Joel Schrader will be the speaker at the August 14 Rotary meeting. Joel is owner and designer of Joel Schrader Web Design here in Frankfort, which opened in June 2000. He has created and managed web sites for both commercial and political interests. Examples include, www.frankfort-

grandtheatre.org, www.kentuckybooks.com, and www.belleviewcondo.com.

Joel was Senior Duty Officer at the 24-Hour Operation Center, Central Intelligence Agency Langley, Virginia. He managed an 11-person team responsible for providing all-source information on national security matters to the Director of the Central Intelligence Agency.

He also provided accurate, comprehensive, and timely all-source information on national security matters to Director of the Central Intelligence Agency; filtered and processed timecritical incoming classified information for delivery to senior Agency officials, key Intelligence Community officers and other US Government agencies; managed quick turnaround responses to

field operatives in support of crisis situations such as terrorist attacks, drug interdiction, and foreign military actions; and trained staff officers in 24-hour Watch Office procedures.

Joel was Senior Duty Officer, CIA Representative in the White House Situation Room, National Security Council (NSC) in Washington, DC from January 1998 to March 2000. There he managed a 4-person team responsible for preparing summaries of world events for the President, Vice-President, and National Security Council officials; briefed top White House and NSC officials including National Security Advisor and Vice President on breaking foreign events; coordinated the President's telephone calls to other world leaders and acted as note-taker.

Also at the Central Intelligence Agency in Langley, he was an Analyst on Europe from August 1991 to December 1995. Duties included generating and researching timely articles, reports, and tasking on European leaders and other national security matters; initiating and organizing Intelligence Community conference on Spanish leadership issues. He was awarded an Exceptional Performance Award.

Cris Gorman, former Attorney General of Kentucky, was guest speaker at the August 7 Rotary Club meeting. Gorman is well known in Frankfort. A graduate of the University of Kentucky Law School, he served as the attoneygeneral of the Commonwealth (1992-96). Gorman told Rotarians of his desire to again be a candidate for the office of attorney general. He related his qualifications for the position and noted some of the people who inspired him to seek that office. He spoke fondly of the late Bert Combs,

and how as as a boy he listened to Combs' advice. Gorman also told of his respect for former governor Edward T. Breathitt. Gorman related some sound advice for political hopefuls: Treat everyone with respect. He went on to say that he learned from the elder statesmen of Kentucky how to help as many people as possible, although resources were limited. In closing, Gorman spoke of his upcoming candidacy for attorney general and how he knew that this postion was the one he had trained for throughout his career.



Next Week's Speaker...



As Kentucky's 44th Auditor of Public Accounts, Ed Hatchett has a reputation for independence, for challenging the status quo, and for using state-of-the-art technology to protect taxpayers' money. In fact, Hatchett has been an innovator in public protection: In 1991 he became one of three bank-

ing commissioners in Kentucky history, and the first in thirty years, to be appointed by two governors. In 1992 the John F. Kennedy School at Harvard University honored his introduction of expert system technology in assuring bank soundness; In 1999, he became the first Auditor of Public Accounts in Kentucky history to run unopposed for, and be elected to, a second consecutive term of office.

Hatchett has initiated performance audits that have found over \$313 million in savings and missed opportunities in such areas as tax collection, Medicaid, state investments, school districts, and public universities. He is the first Kentucky Auditor of Public Accounts to review the performance of the state's \$20+ billion in

public retirement plans. In 1998 Hatchett became the first Auditor in the state's history to issue a qualified opinion on the Commonwealth's annual financial statements.

In his audits of government agencies and public education, Auditor Hatchett has centered on sound business practices, and has demanded effective cash, funding, and investment management. He has referred over 155 audits to law enforcement entities, ethics boards, or other regulatory agencies for further investigation or prosecution. By equipping his auditors with the latest computers and software, by subjecting them to rigorous training, by emphasizing teamwork, and by measuring and rewarding performance, Hatchett has improved both efficiency and effectiveness.

A native of Barren County, Ed Hatchett is a graduate of Centre College. He received his law degree from the University of Louisville School of Law. He was a lawyer and trust and investments manager in Glasgow before becoming banking commissioner. He and his wife, Dr. Judith Hatchett, Chair of the Arts and Humanities Program at Midway College, live in Frankfort. They have two daughters in college and a son at home.


