Next Week in Rotary...



Ron D. Bryant, who serves as Kentucky History Specialist for the Kentucky Historical Society (KHS), will speak at the May 8 meeting of the Frankfort Rotary Club. Richard Taylor, Program Chair for May, will introduce him. Bryant will speak on the Old Kentucky State Prison, and

also will touch on his research concerning the old Frankfort cemetery at the site of the new Transportation Cabinet building.

In addition to his KHS duties, he also serves on the history faculty of Lexington Community College. Bryant graduated with honors from Western Kentucky University with a B.A. and M.A. in history. He completed his doctoral studies at the University of Kentucky. In 1995 and 2000, Bryant was named to Who's Who Among Teachers in American Colleges and Universities.

During the course of his career, Bryant has served as Dean of Academic Affairs for Bowling Green Junior College, editor of a weekly newspaper, and teacher. He has written extensively on the subject of Kentucky history. He is the author of over 80 articles on state and local history in the *Kentucky Encyclopedia*. Bryant also writes a political history column in the *Kentucky Gazette* newspaper.

Bryant is the author of *Kentucky History, An Annotated Bibliography*, which was published by Greenwood Press in 2000. Currently he is working on a pictorial history of the Civil War in Kentucky, and a volume on the rare books of Kentucky.

Ron Bryant spends much of his spare time giving historical and genealogical lectures. In 1999 he made some 75 speeches on various topics. He also serves as historical consultant for a number of authors from around the world.

Ron's wife Jane owns a consultant business in early Childhood Development and management. They have a West Highland Terrier named Fred.

The speakers for the day were Mike Greer and Jamie Wigglesworth, who spoke about their efforts to save the old Grand Theater Building. They have organized a non-profit corporation which has three aims: To secure the property, renovate the theater at a cost of about \$4 million and create funding to actually run the theater. The theater will have 400 seats and is located on the mall next to a parking garage. It will be a multi-purpose building, and construction is scheduled to begin in about three years. Both public and private sources of funding are being sought. There is a five-member board with about 30 persons representing various arts groups in town on the steering committee. An open house was recently held at which much public support was evidenced. We all extend our best wishes to the group in their efforts to revitalize the Grand Theater.

This Week's Speaker...

The program for today was Dr. Ron Bryant, who is the Kentucky history specialist at the Kentucky History Center. He spoke about the old penitentiary which was established in 1798 and was considered a modern prison at the time. Reform rather than punishment became the objective which, at the time, was a novel idea. It was a noisy and smelly place, and so many prisoners died, the burials were held at night. However, it was also a source of cheap labor for things like nails, shoes and barrels. A man named Richard Taylor constructed the old wall! The prison was across the street from the old Governor's mansion. Severe punishment, including whipping and the removal of a finger, was inflicted upon those who broke prison rules. The prison was greatly over-crowded and unsanitary, and there were cholera outbreaks. In the 1880s a branch prison was built at Eddyville. The 1937 Frankfort flood ended the prison here, although some prisoners drowned in it or were shot by guards trying to escape the floodwaters. The old gates, which were modeled after the Warwick Castle towers, lasted until the 1950s. The cemetery found at the foot of Fort Hill is one of several prison cemeteries which had been forgotten. Governors Greenup and Madison were moved from that cemetery to the Frankfort Cemetery just before the turn of the century. Next Week's Speaker...



F. King Alexander, president of Murray State University, will be the speaker at Frankfort Rotary Club at noon May 22 at the Holiday Inn Frankfort. He will be introduced by Rotarian Richard Taylor, program chair for May.

A native Kentuckian, Dr. Alexander received the Ph.D. degree in higher education administration from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, a master of science in comparative education policy from the University of Oxford, England, and a B.A. in political science from St. Lawrence University in New York.

Since 1997, Dr. Alexander has been responsible for managing the graduate education program in the study of higher education governance, leadership and policy development in the department of educational organization and leadership at University of Illinois.

