Rochelle Arms is one of the 70 recipients selected worldwide for Rotary International's new World Peace Scholarship (Centers for International Peace and Conflict Resolution). Out of the seven Rotary Centers for International Studies, her chosen place of study is Buenos Aires, Argentina, where she will spend the next two years obtaining a Masters degree in Peace and Conflict Resolution. Miss Arms was born and raised in Panama till the age of nine, and is very eager to reconnect with her Latin American roots. She hopes to combine her work experience as a mediator and restorative justice practitioner in some area of research or service for indigenous communities of South America.

Miss Arms has served as Program Coordinator for the past two years at Transformation House, a community organization in Lexington, KY specializing in restorative justice, an alternative approach to crime. She is a graduate of Swarthmore College in Pennsylvania where she

received her B.A. in Religion and Peace and Conflict Studies.

In college, Miss Arms was professionally trained as a mediator and was instrumental in launching the Swarthmore Mediation Program. Her interest in restorative justice began in a service learning project for a senior seminar in which she served on a think tank committee for the Pennsylvania Prison Project in Philadelphia. An internship with Human Rights Watch in New York also spurred this interest, working under the Associate Counsel for prison investigations.

Miss Arms' volunteer activities have included: co-leading teams to serve homeless individuals in Philadelphia, tutoring and teaching leadership skills to children in a poor suburb of Philadelphia, teaching English as a Second Language to migrant farm workers in Lexington, and teaching beginning Spanish to adults.

Among other interests, Rochelle enjoys dancing (flamenco, Latin, contra, and tango), classical guitar, writing, and traveling. Thus far, she has been fortunate enough to visit Venezuela, Turkey, Italy, France, India, Switzerland, Germany, Costa Rica, and the Netherlands. During her junior year in Swarthmore, she spent four months studying in French universities in Paris.

## This Week's Speaker...

The speaker for the day was Rochelle Arms who will be studying for two years in Argentina in a program sponsored by the Rotary Center for International Development. She is originally from Panama and has studied in Paris, Turkey and India. At the academy in which she will be studying in Buenos Aires, she is a peace scholar and will be focusing on peace studies. She gave a bit of a history of the scholarship which is send-

ing her to Argentina and stated that in 1999, Rotary decided to partner with universities around the world to focus on peace issues. She contacted the Lexington Rotary Club when she first heard about the scholarship. Rochelle then talked about the bridging of cultures and about leaders in the field of conflict resolution coming out of this program.

She has been working at a media center concerned with restorative justice to get offenders to take responsibility for their crimes. She has learned about internal and external conflict with others in the criminal justice system. While in Argentina, she hopes to become involved in studies about indigenous peoples. Thank you Bill Miller from bringing us this very interesting program as part of World Understanding month.

**Dr. William Turner, Interim President of Kentucky State University**



Dr. William H. Turner will speak to the Frankfort Rotary Club Wednesday, March 5. He will be introduced by March program chair Mark Hampton Dr. Turner, a former Kentucky State University Dean, has returned to Frankfort to lead the institution during the next year. Dr. Turner has a significant amount of experience in academia, and as a private consultant. The Lynch, Ky. native was selected from four finalists who were interviewed by the KSU Board.

Turner is a 1964 graduate of Lynch High School and a 1966 graduate of UK's Southeast Community College. He received a BS in Sociology from the University of Kentucky in 1968 and a masters from the University of Notre Dame in 1971.

Turner went on to earn a Ph.D. from Notre Dame in sociology and anthropology in 1974, before being awarded postdoctoral fellowships at

the University of Pennsylvania, George Washington University and Duke University.

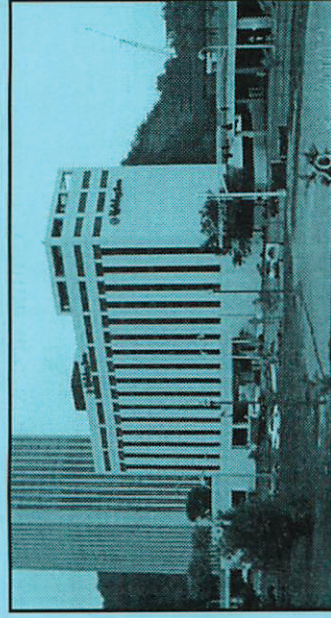
From 1970 to 1995, Dr. Turner was engaged in teaching, research and administration at Fisk University, Howard University, the University of Kentucky, Kentucky State University, Winston-Salem State University, Berea College and Brandeis University.

He is currently President of Turner & Associates Consultants, whose clients include the Appalachian Regional Commission, The Salvation Army, the Kellogg Foundation, Lowe's Company, Sara Lee Corporation, the US Dept. of State, and the Kenneth Kaunda Children of Africa Foundation.

Turner's consulting firm specialized in multicultural consultation, research, conflict resolution and strategic planning for major international corporations and foundations.

Dr. Turner is a prolific writer, having published essays and articles on subjects ranging from Civil Rights issues to the attitudes of college students. Of particular interest to him are the study of African Americans in Appalachia and the desegregation of Historically Black Colleges and Universities.

Dr. Turner was named Student Speaker of the Year at the University of Kentucky in 1968. He has earned "Favorite Teacher" honors at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Winston Salem State University and Berea College, and

has been honored by numerous organizations for his leadership and public service.
