New England Patriots and Detroit Lions, and played in Superbowls XV and XX. During professional football's off-season, Derrick attended the University and received a BA degree in 1983. He is a member of the National Football League Retired Players Association.

Presently, he is Athletic Director for Kentucky State University, after having served as the Director of Community Relations for the University of Kentucky. Derrick serves as a board member of YMCA, Big Brothers & Big Sisters and the Living Arts & Science Center and is a member of the "K" Association. He was co-chair in 1996-97 for the Martin Luther King Day celebration. He was hon-

orary co-chair for the United Way in 1996 and in 1997 was elected to the National Alumni Board.

Mr. Ramsey was appointed to the Board of TV and Media by President Charles T. Wethington, Jr. Mr. Ramsey lent support to the American Heart Association, God's Pantry, Cardinal Hill Telethon, National Organization for Victim Assistance, American Cancer Society, American Diabetes Association and is a member of Hill-N-Dale Christian Church. Derrick was the recipient of the Lyman T. Johnson award in 1998. He is the founder of Athletes Helping Youth and was the YMCA Volunteer of the Year in 1999. In the fall of 1999, Mr. Ramsey was inducted into the Kentucky Hall of Fame.

This Week's Speakers...

On October 3, 2001 meeting, Rotary members welcomed three guest speakers: Harry Lee Waterfield II, William D. Pennell, and Arthur L. Moncrief. These three gentlemen gave an interesting and informative overview of the financial condition of Kentucky State University.

Waterfield was named to the KSU Board of Directors in July 2000. A native of Clinton, Kentucky, Waterfield has spent much of his life in Frankfort, where he is President, CEO and Chairman of the Board of Investors Heritage Life Insurance Co., and Kentucky Investors, Inc. He has served on numerous boards and was one of the founders of the National Association of Life Companies. Waterfield is also on the board of Murray State University Foundation and a member of the board of trustees at Lee College in Jackson, Kentucky. In his presentation to Rotary, Waterfield described the financial situation of Kentucky State University when he became a member of the Board. He stated that although the University had difficulties, he was supportive of the institution and would work to rectify the problems that were presented. Waterfield felt that the University was on its way to financial stability.

The next speaker was William D. Pennell, who was born in Evanston, Illinois. He and his wife Anita presently reside in Louisville. A graduate of DePauw University and Washington University, Pennell is a Vietnam veteran and was senior financial officer for several medical products companies. In June 2000 Pennell was named as chief financial officer for KSU. Pennell gave Rotarians some insight to KSU's financial workings. He noted that a number of improvements had been made in the University's financial management. Pennell echoed Harry Lee Waterfield in his support of the institution.

The third speaker of the day was Arthur L. Moncrief, KSU's comptroller. Moncrief comes to KSU from Alabama State University where he was instrumental in helping that institution in improving its financial status. Moncrief served as an auditor for the U.S. General Accounting Office. He is a graduate of Alabama State University, Troy State University and has studied at the University of Kentucky and Penn State. Moncrief resides in Lexington with his wife, Rosetta. Moncrief told Rotarians that the financial

situation of KSU was improving and that better monetary controls were in place to make sure that the institution's finances were under control. Moncrief displayed a delightful sense of humor and was well received by Rotarians. Richard Taylor ended the meeting with a reading of a Robert Frost poem.



Dr. Carl Smith, KSU Music Director, will bring a small number of high-achieving students from KSU's concert choir to perform and speak about where they have traveled with the choir, personal aspects of their KSU experience and/or how being a member of KSU's concert choir has made a difference in their lives.

Dr. Smith is Director of Vocal and Choral Music, and serves as conductor of the University Concert Choir and the Show Choir. During his tenure at Kentucky State University, he established the vocal scholarship program and developed the Concert Choir into a nationally-renowned, award-winning ensemble. Dr. Smith was honored by KSU as its Distinguished Professor of the 1989-1990 academic year. In addition to his teaching duties, Dr. Smith is an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor, and serves on the advisory boards of several community organizations. He is the director of the Capital City Chorale and the Chancel Choir of First Christian Church in Frankfort.

The Kentucky State University Concert choir tours annually throughout the United States. They have been featured on radio and television on numerous occasions, including "A Choral documentary" which was filmed and featured on

German television. The choir has performed with the Louisville, Lexington, and Cincinnati Symphony Orchestras. Several performances have been given in Montreal, Toronto and various provinces in Canada. During its trip to Nassau in the Bahamas three sacred music performances were given.

