Next Week's Speaker...

Cleaster Whitehurst-Mims is an author and political activist who has dedicated her life to her family and public service for more than 40 years.

Cleaster founded the Marva Collins School in 1990, named after the Chicago educator who opened a classroom in her Chicago home in 1975 after the public school system failed her. The school started in the basement of a Silverton church with 43 students. In 1993, it moved to the former Cincinnati Hebrew Day School in Roselawn with an enrollment of 120 students. Today, the school has more than 200 students in grade pre-K through 8. Students are housed in two locations, Roselawn and Silverton.

Born on a peanut farm in Enterprise, Ala., Cleaster grew up in a strong, close-knit family and rural community. Her intellectually and morally simulating school and caring country church influenced her positive attitude and strong work ethic. After working as a secretary, Cleaster enrolled at Xavier University while raising her preschool-aged son, Kenneth Mims, now a medical doctor. With the longstanding support of her husband, Julius, she graduated cum laude with a degree in English and communication.

Cleaster taught in the Cincinnati Public

Schools system from 1970 - 1991. In 1991, she retired to accept the primary administrative position with the Marva Collins Preparatory School, a scion of Westside Preparatory School of Chicago. She also held the position of adjunct professor with Xavier University from 1976 until 1991. Upon retirement from CPS, she became a full-time professor.

Things You Should Know about Rotary

The Regional Certification Commission for Poliomyelitis Eradication has announced that 51 nations in the World Health Organization's European region have been certified as poliofree. This includes a population of 860 million people.

Rotary International reports that this means Europe has not recorded a single case of indigenous polio in three consecutive years. There had been "imported" cases of polio in Bulgaria and Georgia that were contracted in India.

This means that Europe is now the third world region to be declared free of polio. The Americas were declared free in 1994 and the Western Pacific region in 2000. The Rotary Foundation has embarked upon a one-year campaign which seeks to raise \$85 million to achieve the worldwide eradication of polio by 2005.

Since 1985 Rotary worldwide has contributed more than \$18 million to the eradication of polio in Europe and a total of \$493 million worldwide.



Next Week's Speaker... Colonel Ronald D. Ray, USMCR (Ret.)

Colonel Ray is a practicing attorney in Kentucky and a highly decorated combat veteran of the Vietnam War (two Silver Stars, a Bronze Star and a Purple Heart.) He served as a Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense during the Reagan Administration and was appointed by President Bush to serve on the American Battle Monuments Commission (1990-94), and on the 1992 Presidential Commission on the Assignment of Women in the Armed Forces. From 1990 through 1994, he served as Military Historian and Deputy Director of Field Operations for the U.S. Marine Corps Historical Center in Washington, DC.

Colonel Ray, selected for Who's Who in America and in America Law, writes and speaks on a wide range of national security, historical, and constitutional issues and has appeared on a variety of national television news broadcasts: ABC World News Tonight, Larry King Live, Hannity and Combs, Fox and Friends, The Today Show, Fox News, Crossfire, and a number of national radio broadcasts.





The speaker for the day was Colonel Ron Ray. He spoke on the History Restoration Project and how we Americans have lost our sense of history. A recent court case in California said that the Pledge of Allegiance is unconstitutional because in 1954 the words "under God" were added. However, the documents upon which this country was founded are filled with references to God and prayer. We are ignorant of history and the constitution. How does this happen, when we are throwing so much money into education? He cited quotes from various American leaders such as George Washington and Thomas Jefferson to Richard Nixon. The principles of Christianity are inherent in our founding principles and if we do not have the capacity for self-government we will be ruled by tyrants. What we teach in the classrooms today will be the government of tomorrow. We cannot separate the role of Christianity in the founding of this country. Kentucky leads the way in this nation in (1) outlawing the censorship of history; (2) emphasis on the founding documents; (3) public awareness of true history vs. social studies substitutes. 


