This Week's Speaker


The speaker for the day was Robert Roach, Jr. who is in his fourth year as Headmaster at the Christian Academy. There are 186 students presently enrolled which goes from preschool through grade eight. There will be about 250 students enrolled this fall. The capital campaign is to be completed this May. A regional Christian high school is in the works which should open in the fall of 2003. The motto for the school is "Educating for Eternity." The focus is on Jesus Christ, and the school relies heavily on volunteers. The Board decisions are unanimous and the teachers and Board members believe they have been called by God. The curriculum is taught from a Christian perspective and the focus is on Christian principles. The students have a high level of achievement. There is a sense of community at the school and the culture of the school promotes success. There is a very low teacher-tostudent ratio, with 20:1 being the maximum.



This Week's Speaker

Rotarians were delighted to have Kathleen Lattanzi, principal of Good Shepherd School in Frankfort as today's guest speaker. She is the second guest of the month to inform us on a facet of education in Frankfort/Franklin County.

In her career as an educator, Lattanzi has taught in both private and public schools. She has taught in California, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, New York, and is in her fifth year as principal of Good Shepherd. Lattanzi gave Rotarians a history of Good Shepherd School. She noted that the school had its beginnings in 1870 under the direction of the Sisters of Charity. Many prominent residents of Frankfort received their education at Good Shepherd. The school presently has an academic program for kindergarten through eighth grade. Good Shepherd presently has an enrollment of 340 students. This is the highest number in the institution's history. Although the school is a Catholic institution, one third of the student body comes from non-Catholic backgrounds. Half of the teachers are non-Catholic. Lattanzi stated that Good Shepherd is a fully accredited school with a staff that has some 275 years of combined teaching experience.


Lattanzi is married to Art Lattanzi. The couple has two children.

Jan. 23 Will Feature Stephen Austin, Bluegrass Tomorrow

The Frankfort Rotary program for Wednesday, Jan. 23, will be about Bluegrass Tomorrow, presented by Stephen D. Austin. He will be introduced by Ann Maenza, program chair for January.

Stephen D. Austin is president and CEO of Bluegrass Tomorrow, a private, non-profit regional planning organization for the Lexington metropolitan area. Steve was formerly director of planning for the Georgetown-Scott County Planning Commission, whose tenure included the arrival of Toyota. The community's 1991 Comprehensive Plan received the Highest Honors Award from the Kentucky Chapter of the American Planning Association.

Bluegrass Tomorrow was formed in 1989 by a coalition of business and conservation interests to promote coordinated growth planning for the seven county central Bluegrass Region of Kentucky. The guiding framework for the organization is the Bluegrass Regional vision, developed in 1993 through a broad-based regional planning process. Bluegrass Tomorrow promotes an alternative regional approach to planning that balances the need for growth with the preservation of the unique scenic and natural features that characterize the Bluegrass.

Stephen D. Austin of Bluegrass Tomorrow

Stephen D. Austin is President and CEO of Bluegrass Tomorrow, a private, non-profit regional planning organization for the Lexington Metropolitan area. Steve was formerly Director of Planning for the Georgetown-Scott County Planning Commission, whose tenure included the arrival of Toyota. The community's 1991 Comprehensive Plan received the Highest Honors Award from the Kentucky Chapter of the American Planning Association.

Bluegrass Tomorrow was formed in 1989 by a coalition of business and conservation interests to promote coordinated growth planning for the seven-county central Bluegrass Region of Kentucky. The guiding framework for the organization is the Bluegrass Regional vision, developed in 1993 through a broad-based regional planning process. Bluegrass Tomorrow promotes an alternative regional approach to planning that balances the need for growth with the preservation of the unique scenic and natural features that characterize the Bluegrass.

Steve received a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Kentucky College of Law and also holds a Bachelor of Science degree in landscape architecture from the University of Kentucky, where he received the National Honor Award for Excellence in the study of landscape architecture. His design for the Royal Spring Park in Georgetown won a national Public Practice award from Landscape Architecture Magazine. Steve is also the designer of Yuko-en on the Elkhorn, the Official Kentucky-Japan Friendship Garden, a Japanese garden in Georgetown. Steve is senior Adjunct Faculty with the Department of Landscape Architecture at the university of Kentucky, where he teaches the 5th year regional planning class.

The guest speaker for this week's Rotary Program was Mary Anna Rogers, a 13-year homeschool veteran. Mary Anna is a Frankfort native. She attended Frankfort High School, and is a graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi. She is currently Vice-President of the Kentucky Home Education Association, and past president of the Capital Area Christian Homeschoolers.

Mary Anna presented the club with an overview of the home schooling program and its advantages. She stated that it is not for everyone, and families that participate have to make many sacrifices.