The choir has presented performances at the Southern Division of the American Choral Directors Association in Atlanta, and for its National Convention in Tennessee, and is a recent winner of the National Spiritual Contest at Music Hall in Cincinnati, Ohio. They have performed on several occasions for the Kentucky Music Educators Regional and National Conventions. The choir participated in the 1992 Inaugural Program of the River Park Performing Arts Center in Owensboro, Kentucky. They are the two time (1997 and 1998) Grand Champions of the annual HBCU Choral Festival "Extravaganza in Black" which was held in Las Vegas, Nevada. They also have competed in the Annual American Negro Spiritual Festival at the Music Hall in Cincinnati. Ohio.

The forty-four voice Concert Choir is composed of undergraduates from all academic areas of Kentucky State University. Membership is open to all KSU students. Those who participate in the traveling choir must maintain creditable academic standards and must show the ability to adjust to a variety of vocal music during the audition. The choir is under the direction of Dr. Carl H. Smith, Distinguished Professor of Music. Several recordings of the choir have been made in recent years. The latest CD recording was taped during its annual performance at the University in November 1996. This recording contains several alumni favorites, and is available following concerts and through the University Department of Music.

talk about aspects of the University related to fund raising.

Ken Miller moved to Frankfort in 1956. With the exception of military service, his college education, and a few years working for the Bell System, he has lived and worked in Frankfort since that time.

He has been with Kentucky State University since 1978. For the past 23 years, his role at Kentucky State has been in the Sponsored Programs, development, and institutional advancement areas.

Mr. Miller has been involved with the submission of more than 1,000 competitive proposals to federal and state government agencies and the private sector, more than 500 of which have been successfully funded in a total amount exceeding

\$58,000,000. Additionally, Mr. Miller's role in development has helped to generate nearly \$5,000,000 in private contributions to the University. Currently, he is heading a \$2.5 Million campaign to raise private contributions in support of Kentucky State's endowment programs.

He has received over the years many national and state awards for his sponsored programs and development work, including being the recipient in 1994 of the first Beth K. Fields Award presented by the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) for outstanding service and leadership in Kentucky higher education.

He is a two-time former President of the Frankfort/Franklin County United Way, a former Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Franklin County Red Cross Chapter (incidentally, he served as Chairman during the 1974 tornado outbreak which devastated parts of Kentucky and several other states), he just retired as a member of the sixperson National Board of Directors of the Grants Resource Center in Washington, DC. His interests range from golf to SCUBA diving to being a prolific reader to novice gardener.





This Week's Speaker: Ken Miller

The speaker for the day was Ken Miller who has been with Kentucky State University since 1978. He stated that KSU has developed a vision to develop a quantum leap that will soon be realized. KSU was conceived in Danville on August 7, 1878 to train African-American teachers. KSU was born in 1886 and graduated its first class as a land grant college in 1890. The first white student was admitted in 1954. President Reid is the 12th president. KSU is a reflection of the struggles of African-Americans

Kentucky were it not for KSU. There are three main areas of accomplishment where KSU has excelled. The first area is in teaching. KSU is the most culturally diverse student body in Kentucky and one of the most in the US. KSU is very good at retaining African-American students and 1000 residents of Franklin County are KSU graduates including some of its most prominent citizens. A second area of accomplishment is the Aquaculture program, which is internationally renowned. A third area is public service. As one example of this, the university faculty and staff donated \$14 million to the United Way. Mr. Miller invited us all to join in the vision of Kentucky State University.



James C. Codell III, Secretary, Kentucky Transportation Cabinet

James C. Codell III was appointed Secretary of Transportation for the Commonwealth of Kentucky by Governor Paul Patton on October 1, 1996. Codell served

the previous eight months as Deputy Secretary. As Secretary, Codell is the chief administrator for the Cabinet's 6,000 employees, overseeing a \$1.4 billion annual budget. Codell is responsible for all areas of transportation including the construction and maintenance of highway facilities, vehicle regulation, as well as all policies and procedures affecting the Cabinet.

Previously serving 24 years as Executive Vice President of Codell Construction Company, Codell directed the operations of the business and represented the company in numerous joint venture projects including the construction of dams, railroads and a segment of the Trans Alaskan Pipeline System. Listed among the "Top 400 Contractors" by Engineering News Record, the company diver-

sified its operations to include construction management.

Mr. Codell is the past President of the Southeastern Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (SASHTO), past President of the Mississippi Valley Conference of State Highway and Transportation Departments (MVC), serves on the Executive Committee of the national association (AASHTO), and serves as the Chairman of the AASHTO Standing Committee on the Environment. He is a member of the Administration of Highway and Transportation Agencies (NCHRP) National Cooperative Highway Research project panel. He is a member of the Executive Committee for the Transportation Research Board (TRB), Mr. Codell is the chairman of the Kentucky Transportation Center Advisory Board and serves on the University of Kentucky College of Engineering Dean's Advisory Council. He also serves on the Capital Planning Advisory Board.

Mr. Codell is a member of First Presbyterian Church in Lexington. He and his wife Jeanne, have two children and four grandchildren.
