Next Week's Speaker...



David B. Dick was born in Cincinnati, Ohio on February 18, 1930. At the age of 18 months, he and his mother returned to live in her native Bourbon County, Kentucky. After graduating from North Middletown High School in 1948. Dick attended the

University of Kentucky, where he received a B.A. (1951) and an M.A. (1956) in English Literature.

His wife Eulalie ("Lalie") Cumbo, a descendant of Kentuckians, was born in New Orleans and grew up in Woodville, Mississippi. They married in 1978. David later left CBS News, Lalie left Revlon International and together they returned to Kentucky, where they founded Plum Lick Publishing in 1992.

Their most recent book, Rivers of Kentucky, was nominated for 2002 Non-Fiction Book of the Year by the Southeast Booksellers Association. David and Lalie's other works include The View from Plum Lick, Peace at the Center, A Conversation with Peter P. Pence, The Quiet Kentuckians, and Home Sweet Kentucky, all of

which are rooted in the authors' love for Kentucky and Kentuckians. David's critically acclaimed historical novel, *The Scourges of Heaven*, was published in 1998.

Lalie writes a column, "Kentucky Women," for the Farm Bureau's statewide newspaper, *All Around Kentucky*. David is a columnist for *Kentucky Living* and *Appalachian Life* magazines. He is a featured speaker for the Kentucky Humanities Council.

Dick worked as a writer for WHAS Radio and Television in Louisville from 1959-66 and became an on-air journalist. In 1966 he was hired by CBS News with his first assignment in Washington, DC (1966-1970). For the next seven years he was based at the CBS bureau in Atlanta, spent a year as Latin American Bureau Chief in Caracas, and worked out of Dallas in the Southwest Bureau until 1985. Dick covered three presidential campaigns by Governor George Wallace and received an Emmy in 1972 for his coverage of Wallace's attempted assassination. During his career with CBS, Dick covered wars in El Salvador, Nicaragua, and Beirut, and Argentina's invasion of the Falkland Islands.

A graduate of the University of Kentucky, David was inducted into the U.K. Hall of Distinguished Alumni and the Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame. He holds honorary doctorates from Cumberland College and Eastern Kentucky University.

David and Lalie live with their daughter, Ravy Bradford Dick, beside Plum Lick Creek in eastern Bourbon County on land purchased in 1799 by David's great-great-great grandfather Joshua.



Next Week's Speaker... Ashraf Fahmy, Islamic Society of Central Kentucky

I started looking seriously to my religion about ten years ago, and have been active for my community, first in Louisville for about that long. We have elections every two years to chose the committee members for the I.S.C.K (Islamic Society of Central Kentucky). This is the second time for me that I have been elected, three years now, as a committee member. I'm also a management committee member for our Islamic Center of Lexington, KY.

I had the chance to talk before many churches, and get to receive guests who visit our Islamic Center here in town and talk with them about Islam. One time we even had a guest who wanted to tell us about his religion and he was welcomed too.

Many times we had some reporters from our TV channels here in Lexington, I had the chance to talk to them. About four years ago, my wife and I were able to save enough money to go on a pilgrimage trip and visit many of the Holy sites in Saudi Arabia. We had the chance to see people from all around the world. They did not speak the same language, yet we were all the same when

the ritual started.

About three million people go to Makkah each year from every corner of the globe, providing a unique opportunity for those of different nations to meet one another. Pilgrims wear special clothes: for men it is simple white garments that strip away distinctions of class, color, national origin and culture, so that all stand equal before God, no royalty, just loyalty to the one God and His command. Such a trip is never forgotten by Muslim's mind and is often thought of as a preview of the Day of Judgment. All are the same before The One Judge.

I have been able to arrange with one of my young friends at the Mosque to attend with me, his name is Brandon W. Richardson, and he had accepted Islam a few years ago.

This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Tony Sholar, who

is Senior Vice President for Public Affairs for the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce and directs and coordinates the development of the Chamber's policy position on public issues at the state level. He referred to the Three 'P's, which are policy, politics, and process. Our government involves inherent conflicts and democracy is about partisan politics. There are conflicts between the branches of government and between the House and Senate. There are inherent conflicts between urban and rural areas as to how we allocate our resources. The state Constitution prohibits a deficit budget and in 1995 the Governor was committed to a structurally balanced budget. The budget is the most powerful tool that rewards and sanctions members of the General Assembly. Almost every state today has budget deficits. Kentucky has budgeted more than \$700 million than revenue coming in and we have ended up with a structurally imbalanced budget. The question is whether we raise revenues or cut services? Whether we have a special session depends on the leadership agreeing on a combination of raising revenues or cuts. There are two constitutional amendments on the ballot in November. One is the amendment on Family Court and the other deals with corporate restructuring. Thank you Bob Johnston for interesting September programs along with Ray Holbrook who assisted.