Ranked in the nation's top 20 in 2000-01 by *U.S. News and World Report*, this program had experienced a 200 percent growth in student enrollment while under Alexander's leadership. It consists of approximately 100 doctoral and mas-

ter's degree-seeking students from the U.S. and abroad. He was a faculty member of UI's Institute of Government and Public Affairs, an interdisciplinary public policy "think-tank" consisting of faculty from three University of Illinois campuses.

Dr. Alexander's career has encompassed positions at two research and one doctoral university, faculty membership in a governmental institute, a fundraising directorship, and management in a 28-branch commercial banking operation. His research in domestic and international higher education policy and practice has appeared in leading professional journals and has been featured within the last 18 months in *The Chronicle of Higher Education, The Economist*, and *The Christian Science Monitor*:

Alexander left the post of administrator and faculty member at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign to take the position at Murray. Prior to coming to Urbana-Champaign, Alexander served as postdoctoral researcher in the office of the provost, and vice chancellor for academic affairs and taught in the department of educational administration at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Earlier, he was director of annual programs at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro where he coordinated the institution's fund raising activities. He has also been a manager at Liberty National Bank in Louisville, Ky.

U. S. Senator Mitch McConnell will be the speaker at the May 29 meeting of the Frankfort Rotary Club. He will be introduced by Rotarian Richard Taylor, program chair for May

Born on February 20, 1942, and raised in South Louisville, McConnell's leadership ability

was recognized early on as student body president in high school; College of Arts and Sciences student body president at the University of Louisville (where he received a B.A. with honors); and at the University of Kentucky's College of Law where he was elected president of the Student Bar Association. McConnell's political ascension continued as an intern with Senator John Sherman Cooper, chief legislative assistant to Senator Marlow Cook, and deputy assistant attorney general under President Gerald R. Ford. Before being elected to the United States Senate, McConnell served as County Judge-Executive in Jefferson County, Kentucky from 1978 to 1984.

His landslide victory on Nov. 5, 1996 made

McConnell the only Republican in Kentucky history to be elected to three full terms in the United States Senate.

Named by several national publications, including Congressional Quarterly and George magazine, as one of Washington's most powerful people, McConnell currently serves as Ranking Member of the Senate Rules Committee, which has jurisdiction over federal election law and the administration of the Senate.

McConnell also serves as Ranking Member of the Foreign Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, a key foreign policy committee, and a senior member of the Agriculture and Appropriations Committees, and a member of the Judiciary Committee. Serving on these committees has allowed McConnell to become involved in a broad array of issues critical to Kentucky and the nation. Consequently, McConnell is a familiar face on network and cable television public affairs programs. He is also a frequent contributor of opinion pieces to national newspapers, including The New York Times, The Washington Post and The Wall Street Journal.

Senator McConnell is married to Secretary of Labor Elaine L. Chao. Previously, Secretary Chao served as president of the United Way of America and director of the Peace Corps. He is the father of three daughters: Elly, Claire, and Porter.

This institution is the best in terms of affordability, value, and quality. It has a great graduation rate, and the best in the state in terms of alumni satisfaction. M.S.U. has seen a 24.5% growth in enrollment since 1994. 97% of the teachers passed the certification test, which tied U.K. The problem is that students go to other states during their productive years and return only to retire to the region. It is economic suicide today for a young person not to go to or finish college. We need to keep the students in Kentucky by keeping the costs such as tuition low. The importance of Murray State to the region cannot be overstated. There are ghost towns all over Western Kentucky. The university must provide an equitable investment to all students. Kentucky must not falter and decline.



McConnell is considered to be one of the most influential members of the Senate. He also has the distinction of being the only Republican in Kentucky history to be elected to three full terms in the United States Senate. In 1996 he won a landslide victory for reelection. He is now the senior senator from Kentucky. In an informative

and enjoyable speech McConnell explained how the Bush administration is dealing with terrorist activities. He also talked about his role as the director of the inauguration of President Bush.
