Next Week in Rotary...



Dr. Scott Smith, Dean of the UK College of Agriculture, will speak to the Frankfort Rotary Club at noon on Wednesday, March 13, at the Holiday Inn in Frankfort. Dean Smith will be introduced by the March program chair, Rotarian Rene Siria.

Dr. Smith has served Kentucky agriculture since 1978, first as an agronomy researcher — an expert on nitrogen in soils — then as chairman of the agronomy Department in the College of Agriculture at UK. Most recently Dr. Smith was associate dean for research at the College of Agriculture.

He became dean of the college in January last year. He was a native of central New York state and holds the bachelor's and master's degrees from Cornell University. Smith completed his doctoral work at Michigan State University in 1978.

Dean Smith is responsible for all facets of the College of Agriculture, including Extension, research and teaching. He was a prolific researcher, publishing more than 50 significant journal articles and reviews. Most were related to the impact of agricultural practices on crop productivity, as well as environmental quality and the ecology of nitrogen-transforming bacteria in soils.

Chairman of agronomy at UK 1989-99, he was in charge of a range of activity in research, teaching and programs in the UK Extension Service. He supervised a faculty of 54 members and 200 other staff employees.

Moving up in 1999, Dr. Smith became associate dean of the college for research, giving leadership for developing the research faculty of the College. He has been dean of the college since the start of last year.

This Week's Program...

Governor Paul Patton spoke to the Rotary Club of Frankfort on the upcoming budget for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Patton, who is now in his second term as the state's executive, gave an excellent overview of Kentucky economic conditions. He noted that Kentucky was not in the worst economic condition of the states. However, the Commonwealth will have to look at a lean budget for the immediate future. The state will try to maintain the present standards of service, but will not be adding new programs.

The budget affects many of the programs vital to the function of state government. These services will be maintained, but not expanded. Governor Patton also noted that education would be affected by lack of revenue. Patton informed Rotarians that education made up 66 percent of the state's budget. He praised teachers as the "backbone" of the educational system.

While Kentucky's budgetary concerns are affected by many factors, including the state of the national economy, the government of the Commonwealth will cope with the economic difficulties. Some positions will not be filled, and there will be cuts, but the government will meet these challenges, and maintain as best as possible.

Governor Patton received a standing ovation before and after his speech. He told his audience that he had lived in Frankfort for some ten years and was proud of his association with the community. Several members of state government were also in attendance, including Speaker of the House Jody Richards of Bowling Green, who is also a Rotarian. On a historical note: Governor Patton is the first governor to succeed himself in office since Governor James Garrard in 1800.



This Week's Speaker... Dr. Scott Smith

Today's guest speaker was Dr. Scott Smith, Dean of the UK College of Agriculture. Dr. Smith was introduced by this month's chair, Rene Siria.

As the new dean of UK's College of Agriculture and director of the state's Cooperative Extension Service, Smith said he has encouraged faculty and staff to pursue solutions that will help Kentuckians, both rural and urban. Dr. Smith said he has always made a strong connection between agriculture and education because his dad worked for Extension his whole career. Smith said, "Ironically, I didn't begin my studies with the intention of going into agriculture. But later on when I started seeing how I could apply what I learned in science classes to agriculture, I was hooked."

Dr. Smith earned his master's and doctoral degree in soil science, and credits Cornell University biochemist John Duxbury with instilling in him a sense of joy in his work. He stated "Professor Duxbury taught me that work is most rewarding when it's approached with a sense of fun and wonder, and I have him to thank for much of the later progress I made in my career."

Dr. Smith admits there are great challenges ahead, but is optimistic about the College's role in meeting those challenges. He says that there is a new spirit of innovation and excitement among our state's leaders, and we want to be a vital part of that. He states that his primary goal as dean is to respond to Kentucky farmers in a much faster and reliable way. We thank Dr. Smith for a most informative program, and to Rene Siria for the invitation.





Next Week in Rotary...

Stephen D. Austin is President and CEO of Bluegrass Tomorrow, a private, non-profit regional planning organization for the Lexington Metropolitan area. Steve was formerly Director of Planning for the Georgetown-Scott County Planning Commission, whose tenure included the arrival of Toyota. The community's 1991 Comprehensive Plan received the Highest Honors Award from the Kentucky Chapter of the American Planning Association.

Bluegrass Tomorrow was formed in 1989 by a coalition of business and conservation interests to promote coordinated growth planning for the seven-county central Bluegrass Region of Kentucky. The guiding framework for the organization is the Bluegrass Regional vision, developed in 1993 through a broad-based regional planning process. Bluegrass Tomorrow promotes an alternative regional approach to planning that balances the need for growth with the preservation of the unique scenic and natural features that characterize the Bluegrass.

Steve received a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Kentucky College of Law and also

holds a Bachelor of Science degree in landscape architecture from the University of Kentucky, where he received the National Honor Award for Excellence in the study of landscape architecture. His design for the Royal Spring Park in Georgetown won a national Public Practice award from Landscape Architecture Magazine. Steve is also the designer of Yuko-en on the Elkhorn, the Official Kentucky-Japan Friendship Garden, a Japanese garden in Georgetown. Steve is senior Adjunct Faculty with the Department of Landscape Architecture at the university of Kentucky, where he teaches the 5th year regional planning class.




