This Week's Speaker...

The program for today was Kathy Woods of D and D Unlimited, which was founded in 1997 to recycle laser jet ink cartridges for charities. 700,000 laser jets are produced each month but only 2% are recycled. Money made from ink jets can be turned over to clubs that are making money for charities. The hope is that laser jet ink cartridge recycling can become mainstream, like the recycling of aluminum. Although the cartridge recycling business is new it is growing. A whole truckload of cartridges can be worth \$320,000. It is a good business opportunity for everyone and our Rotary scholarship fund could possibly benefit from such a project to supplement the golf scramble. 22% of monies collected go to charities like Habitat for Humanity, WHAS Crusade for Children and the University Children's Hospital. President Ron announced that the project would be considered at the next Rotary board meeting.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Sonja Shepherd who spoke about the March of Dimes fundraising efforts. There are 460,000 premature births in this country every year and over 7,000 in Kentucky. It is the main cause of death in the first month and also causes lifetime health problems. In 1938, President Roosevelt founded March of Dimes to combat polio. This effort depended on both volunteers and research. The March of Dimes sponsors the walk for America in April and the Jail and Bail fundraising efforts. Jonas Salk invented the polio vaccine which was a major victory over polio. In 1961, pre-birth screening was developed to detect problems. By 1975, 400,000 babies have been given life-saving treatments. There have been treatments to help babies' lungs develop as well as gene therapy. We need to find out why babies are born too soon and the March of Dimes is funding research to work on this.

Volunteers are greatly needed because they cannot do it alone. Monies are being collected to help here in Frankfort. Unfortunately, premature births are increasing. African Americans babies are twice as likely as whites to have premature babies. Also, many babies that used to die can now survive with better treatments. Thank you Beth Johnson for a timely and very interesting program.

Club Sets All-Time Record Ringing Bells for Salvation Army

Saturday, Dec. 14, was not exactly the most comfortable day of the year, but the bells rang all day at eight different locations across town and Frankfort Rotarians brought home a better Christmas for many of the community's less fortunate.

Capt. Jason Swain of the Frankfort Salvation Army Post brought the news Wednesday to the regular meeting of the Rotary Club that this was an all-time record year. Capt. Swain announced that the day-long efforts yielded more than \$2,000 in cash and an additional \$1,700 in checks. It came to a total of \$3,819.11 for the Saturday efforts.

To this, President Ron Christopher added a \$500 check from the Rotary Club of Frankfort and individual contributions to the Salvation Army pot at the Holiday Inn Wednesday added an estimated \$40, or a total somewhere in excess of \$4,360 — the biggest single year in a long record of Rotary support for the Salvation Army.

Christopher gave credit once again to the sponsorship of two veterans Rotarians, Frank Sower and Asa Tipton. They got the club started in supporting the Salvation Army's Christmas programs, more than two decades ago. Rotarian Joe Rudder was in overall charge of the captains and volunteers who worked all eight bell-ringing locations.

Wrights' first flight inspires Rotary's Rose Parade float

"The Sky's the Limit" is the theme of the
Rotary float entry in the 114th Tournament of
Roses Parade in Pasadena, California, USA, on
New Year's Day. Honoring the centennial of
Orville and Wilbur Wright's first flight in 2003,

He said the 2003 Tournament of Roses Parade theme, Children's Dreams, Wishes and Imagination, "highlights the wonderfulness of children all over the globe and Rotary can make those wishes and dreams a reality as we Sow the Seeds of Love."


