Jeanne Ontko Suchanek (Saw-haw-neck) has been the Director of Development for the College of Fine Arts at the University of Kentucky since 1998 and has coordinated fundraising efforts totaling over \$5 million so far for the College.

A native of Youngstown, Ohio, she received her Master of Arts in American History from Youngstown State University in 1981. From 1981-1984, she was the Labor History Archivist and the Local Records Specialist for the Ohio Historical Society. She also has worked as a tour guide and education coordinator for the Mahoning Valley Historical Society in Youngstown, the Local History Program at the Ohio Historical Society and was director of the Ohio Museums Association. In 1988, she was hired as the Education Division Manager for the Kentucky Historical Society and was asked to coordinate the fundraising and development efforts for the Kentucky History Center from 1991 - 1998.

She will introduce us to some of the outstand-

ing talent of the College of Fine Arts at the University of Kentucky.

This Week's Speaker...

John Nicholson, Executive Director of the Kentucky Horse Park, spoke to us at our June 5 meeting. John has held this position for about five years, and he has a lengthy history in the horse industry and with our state parks. He is a fellow Rotarian from the Lexington noon club; and perhaps most importantly, is a former fraternity brother of our own Past President Barry Holder, Jr., who introduced our speaker. John traced the

history of the Horse Park from the initial land purchase in 1973 to its present size of over 1200 acres, with a \$134M annual impact on the Commonwealth's economy.

The Horse Park consists of five major areas: The International Museum of the Horse; competitive events (e.g., this weekend's Egyptian Arabian Show); the National Horse Center, which includes 14 state and national organizations; an educational facility (including riding lessons and the "Adopt-a-Horse" Program); and the Campground, which typically accommodates 6,000 to 7,000 people per night. It was an informative talk about one of our area's major attractions.

Artistic Presentation by Don & Sylvia Coffey**

Sylvia plays bass fiddle and psaltery, and sings in the Mink Run Consort, a Frankfort-based acoustic band offering Celtic and American traditional music for performances and folk dances. She teaches folk dancing to youth and community groups, emphasizing context of traditional dances and music in various historical periods, and leads dance classes at Thorn Hill Learning Center. Sylvia is co-founder of Terpsichore's Holiday, a week-long national folk dance event at Jackson's Mill, West Virginia, and was a co-director of Cumberland Camp, Jabez Kentucky, in 1998-2000. She served as a staff musician and dance leader at these camps and previously led children's dance classes at Winter In The Woods and Kentucky Summer Dance School.

Don plays hammered dulcimer, guitar, keyboard and certain other instruments, and sings in the Mink Run Consort. He leads dance classes and a Dance Band class at Thorn Hill Learning Center. Don is co-founder of Terpsichore's Holiday, and in 1998-2000 was a co-director of Cumberland Camp (Jabez, Kentucky). He served

as a staff musician and dance/music leader at these camps, also at Winter In The Woods and Kentucky Summer Dance School for which he was co-founder in 1982 and 1989 respectively. Don has been a director of the Lloyd Shaw Foundation, a national organization dedicated to promoting folk dance in America, and was an original incorporator and co-director of Kentucky Heritage Institute for the Traditional Arts.

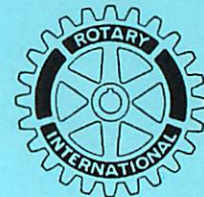

Lt. Dan Shouse, Frankfort Fire Dept.



Dan Shouse is the PIER Office for Frankfort Fire and EMS. This position was created to fulfill multiple responsibilities within Frankfort Fire and EMS. Dan is a 1977 graduate of Franklin County High School. He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Mass Communication from Eastern Kentucky University, graduating with a 3.2 overall GPA in May of 1981. Dan began his career as a firefighter in 1991, serving as a Firefighter EMT for seven years before being promoted to sergeant in 1998. In August 2001, Dan was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and served as station officer at the West Frankfort Fire Station. Lt. Dan, as he is known, is a Kentucky Certified Fire Instructor/Firefighter and EMT. He is married to Tammy, a registered nurse, and they have one son, Nathaniel.

Chief Wallace Possich, Frankfort Fire Dept.
Wallace Possich is the Fire Chief and DES Director of Frankfort Fire and EMS in the Capital

City of Frankfort, Kentucky. His department consists of four stations with 77 personnel who provide fire prevention, suppression, rescue, and ALS. Prior to Frankfort, he served as Chief in South Burlington, Vermont and as State Vice President of the New England Division of International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC).



