

House Speaker Jody Richards, will be the speaker at the Sept. 19 meeting.

Richards began his career as a teacher at Western Kentucky University and first ran for office in 1976 when he won the 20th District seat in the Kentucky House of Representatives, a position he holds to this

day. While still in his first term, Speaker Richards was called upon to chair the House's Education Committee. He later played an instrumental part in engineering Kentucky's sweeping education reforms by chairing one of the committees that helped draft the Kentucky Education Reform Act, and he has shown the same commitment in leadership roles in the Southern Legislative Conference's Education Committee and the Legislative Advisory Council of the Southern Region Education Board.

In 1987, Jody was chosen by his Democratic colleagues in the House to serve as their Majority Caucus Chairman, one of the body's five leadership positions. In that role, he was responsible for informing caucus members about important measures and issues confronting the General Assembly

and dealing with intricate procedural matters, such as the rules by which the House and committees operate. In 1995, Mr. Richards reached the culmination of his nearly two decades of legislative service and leadership by being chosen Speaker of the House.

Jody remains active in the public affairs of Bowling Green and Warren County. The Speaker has held local, state, and national leadership positions with the civic-oriented Jaycees. He has served as President of the Southern Kentucky Fair Board and Bowling Green Girl's Club, has held seats on the boards of directors of the United Way and Warren County Drug Abuse Task Force, and currently is a member of the Bowling Green-Warren County Chamber of Commerce, the Bowling Green Noon Rotary Club, the Advisor Board of Directors of Republic Bank, and numerous other organizations. He also was a member of the US Army Reserves from 1962 to 1968.

He was elected as Chairman of the Southern Legislative Conference in 1999-2000 and serves on the Executive Committee of both the National Conference of State Legislatures and the Southern Legislative Conference, as well as the Governing Board of the Council of State Governments. In addition, Speaker Richards serves on the Southern Regional Education Board and has taken part in the Administrative Office of the Courts Task Force on Family Court. He is the recipient of the William H. Natcher Award for Government Service, and he was awarded the Hero Award for shepherding funding for Children's Advocacy Centers through the 2000 Kentucky General Assembly.

Speaker Richards is the owner of Superior Books, Inc., a wholesale book sales and distribution company in Bowling Green, and is a long-time member of Greenwood Park Church of Christ. He has a son, Roger, a daughter-in-law, Ellen, and a granddaughter, Holly Beth. Jody and His wife, Neva, live in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

#### This Week's Program

President Shockley introduced Joe Russell Johnson who lightheartedly "passed the towel" to Dean Sorg for extraordinary actions on Elkhorn Creek during the Rotary Picnic last weekend. Lee Troutwine followed with a report on the picnic that was held at his farm stating that the "weather was perfect," the "food was great" resulting in a "super picnic." He also thanked Dennis Van Horn for his assistance with the signs leading fellow revelers to his farm.

President Shockley noted that the Club had received a Thank You card from the American Red Cross for our participation in the fundraising "Roast" of Representative "Gippy" Graham. Rotary members sold \$400 worth of tickets to this worthwhile event.

District Governor Elect Bill Miller presented his perspective on the issue of international terrorism, stating that we were dealing with an "invisible enemy" and that we must be "patient, persistent, and then take appropriate action" to effectively combat this deadly threat. In addressing what the nation can do to combat these "low-tech terrorists," he noted security should be improved at airports, nuclear power plants, and large public events, and that this nation should reach out to other countries to form a team approach to this menace. He said 62 countries lost people in the horrific events of last week. He also recommended that organizations dealing with airspace, seas, and postal service work more closely together to limit the terrorists ability to use these avenues to carry out their plans. What can Rotarians do? "Send money to relief efforts, donate blood, be more involved in Rotary projects both here and internationally, and learn more about what is going on overseas," Miller stated. He closed by informing the group that the Frankfort Chapter UNA will have a program with Dr. Bob Pringle, UK's Patterson School of Diplomacy and Intl. Commerce, on Monday, September 24, at 7:30 p.m., at KSU's Alumni House to discuss terrorism. The public is invited.

Mr. Jody Richards, Speaker of the Kentucky House of Representatives and a fellow Rotarian from Bowling Green, provided the Club with an inspiring and knowledgeable discussion of some of the successes of the General Assembly and the challenges confronting them today. He concluded that four constitutional amendments passed by Kentucky citizens have had an extraordinary impact of the state: Creation of the District Courts; Improvement in the role of the General Assembly; Governor Succession; and Annual Sessions. This year, for the first time in 150 years, the General Assembly met in an odd-numbered year. Laws were passed that improved security at schools; established a panel to review tax reform; provided authorization and funding for cleaning up "brownfields" areas of contamination; authorizing the designation of a "certified retirement community"; and a constitutional amendment to clarify the role of the Family Court.

Looking forward to the 2002 Session, Richards said that he is expecting introduced bills to improve the election process; impact telemarketers; provide universal garbage collection; raise teachers salaries; implement tax reform, and deal with an increasingly tight budget. While the state had experienced an 8% growth over the past few years, it was projected to grow at only 5% this year and may well end up closer to 1%.

He was enthusiastic about the progress made by Kentucky on several fronts but cautioned that we needed to focus on four efforts. He will work diligently toward: Cleaning up the state and keeping it clean; developing a business climate that is "the best in the country"; improving our infrastructure, i.e. roads, water, and sewer; and continuing the improvement of our education system "making it the best in America."

He concluded by commenting on the past weeks bombings and stating that "Americans were coming together in a wonderful way" and that "America will be stronger because of the events." Putting the Club's validation on these comments, President Shockley closed the program with Kelli Summers leading the membership in singing America the Beautiful.

Mr. Arthur Moncrief, KSU Comptroller; Mr. William Pennell, KSU Chief Financial Officer; Mr. Harry Lee Waterfield, Vice Chairman, Kentucky State University Board of Regents and Chairman of the Finance Administration, Audit Committee of the KSU Board of Regents.

Each will briefly discuss their work related to KSU's financial recovery



Arthur L. Moncrief joined the "financial turnaround team" at Kentucky State University as its Comptroller in January 2001. As chief financial record keeper, Mr. Moncrief monitors, safeguards, and controls the assets of the University.

In a few short months he has played a key role in setting the University on course to sound financial management and respectability.

He came to KSU from Alabama State University where he orchestrated a similar financial turnaround of that institution. He was chief accountant at Alabama A&M University for ten years after serving as a management consultant for a private Montgomery, Alabama firm and prior to that, senior accountant at Alabama State. Mr. Moncrief also served several years as an auditor with the U. S.

General Accounting Office.

He holds an MBA from Troy State University and a bachelor's degree in accounting from Alabama State University. He completed the College Business Management Institute at the University of Kentucky and the Executive Development Program at Penn State.

Among Mr. Moncrief's professional honors and awards are memberships and offices in state and national business and accounting organizations. He is a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and a U. S. Army veteran of the Vietnam war.

Mr. Moncrief is a high-energy problem solver who has transformed KSU's financial records management. He and his wife, Rosetta, have two children (Artinique and Rashad) and reside in Lexington.


