This Week's Speaker: Lois Combs Weinberg

For his first program for the month of July, Rotary July Program Chair, Ed Dance introduced Lois Combs Weinberg to the Club. Weinberg is the Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress, running against Republican Mitch McConnell in the fall. Weinberg enjoys a long list of accomplishments, including being Knott County's Woman of the Year.

Weinberg's interest in education and government was sparked by the discovery of her son Jed's dyslexia. The lack of resources available for him in eastern Kentucky spurred her on to work with other parents and educators to found dyslexia programs at the Hindman Settlement School and the James Still Learning Center. As the daughter or Governor Bert Combs, she was

already well acquainted with the people and institutions of eastern Kentucky.

Weinberg spoke about the need for accountability in government and in small business. The economic struggles of western Kentucky were of specific concern to Weinberg because as she stated "It's easier to keep the jobs you already have than try to develop new ones."

Her remarks were very interesting to the Club as she faces the coming election. We look forward to the rest of Ed Dance's July programs.

Rev. David L. Hilton

Topic: "Hospice in our Community"

The Reverend David L. Hilton is a chaplain with Hospice of the Bluegrass in the Frankfort office. He took the position in 1998 after retiring from the United Methodist Church, where he was pastor of First United Methodist Church in Frankfort. His early life and education were in Frankfort and Franklin County public schools.

A graduate of Kentucky Wesleyan College and Duke University Divinity School, he was awarded Doctor of Divinity degrees by Lincoln Memorial University and Kentucky Wesleyan. He studied at the Ecumenical Institute in Bossey, Switzerland and has received EPEC (Educating Physicians in End-of-Life Care) training sponsored by the American Medical Association and Journey's End. Kentucky Wesleyan College named him "Outstanding Alumnus of 2001."

Ministry assignments include missionary service in Malaysia and churches in Middlesboro, Danville, Morehead, Lexington and Frankfort. He also served as superintendent at Redbird Missionary Conference and executive director of the United Methodist Kentucky Conference Council on Ministries.

Through the years he has worked closely with the Kentucky Council of Churches, Hospice and numerous community organizations. He frequently presents workshops and addresses local, state and national gatherings on Spirituality and Healing at the End of Life. Current interests include spiritual direction, ministry formation and retreat leadership.

Married to Mary Lois, a retired school librarian, they are parents of two adult children who were born in Malaysia and they have one grandson.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Rev. David L. Hilton, who is the chaplain for the Frankfort Chapter of Hospice. The history of Hospice goes back to England when in 1967 Cicely Saunders, working at St. Elizabeth's hospital, became aware of the needs of patients dying alone and in pain. Hospice of the Bluegrass works in 23 counties at 10 sites. It has won the Circle of Light award and is recognized nationally. Hospice is funded primarily from Medicaid and Medicare, and is provided to any terminally ill person who requests it without regard to ability to pay. Frankfort has six teams consisting of social workers, nurses and chaplains. Often the patient has physical and spiritual pain and unresolved issues that need to be addressed. 80% of the patients are in homes. Rev. Hilton spoke at length about how hospice and hospitality are related. Thank you Rev. Hilton for a most interesting program and to Ed Dance for arranging it.

He is a member of the Society of Attorneys General

Emeritus from 1996 to the present, and a member of the National Association of Attorneys General from 1992-1996. General Gorman is a member of the American Kentucky and Louisville Bar Associations. He obtained his law degree from the University of Kentucky in 1967 and attended the John F. Kennedy School of Government Program for Senior Executives in State and Local Government in 1987.

He is married to the former Vicki Lynn Beekman of Paducah, and they have sons Tyson, age 30, and Jay, age 26.

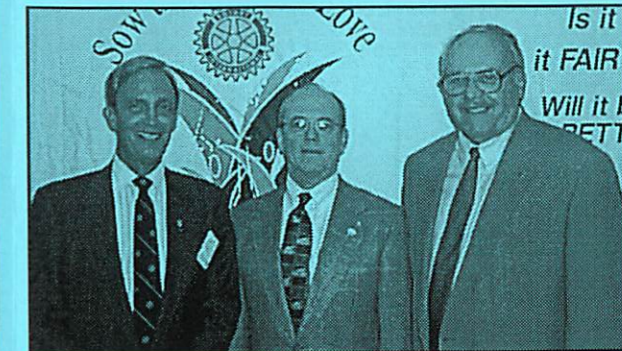