Chief Possich began his fire service career in 1969 with the Williamsburg, Virginia Fire Department. He later served as a firefighter in Prince William County, Virginia before returning to the Williamsburg area to join the James City County Fire Department. In James City County, he rose through the ranks to the position of District Chief. Chief Possich holds a degree in Fire Administration. He is a member of the Kentucky Association of Fire Chiefs, Virginia State Fire Chiefs Association, and many related organizations.

Chief Possich is also the State Director for the IAFC, representing Kentucky.

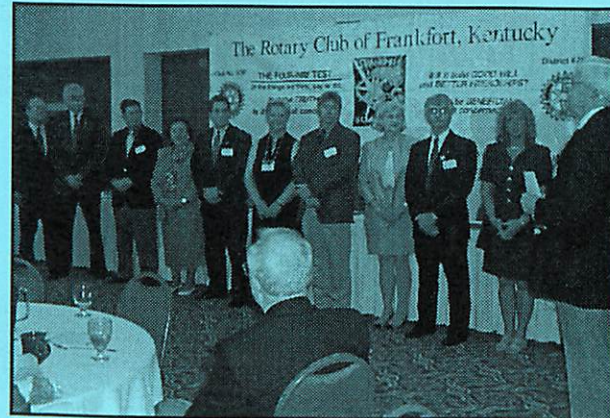

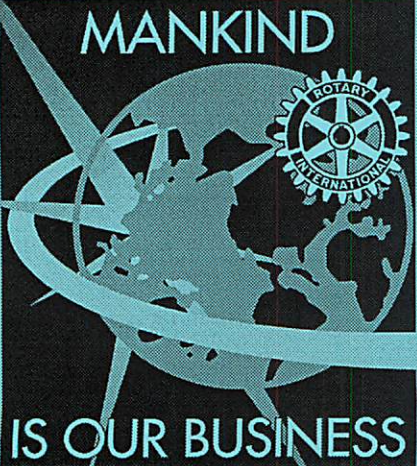

Next Week's Speaker...



Lois Combs Weinberg, who is challenging Sen. Mitch McConnell in this year's U.S. Senate race, will be the speaker at next week's Rotary Club meeting.

Weinberg is the founder of the Hindman Settlement School's Dyslexia Program. She

is the daughter of former Gov. Bert T. Combs, and a native of Eastern Kentucky. She attended Randolph Macon Women's College in Virginia, where she majored in biology and religion. Shortly after marrying husband, Bill Weinberg, Lois returned to Kentucky, settled in Knott County and taught family life at Alice Lloyd College. Her interest in public education was sparked in the late 1970s when she learned her first son was dyslexic.

At that time there were no programs in the public schools to meet her son's educational needs, so she started her own program, which developed into a full-time program at the James Still Learning Center, and has now helped thousands of dyslexic students and their families throughout Eastern Kentucky.

In recognition of her efforts to assist students

with special needs, she has been appointed to several statewide educational initiatives. In 1990, she was elected chairwoman of the prestigious Prichard Committee for Academic Excellence after serving on the Committee since its origin in 1980. Lois was also appointed by the governor to the University of Kentucky's Board of Trustees in 1992, and in 1997, at the governor's request, Lois accepted a seat on the newly created Council on Postsecondary Education. Lois has also been the recipient of several awards including the East Kentucky Leadership Foundation's Private Citizen's Service Award and the Berea College Service Award.

In 1986, Lois was named by the Department of Education as one of the ten state's outstanding school volunteers and was named the "Person of the Year" in Knott County in 1987. The Lexington Women's Center recognized Lois' contributions in 1995. She was presented the Earl Wallace Memorial Award in 1997 and Morehead University's Appalachian Woman of the Year Award in 2000.

She and her husband Bill have three sons Jed, Zachary and Tomas, a daughter-in-law, Tracey, and a granddaughter, Carley. In 1996 Lois attended Harvard University's School of Education, from which she received a M. Ed in 1997. Lois was born on December 18, 1943 in Lexington, Kentucky.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Fire Chief Wallace Possich. He stated that most of the work of the department involves ambulance runs, with 5500 calls a year. The fire trucks make 1000 calls a year. There are four fire stations with a total work force of 81, with six more to be added soon. All employees are cross-trained. Five units are used daily with two as back-ups. Imagery cameras are used to rescue people in a fire. The EMS covers all of Franklin County. There are six fire

stations in the county but no ambulances are in use there so EMS in the county are dispatched in the county in all 911 calls since they will get there before the city. The fire department bills for all ambulance calls, which is about \$1 million a year but only about \$600,000 is received.
